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## PROCEEDINGS

HEARING OFFICER: Good evening. Thank

you for taking the time to join us tonight. The time

is now 6:00 p.m. on Tuesday, November 28, 2023.

For ADA compliance, tonight's formal

For ADA compliance, tonight's formal proceeding offers closed captioning in a variation of languages. Before I begin my introductory remarks, I will hand it over to Tanesha Perry to go over the closed captioning features, which will enable you to view multiple languages on the Zoom platform.

Tanesha, you may begin.

MS. PERRY: Hello. My name is Tanesha
Perry. I am the administrative specialist with Office
of the Secretary. I'm here to assist the hearing
officer tonight. I'd like to make sure that everyone
is aware that the Zoom platform we're using has the
ability for closed captioning in multiple languages.

To start closed captioning, if you're using a computer, at the bottom of your screen, you should see "show captions" button. If you do not see the "show captions" button, you may have to select the three dots that say "more."

Once you find the "show captions" button, you should click the carrot pointing up which

1 will bring up your translation options. You can select your preferred language from there.

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If your preferred language isn't listed, you can select "more" and all of the languages will be listed.

If you're on a smartphone, at the bottom of your screen, select the "captions" button indicated by CC. If your preferred language is not listed at the bottom, you may have to select the three dots that say "more."

You should then select "meeting settings" with the gear icon next to it. Once the settings page comes up, located at the very bottom, select "translation language." From there, you'll be able to select your preferred language, then select "done" at the top right corner, and then "done" again.

If the captions are not automatically popped up yet, you may need to select "captions" again and select "show captions."

Now I'll turn it back over to the hearing officer, Theresa Smith.

24 Perry just said, and Secretary Garvin has appointed me to serve as the hearing officer for tonight's formal proceeding.

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We are here this evening to provide a virtual platform for the State of Delaware's Department of Natural Resources & Environmental Control to conduct a virtual public hearing on Docket Number 2023-R-A-0016, the proposed revisions to "Moderate Non-Attainment Plan for New Castle County, for the 2015 8-Hour Ozone National Ambient Air Quality Standard - State Implementation Plan."

The purpose of the hearing is to build a record in regard to the hearing by providing a formal legal platform for the public to learn about the proposed revisions and to enable the public to offer live comment.

Immediately following the adjournment of the hearing, we will conduct the same hearing platform for the proposed revisions to Delaware's performance standard certification for the Moderate Non-Attainment Plan for New Castle County, for the 2015 8-Hour Ozone National Ambient Air Quality Standard, Docket Number 2023-R-A-0017. Much of which will be said now will be said again, so please bear with me as you will hear the same introductory remarks

twice this evening.

First and foremost, this hearing is being conducted virtually. No one is together int eh same room. Everyone is participating independently at their own respective locations.

While we are not physically gathered tonight, however Zoom does generate a list of those who are virtually present for the proceeding, so the Department will have a record of those who have electronically joined this event.

There is a court reporter virtually present who will prepare a verbatim transcript of this hearing pursuant to the statutory requirement for DNREC to have the same prepared. And as always, that transcript will be posted on the hearing webpage dedicated to this matter as soon as it is received.

In addition, I would encourage those who are attending the hearing to also visit the hearing webpage dedicated to this matter for additional details concerning the proposed --

The hearing webpage can be found online under the administrative law section of DNREC's website that will be listed at the conclusion of tonight's hearing.

At the conclusion of my introductory remarks, I will be turning the hearing over to the Department's staff to provide their presentation for the record being generated in this matter.

Whereas the Department would have then opened up verbal comment portion of the hearing following the Department's presentation. The Department did not receive registration for verbal comment tonight.

It is important to note that the

Department offered the opportunity to register to give

verbal comment as noticed in the legal ads and online.

Those who wished to have provided a verbal comment

would have had to register by 12:00 p.m. today, to

which there were no registrants by that time.

