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Page 6 1 PROCEEDINGS 2 MS. VEST: Good evening. The time is 3 6 p.m. on Thursday, December 21, 2023, and we are going to begin this evening's proceedings. 4 We are here this evening to provide the 5 6 virtual platform for DNREC to conduct its formal 7 public hearing on the proposed amendments to state of 8 Delaware lobster regulations. 9 My name is Lisa Vest, and 10 Cabinet Secretary Garvin has designated me to serve as 11 the hearing officer for this regulatory matter. Pursuant to DNREC's standard hearing 12 13 criticals, this hearing is being conducted virtually. 14 While there are no sign-in sheets to document physical 15 attendance tonight, Zoom will generate a list of those that are virtually attending this proceeding, and the 16 17 department will still maintain a record of those who 18 are here tonight. And again, I thank you for your 19 time. 20 I'm going to go through some brief 21 parameters of what to expect tonight. One thing to 2.2 note is that there were no members of the public that 23 pre-registered to offer a live comment this evening, 24 but that is perfectly okay because the record will

1 remain open through January 5th of 2024. And all comments bear the same weight whether they come in 2 before the hearing, at the time of the hearing, or 3 anytime between now and when the record closes for 4 comment on January 5th. And they will all be 5 6 incorporated into the formal hearing record and be 7 reviewed by Secretary Garvin prior to his making a decision on this matter. 8

9 So, before we begin, very quickly, the 10 following protocols apply to all DNREC public 11 hearings.

12 Number 1: All comment received must be 13 limited solely to the subject matter of tonight's 14 hearing, which again are the proposed amendments to 15 the lobster regs. All comments pertinent to the 16 subject matter of this hearing will be incorporated 17 into the hearing record and posted on the hearing 18 webpage dedicated to this matter.

Number 2: in order to ensure that anyone who wishes to make a comment for the record and for the secretary's consideration can be accommodated. The record will remain open to accept public comment beyond tonight's proceedings, and as I've already said, the record will remain open through

1 January 5, 2024.

2	Number 3: There is only one authentic
3	record of this hearing tonight, and it is the official
4	court reporter's transcript. We should receive that
5	within a few days following the hearing. And once we
6	get it, it will be posted on the hearing page for the
7	public to review should they wish to do so.
8	Number 4: The statutory purpose of
9	tonight's hearing is to build the record with regard
10	to this proposed promulgation. A record consisting of
11	the transcript of the hearing tonight, any and all
12	written comments that are received by the department,
13	all exhibits, and eventually the hearing officer's
14	report will be reviewed by Secretary Garvin. The
15	secretary will ultimately make a decision regarding
16	these proposals and shall issue an order following
17	that review process. And that order will contain not
18	only his decision but his reasoning, therefore.
19	Lastly, it's important to note that no
20	decision has been made about this proposed amendment
21	to the lobster regs nor will any decision be made
22	tonight during this hearing. Again, we are just here
23	to provide the platform to present what these proposed
24	amendments are and the ability for the public to offer

Page 9 1 comment if they had wished to do so. 2 That being said, I am going turn it 3 over to John Clark who is the department representative for the Division of Fish and Wildlife, 4 and John has a brief presentation regarding these 5 6 proposed amendments. 7 So, John, when you are ready, you may begin. 8 9 MR. CLARK: Thank you, Lisa. I will get started. 10 11 First, a little background on the 12 reason for this amendment, these proposed amendments 13 to the lobster regulations. 14 The North Atlantic right whale population is at a historically low level and has been 15 16 listed as endangered species under the Endangered 17 Species Act. 18 The federal agency overseeing recovery efforts for the North Atlantic right whale, NOAA 19 20 Fisheries, is trying to reduce potential hazards to 21 these whales. 2.2 Whale entanglement in the floating 23 lines of lobster pot gear was identified as a major 24 hazard and an important source of whale mortality.

