What is a wetland?

A wetland is any area that has very shallow water or soggy, wet ground for part of the year and has plants that like to have their roots wet.

> Nearly 30% of Delaware is covered in wetlands!

Over 100 species of migrating birds stop for a rest in Delaware's wetlands!

Delaware has 49 rare species of plants and animals that need wetlands to survive!
