We are here this evening to provide a virtual platform for the State of Delaware's Department of Natural Resources & Environmental Control to conduct its virtual public hearing on the proposed revisions to Delaware's performance standard certification for the "Moderate Non-Attainment Plan for New Castle County, for the 2015 8-Hour Ozone National Ambient Air Quality Standard - State Implementation Plan." Docket Number 2023-R-A-0017.

Lastly, the ultimate decision regarding this matter is made by DNREC's Secretary Garvin. Ms. Pangman, you may begin.

MS. PANGMAN: Good evening. My name is Kelsey Pangman and I am an environmental scientist with the Airshed Planning & Inventory Group for the Division of Air Quality in the Delaware Department of Natural Resources & Environmental Control.

The purpose of this hearing is to take public comments on Delaware's performance standard certification for the Moderate Non-Attainment Plan for New Castle County for the 2015 8-Hour Ozone National Ambient Air Quality Standard.

Delaware's state implementation plan identifies how Delaware will attain and maintain air quality as defined in Title 40 of the Code of Federal Regulation as part 52, subpart I.

The Environmental Protection Agency promulgated a revised national ambient air quality standard for ground level ozone in 2015 of 70 parts per billion. New Castle County was designated as non-attainment for this new standard.

Kent and Sussex Counties were designated as attainment for this new standard.

Ground level ozone, one of the principle components of smog, is a serious air pollutant that harms human health and the environment. High levels of ozone can damage the respiratory system and cause breathing problems, throat irritation, coughing, chest pain, and greater susceptibility to respiratory infection.

On June 4, 2018, the Environmental Protection Agency designated 51 areas of the country as non-attainment under the 2015 8-Hour Ozone National Ambient Air Quality Standard.

Among those non-attainment areas is the Philadelphia, Wilmington, Atlantic City non-attainment area consisting of Pennsylvania, New Jersey, Maryland, and Delaware. Also known as the Philadelphia non-attainment area, including New Castle County in Delaware.

This proposed revision to Delaware's state implementation plan includes Delaware performance standard certification for the New Castle County inspection and maintenance program.

The performance standard certification was developed for the Delaware's current inspection and maintenance program. The performance standards established the level of emission reductions that

1 mandatory inspection and maintenance programs must 2 meet or exceed.

The performance standard certification is Delaware's demonstration that the vehicle inspection and maintenance program for New Castle County meets the basic performance standard for the moderate non-attainment area.

An inspection and maintenance program helps reduce emissions of volatile organic compounds, carbon monoxide, and nitrogen oxides through identifying high-emitting vehicles.

The performance standards certification analysis uses the latest version of the Environmental Protection Agency's motor vehicle emissions simulator, version 3.1.0.

The analysis compares Delaware's inspection and maintenance program to the Environmental Protection Agency's inspection and maintenance standard. Two scenarios were modeled.

The first scenario, also known as the statewide plan, was representative of New Castle's inspection and maintenance program for the attainment year 2023.

The second scenario was the performance

standard benchmark also known as the basic performance standard, which represents the Environmental Protection Agency's defined basic inspection and maintenance program.

An inspection and maintenance program has met the performance standard if the grams per mile emission rate for volatile organic compounds and nitrogen oxides are equal to or less than the emission rate calculated for the relevant performance standard.

New Castle County adheres to the basic inspection and maintenance program and is not allowed exceedances of the standard.

New Castle County has an emission rate that is lower than the basic performance standard for volatile organic compounds and nitrogen oxides, resulting in Delaware's current inspection and maintenance program, achieving the performance standard.

In today's hearing, the Department is proposing additional non-substantive amendments to the performance standards certification document. In response to the Environmental Protection Agency's prehearing review, including typos and grammatical errors, removal of most references and background

regarding Sussex and Kent Counties as they are not part of the Philadelphia non-attainment area, and miscellaneous clarifications.
