### Comments:

Under this proposal, Croda anticipates releasing another 0.52 tons per year of hazardous air pollutants. Under a Trump administration relaxation of hazardous air pollutant policy, the Croda facility could also release another 22.12 ton of hazardous air pollutants per year, if it reclassified as an area source, according to a recent scientific paper. Croda should state whether it intends to reclassify and what it anticipates its increase in hazardous air pollution to be in the coming years. Croda should commit to reducing, not increasing the hazardous air pollutant burden it places on nearby communities, as these are a category of air pollutants linked to cancer and other serious health outcomes. Additionally, since Croda conducts limited air monitoring, it should support EJ groups seeking to implement a Community Air Monitoring Network that is community-led, provides data in real time via internet and assists nearby communities to reduce air pollutants and improve health outcomes.
