Comments:

My comments are set forth in the attached letter to Amy Mann, Engineer Program Manager, dated, October 24, 2023. Additionally, without a study or investigation being conducted to determine the current health status of the local community after the impact of novel coronaviruses, and their mutated strains, upon the community may be gravely irresponsible and unprofessional. DNREC set the maximum emissions standard for the volatile organic compounds (VOC), e.g., D8 and D9, emitted by Noramco before the novel coronaviruses weakened the health of the community and revealed the underlying health issues within the community. DE Governor John Charles Carney Jr. promulgated countless community health reports notifying every one of the changes in the health of the community with recommendations on how to approach the community. To allow Noramco to continue emitting these VOC within the community without an investigation or study being conducted is tantamount to launching a project without considering all the evidence. DNREC Secretary Shawn M. Garvin is a member of Governor John Carney's Executive cabinet and to continue releasing these VOCs into the public without the investigation may be considered circumventing the reports and recommendations of the Governor.
