Proposed Revisions to Delaware's Performance Standard Certification for the New Castle County I/M Program (Docket #2023-R-A-0017)

#### **Delaware's State Implementation Plan**

- Identifies how Delaware will attain and maintain air quality
- Delaware's State Implementation Plan (SIP) Title 40 of the Code of Federal Regulations at Part 52, Subpart I

- The Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) promulgated a revised National Ambient Air Quality Standard (NAAQS) for ground-level ozone in 2015 of 70 parts per billion (ppb).
- New Castle County was designated as **non-attainment** for this new standard.
- Kent and Sussex Counties were designated as **attainment** for this new standard.

- Ground level ozone, one of the principal components of "smog," is a serious air pollutant that harms human health and the environment.
- High levels of ozone can damage the respiratory system and cause breathing problems, throat irritation, coughing, chest pains, and greater susceptibility to respiratory infection.

- On June 4, 2018, the EPA designated 51 areas of the country as "non-attainment" under the 2015 8-hour Ozone NAAQS.
- Among those non-attainment areas is the Philadelphia-Wilmington-Atlantic City (PA-NJ-MD-DE) Non-Attainment Area (Philadelphia NAA), including New Castle County in Delaware.

Proposed Revisions to Delaware's Performance Standard Certification for the New Castle County I/M Program (Docket #2023-R-A-0017)

 This proposed revision to Delaware's State Implementation Plan (SIP) includes Delaware's Performance Standard Certification (PSC) for the New Castle County Inspection/Maintenance Program

- Performance Standard Certification is Delaware's demonstration that the vehicle Inspection and Maintenance Program (I/M) for New Castle County meets the Basic performance standard for the Moderate Non-Attainment Area.
- I/M Programs help reduce emissions of volatile organic compounds, carbon monoxide and nitrogen oxides through identifying high emitting vehicles.

- Motor Vehicle Emission Simulator (MOVES3.1.0)
- 1<sup>st</sup> Scenario Statewide representing New Castle's, I/M Program for the attainment year 2023
- 2<sup>nd</sup> Scenario Basic Performance representing the EPA's defined Basic I/M Program

- "Basic Performance Standard" Emission Rate:
  - VOC : 0.2148 g/mile
  - NOx : 0.3811 g/mile
- "New Castle County" Emission Rate:
  - VOC : 0.2085 g/mile
  - NOx : 0.3733 g/mile
- New Castle County has an emission rate that is lower than the basic performance standard for VOC and NOx
- Therefore, New Castle County I/M Program meets the certification requirements.

- In today's hearing, the Department is proposing additional non-substantive amendments to the Performance Standard Certification document, in response to EPA's pre-hearing review:
  - Typos and grammatical errors
  - Removal of most references and background regarding Sussex and Kent Counties, as they are not part of the Philadelphia NAA
  - Miscellaneous clarifications
