I am opposed to the mandate for the following reasons: 1. The State government has not provided a comprehensive analysis of the many issues that are or will be presented if the mandate goes forward in its current form. I am also not confident that the information that has been provided is credible and without significant bias concerning the benefits and problems that are to be expected and those that are unknown. 2. The aggressive timing of the mandate's rollout will undoubtedly demonstrate that both the public and private sector are not prepared for such a drastic and far-reaching change that will affect most people. 3. In my opinion there has not been enough exploration of alternative means to reduce carbon emissions that could potentially have even greater impact when compared to the elimination gas powered vehicles. 4.