I would encourage those attending this evening to go to DNREC's hearing webpage, under the "administrative law" section where you can find more details concerning the hearing matter, the hearing record presented tonight, along with related documents that are posted on the Department's hearing webpage dedicated to this matter.

Before we begin the presentations, please be advised that the following protocols remain

in place for all DNREC public hearings:

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All comment received must be limited solely to the subject matter of tonight's hearing.

All comments pertinent to the subject matter of the virtual hearing will be incorporated into the record being generated in this matter.

In light of the Administrative

Procedure Act, and to ensure that everyone who wishes

to offer comment for the secretary's consideration is

accommodated, the Department is required to, at a

minimum, provide a comment period of 15 days after the

hearing.

There's only one authentic record of this formal proceeding tonight, and it is the official court reporter's verbatim transcript.

The statutory purpose of tonight's hearing is to build a record with regard to the Department's proposed actions. A record consisting of a transcript of the hearing tonight, all written comments, all exhibits, and eventually the hearing officer's report will be reviewed by Secretary Garvin.

The secretary will ultimately issue an order following the review process containing his decision on this matter, and the reasons therefor.

Per DNREC's standard hearing protocols, there will be no Q&A or chat session permitted during the hearing.

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It is important to note that no decision has already been made by the Department, nor will a decision be made tonight with regard to the proposed set matter.

As previously stated, DNREC wishes to ensure that everyone is enabled to offer their comments for inclusion into the record being generated in the matter. As noticed in legal ads and online, the Department stated that the public comment will be open through December 13, 2023.

Comments may be submitted through a comment form link on the hearing webpage, via email to dnrechearingcomments@delaware.gov, or via the U.S. Postal Service at the physical address for DNREC indicated on the hearing webpage and on the notices previously issued for this matter.

Written comments to DNREC may not be submitted using social media platforms such as Twitter, Facebook, YouTube, or text messaging.

Please remember, all comments received either through USPS or via the electronic mechanisms

noted just now, as long as received by the Department on or before December 13th, will bear the exact same weight and be considered equally by the secretary prior to making his final decision.

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While all comments are appreciated,
each comment must be limited solely to the subject
matter of tonight's hearing. Multiple comments saying
the same thing do not outweigh one singular comment.
Simply put, comments are not votes. A single wellsupported comment may carry more weight than a
thousand form letters.

I also want to note that only comments submitted directly to DNREC and entered by myself into the formal hearing record in this matter will be posted on the hearing webpage and be considered by the Department as a part of the hearing matter decision process.

The Department has not partnered with any outside organization or websites to assist with the public submission of comments in this matter, so again, only submit comments to DNREC directly.

Lastly, the ultimate decision regarding this matter is made by DNREC's Secretary Garvin. This formal proceeding tonight acts as a mechanism to

enable the Department to thoroughly vet the hearing matter to the public and to let the public know various ways which comment may be submitted for Secretary Garvin's consideration, if so desired.

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I will now hand it over to Carolyn Cook with the Division of Air to provide the Department's presentation.

MS. COOK: Good evening. My name is Carolyn Cook and I'm an environmental scientist with the Airshed Planning & Inventory Group for the Division of Air Quality in the Delaware Department of Natural Resources & Environmental Control.

The purpose of this hearing is to take public comments on Delaware's proposed revisions to the Moderate Non-Attainment Plan for New Castle County for the 2015 8-Hour Ozone National Ambient Air Quality Standard.

Delaware's state implementation plan identifies how Delaware will attain and maintain air quality. As defined in Title 40 of the Code of Federal Regulations at part 52, subpart I.

The Environmental Protection Agency promulgated a revised National Ambient Air Quality Standard for Ground Level Ozone in 2015 of 70 parts

per billion. New Castle County was designated as nonattainment for this new standard. Kent and Sussex Counties were designated as attainment for this new standard.

