- 7 DE Admin. Code 1104, Particulate Emissions from Fuel Burning Equipment
- Regulation 1104 sets air emission limits for particulate matter for fuel burning equipment, to protect public health and the environment
- 7 **DE Admin. Code** 1104 is part of Delaware's State Implementation Plan (SIP)
- States are required to submit the proposed amendments to the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA)

- June 30, 2011 Sierra Club petition to the EPA
- Startup the setting in operation of a process or piece of equipment
- Shutdown the stopping of a process or piece or equipment
- Malfunction the sudden and unavoidable breakdown of process or control equipment

- June 12, 2015, EPA State Implementation Plan Call (SIP Call)
 - State Implementation Plans should not include exemptions for excess emissions during Startup, Shutdown and Malfunction events (SSM)
 - States required to submit SIPs correcting the deficiencies by November 22, 2016
 - 7 DE Admin. Code 1104 is included in the SIP Call

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- Delaware submitted Regulation 1104 into its State Implementation Plan on November 22, 2016
 - 1.5 The provisions of this Regulation shall not apply to the start-up and shutdown of equipment which operates continuously or in an extended steady state when emissions from such equipment during start-up and shutdown are governed by an operation permit issued pursuant to the provisions of 2.0 of 7 DE Admin. Code 1102.

2.0 Emission Limits

- 2.1 Reserved No person shall cause or allow the emission of particulate matter in excess of 0.3 pound per million BTU heat input, maximum two-hour average, from any fuel burning equipment.
- 2.2 No person shall cause or allow the emission of particulate matter in excess of 0.3 pound per million BTU heat input, maximum 30-day rolling average, from any fuel burning equipment.

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Delaware's "state-only" Regulation 1104

1.0 General Provisions

1.5 The provisions of <u>subsection 2.1 of</u> this Regulation shall not apply to the start-up and shutdown of equipment which operates continuously or in an extended steady state when emissions from such equipment during start-up and shutdown are governed by an operation permit issued pursuant to the provisions of Section 2.0 of 7 DE Admin. Code 1102.

2.0 Emission Limits

- 2.1 No person shall cause or allow the emission of particulate matter in excess of 0.3 pound per million BTU heat input, maximum two-hour average, from any fuel burning equipment.
 - 2.2 No person shall cause or allow the emission of particulate matter in excess of 0.3 pound per million BTU heat input, maximum 30-day rolling average, from any fuel burning equipment.

- October 23, 2023, the EPA issued a final rule disapproving Delaware's November 22, 2016, State Implementation Plan Call Submittal.
- Today's action is in response to the EPA's disapproval.

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Proposed Amendments:

1.0 General Provisions

1.5 The provisions of subsection 2.1 of this Regulation shall not apply to the start up and shutdown of equipment which operates continuously or in extended steady state when emissions from such equipment during start up and shutdown are governed by an operation permit issued pursuant to the provisions of Section 2.0 of 7 DE Admin. Code 1102.

2.0 Emissions Limits

- 2.1 No person shall cause or allow the emission of particulate matter in excess of 0.3 pound per million BTU heat input, maximum two-hour average, from any fuel burning equipment.
