Subject: Hearing on Mount

Regarding the Mountaire hearing on Thursday, May 21, I was surprised that no questions were accepted. The meeting could have been sent out on an e-mail and saved time I think several important factors are missing in dealing with wastewater.

- 1. Not monitoring each truckload being added to the aquifer by spraying is a problem.
- 2. Not monitoring the air quality at the spray site is a potential problem.
- 3. Not checking for nitrosamines which are cancer-causing chemicals is MOST IMPORTANT TO CITIZENS.
- 4. Heavy metals are not routinely checked.
- 5. There was no environmental impact study for the long term effects on the aquifer, to my knowledge.
- 6. Waste haulers are notorious for adding unwanted chemicals into waste for disposal.
- 7. The Nitrogen level of the output was decreased but the volume of the output was increased.
- 8. If this industrial waste is as safe as you say, why not send it to a hazardous waste facility for disposal? (WIII they not accept it?)
- 9. The fecal-coliform level was discussed but not its long term effect. Coliform found in drinking water from wells (where most of Delaware gets their water supply), may create another FLINT MICHIGAN-type story

These are just some of the concerns that will come up in the future.
