I would prefer more development towards improving the reliability and ease of access for ALL before implementing this mandate. Some major concerns that must be addressed

1-What will happen to the fuel tax? How will that revenue be replaced?

2-How will property renters charge their vehicles? Will you also mandate landlords install charging stations

3-The number of charging stations, availability and locations are not adequate to accommodate this mandate

4-There is not enough domestic raw materials available to build these vehicles.

5-The current distance the zero emission automobiles can travel on a charge is okay for commuting, but not long distance. How will this be addressed

There is much work to be done before mandating zero emission. Please DO NOT implement Governor Carneys California standards.