Page 10 NOAA Fisheries has approved several rules intended to reduce whale entanglements in lobster pot gear. And this has led to these next actions that were taken by NOAA Fisheries and the Atlantic States Marine Fisheries Commission. NOAA Fisheries promulgated a rule requiring all federal lobster permit holders to install an approved device to collect and transmit spatial data in order to participate in the pot gear fishery in federal waters. Federally permitted vessels are required to install and activate an approved device prior to beginning a trip with lobster pot gear. The device must remain on board the vessel and be powered at all times when the vessel is in the water, unless the device is authorized to power down by the principal port state. Addendum 29 to the Atlantic States Marine Fisheries Commission American Lobster Fishery Management Plan requires all states with federal lobster permit holders to take complementary action to this federal action. Atlantic States Marine Fisheries

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1 Commission is providing all lobster permit holders 2 with funding for the tracking device, and the funding 3 will also cover several years of service for the tracking device. 4 Delaware is proposing the following, as 5 seen on the screen here, to make Delaware in 6 compliance with this plan and complement the federal 7 8 measures. And as can be seen, the proposed amendments 9 define the electronic tracking device and next require 10 the electronic tracking device to remain on board the 11 vessel, be powered during any actions of the vessel, 12 and anytime the vessel is in the water. 13 And so that is the proposed amendments 14 in a nutshell. 15 And finally, we have done extensive notification for this hearing and for these changes to 16 17 the regulation as seen here in the exhibits for the 18 proposed amendments. 19 And that concludes my presentation. 20 Okay. Thank you, John. MS. VEST: 21 Just a little bookkeeping for the record this evening. Are the exhibits on the screen 2.2 23 right now, 1 through 11, the same as those that are

24 posted on the hearing webpage dedicated to this

Page 12 1 matter? 2 MR. CLARK: They are. 3 MS. VEST: And have they been changed or altered in any way since that posting? 4 MR. CLARK: 5 No. 6 MS. VEST: Very good. 7 Let the record reflect that DNREC 8 proposed Exhibits 1 through 11 are hereby incorporated 9 into the formal hearing record being generated in this 10 matter. 11 (Exhibit 1 through Exhibit 11 were marked for identification.) 12 13 Does the department have anything 14 further that they wish to offer at this time? 15 MR. CLARK: We do not, Lisa. Thank 16 you. 17 MS. VEST: Thank you. 18 And that, as they say, is pretty much 19 it this evening, folks. 20 Normally, we would turn the floor over 21 to anyone who had pre-registered with the department 2.2 to offer comment. However, as I mentioned previously, 23 no members of the public did sign up to do so. 24 So we're going to go ahead now and

close tonight's proceedings with just a couple
comments before we go.

3 Again, for those that may be reading this transcript subsequent to tonight's hearing, I 4 would encourage everybody to check out the hearing 5 6 webpage. It has a lot of information. It'll have 7 every one of these exhibits that we're talking about 8 that just got entered into the record. And the public 9 can certainly review them, download them, and get a 10 fuller understanding of everything involved with these 11 proposed amendments prior to making any comments if 12 they wish to do so.

Again, all comments bear equal weight whether they came in before the hearing, tonight at the hearing, or any time between now and the fifth. As long as the department receives them no later than January 5, 2024, they will be incorporated into the hearing record.

I should remind the public that comments may be submitted through various ways. There is a comment form link on the hearing page. You can also send your comments in via email at DNRECHearingComments@delaware.gov or via the United States Postal Service at the physical address for

DNREC indicated on the hearing page as well as the
numerous public notices already issued by the

4 It should be noted that comments to 5 DNREC may not be submitted using any standard social 6 media platforms such as Twitter, or X if you will, 7 Facebook, YouTube, or any standardized text messaging. 8 I want to thank everybody for taking 9 the time to come out and review this. Once again, as 10 long as it's pertaining to the subject matter of 11 tonight's hearing, it will be incorporated into the record as long as it's received by January 5th. 12 13 I want to thank everybody for taking 14 the time to review this material and coming out 15 tonight to hear more about it.
