WHEREAS, pursuant to the provisions of 7 <u>Del. C.</u> §6604, the Secretary of the Department of Natural Resources and Environmental Control finds that it is not contrary to the public interest if this project is approved subject to the terms and conditions herein set forth.

NOW THEREFORE, this Permit is issued subject to the attached Wetland Permit General Conditions and the following special conditions:

SPECIAL CONDITIONS

- 1. The activities authorized herein shall be for the explicit purpose of accessing a docking facility and conducting wetland restoration. Any other use without prior Department approval shall constitute reason for this Permit being revoked.
- 2. This approval is in accordance with the plans and application submitted to the Department of Natural Resources and Environmental Control, a copy of which is attached hereto and made a part hereof.
- 3. The Permittee shall conduct wetland restoration within the degraded wetland path previously accessed by ATV. Restoration shall occur over a phased approach. The existing ATV path shall be abandoned, and existing ruts shall be regraded to elevations that support wetland vegetation. Due to the seedbank available onsite, the existing marsh vegetation would be expected to naturally revegetate in the impacted areas. The Permittee shall monitor the site for two growing seasons to document revegetation. If natural re-colonization does not result in 85% coverage, then wetland seedlings are required to be planted to expedite revegetation.
- 4. The Permittee shall schedule and attend a meeting with this office at the end of the monitoring period. The Wetlands and Waterways Section will review the site to determine if it meets the requirements of the restoration project.
- 5. The wetland walkway shall be constructed and aligned in accordance with the approved plans in order to not exceed 150 linear feet. The location shall be sited 26 feet from the post in the steps and end 71 feet west of the first-raised western piling associated with the existing pier.
- 6. All walkway decking boards shall be spaced a width of at least 1/2 of an inch to provide adequate sunlight penetration to the wetlands vegetation beneath.
- 7. The walkway pilings shall be spaced a minimum of 8 feet apart in order to minimize pile driving in the wetlands.
- 8. The walkway pilings shall not be installed by jetting the pilings into the wetlands.
- 9. There shall be no movement of equipment within State-regulated wetlands not specifically authorized by this Permit. Any equipment traversing wetlands as may be authorized by this Permit shall be supported on mats. Any such areas disturbed shall be returned to preconstruction conditions/elevations and appropriately stabilized.
- 10. Disturbance of wetlands and/or aquatic vegetation adjacent to the permitted structure by burning, cutting, herbicide treatments, heavy equipment or other methods is prohibited with

- the exception of controlling Common Reed (Phragmites australis). Disturbance of shallow water habitat or terrestrial habitat in the path of the construction shall be minimized.
- 11. All wetlands disturbed during construction activities, except for those intended to be permanently altered, shall be restored to pre-disturbance conditions to include bank elevations and slopes, waterway and wetland surface elevations and contours, and wetland vegetation and densities.
- 12. The work authorized by this Permit is subject to the terms and conditions of the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers CENAP-OP-R-SPGP-20 and Nationwide Permit no. 27.


