As a Delaware resident, physician, and environmental activist, I've spent some time learning about the pros and cons of the proposed plant in Seaford. I know we have a water pollution problem, significantly contributed to by run-off from poultry (and agriculture) businesses which have been a bedrock of our economy.

I just have not been convinced that the proposed plant will solve our water purity problems. I now believe it will contribute to other important environmental and social problems.

Why do we think that having multiple diesel truck loads of poultry waste from Virginia and Maryland travel through a low-income, under-represented community, will not harm the air quality and the health of that community, and is not an environmental justice catastrophe?