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2.2

Ground level ozone, one of the principle components of smog, is a serious air pollutant that harms human health and the environment. High levels of ozone can damage their respiratory system and cause breathing problems, throat irritation, coughing, chest pains, and greater susceptibility to respiratory infection.

On June 4, 2018, the Environmental Protection Agency designated 51 areas of the country as non-attainment under the 2015 8-Hour Ozone National Ambient Air Quality Standard.

Among those non-attainment areas is the Philadelphia, Wilmington, Atlantic City non-attainment area consistent of Pennsylvania, New Jersey, Maryland, and Delaware. Also known as the Philadelphia non-attainment area, including New Castle County in Delaware.

In the Environmental Protection

Agency's designation process, the Philadelphia nonattainment area was designated as marginal. The

attainment deadline for marginal non-attainment areas was August 3, 2021. Failing to attain by the applicable attainment date requires that non-attainment areas be reclassified to moderate non-attainment for the 2015 Ozone National Ambient Air Quality Standard.

2.1

On October 7, 2022, the Environmental Protection Agency redesignated the Philadelphia non-attainment area as moderate non-attainment for the 2015 Ozone National Ambient Air Quality Standard based upon the failure of the non-attainment area to record data below the 70 parts per billion standard.

Areas reclassified to moderate face more stringent Clean Air Act requirements designated to achieve attainment of the National Ambient Air Quality Standard by no later than August 3, 2024.

Accordingly, the state air agencies in the Philadelphia non-attainment area were required to submit state implementation plan revisions called "non-attainment plans," and implement requirements to satisfy the statutory and regulatory requirements for moderate areas for the 2015 Ozone National Ambient Air Quality Standard.

This proposed revision to Delaware's

state implementation plan includes Delaware's nonattainment plan for the 2015 8-Hour Ozone National Ambient Air Quality Standard.

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Having been designated as moderate,

Delaware must include the following elements in the

state implementation plan: Attainment modeling

demonstrates that the New Castle County portion of the

Philadelphia, Wilmington, Atlantic City, Pennsylvania,

New Jersey, Maryland, Delaware moderate non-attainment

area will attain the 2015 8-Hour Ozone National

Ambient Air Quality Standard in 2023.

Reasonable further progress ensures that the air quality in New Castle County makes steady and incremental progress toward attaining the 2015 8-Hour Ozone National Ambient Air Quality Standard.

Control measures in emission reductions detail existing controls needed to attain the 2015 8-Hour Ozone National Ambient Air Quality Standard.

Mobile vehicle emission budgets are Delaware's 2023 mobile source budgets, or portions of total allowable emissions that are allocated to on-road mobile sources for transportation conformity determination.

Contingency measures are specific

control measures to be implemented if the area fails to make reasonable further progress, fails to meet any applicable milestone, or fails to attain the National Ambient Air Quality Standard by the applicable attainment date.

2.1

A base-year inventory establishes a baseline emissions inventory. For this non-attainment plan, the base year was 2017. Reasonably available control technology is the lowest emission limitation that a particular source is capable of meeting by the application of control technology that is reasonably available.

Reasonably available control measures are measures necessary to achieve attainment as soon as possible.

Delaware's gasoline vapor recovery program includes systems for gasoline vapor recovery of emissions from the fueling of motor vehicles. A non-attainment new source review certification certifies the adequacy of Delaware's non-attainment new source review program.

Delaware's motor vehicle inspection and maintenance program identifies problems with vehicle emission control systems and ensures their repairs.

The general emission offset requirement offsets the annual emissions increase from new sources or source modifications to provide a new air quality benefit. The ratio shall be at least 1.15 to 1 for moderate non-attainment areas.

2.1

In today's hearing, the Department is proposing additional non-substantive amendments to the non-attainment plan in response to the Environmental Protection Agency's pre-hearing review, including typos and grammatical errors, removal of most references and background regarding Sussex and Kent Counties as they are not part of the Philadelphia non-attainment area, and miscellaneous clarifications.
