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PROCEEDINGS

MS. SMITH: Okay. Good evening again.

Today is Wednesday, August 30, 2023, and it is now
6:27 p.m. We will begin the second portion of
tonight's virtual hearing. Again my name is There's
Smith and Secretary Garvin has appointed me to serve
as the hearing officer for tonight's formal
proceeding.

For ADA compliance tonight's formal proceeding offers closed captioning and a variation of languages. Before I begin the introductory remarks I will now hand it over to Tanesha Perry with the Department to provide further details on how to utilize these features through the Zoom platform.

MS. PERRY: Hello. My name is Tanesha
Perry. I am Administrative Specialist 3 with the
Office of Secretary. I am here to assist the hearing
officer tonight. I'd like to make sure everyone is
aware that the Zoom platform we're using has the
ability for closed captioning in multiple languages.

To start closed captioning if you're

using a computer at the bottom of your screen you should see a show captions button. If you do not see the show captions button you may have to select the three dots that say more. Once you find your show captions button you should click the carat pointing up which will bring up a translations options. You can select your preferred language from there. If your preferred language isn't listed you can select more, and all of the languages will be listed.

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of your screen select the captions button indicated by CC. If your preferred language is not listed at the bottom you may have to select the three dots that say more. You should then select meeting settings with the gear icon next to it. Once the settings page comes up, located at the very bottom select translation language. From there you'll be able to select your preferred language, then select done at the top right corner and then done again.

If the captions are not automatically popping up yet you may need to select captions again

and select show captions. Now I'll turn it back over to the hearing officer, Theresa Smith.

MS. SMITH: Thank you, Ms. Perry. We are here this evening to provide a virtual platform for the State of Delaware's Department of Natural Resources and Environmental Control to conduct its virtual hearing on Docket number 2023-R-WH-0007, the proposed revisions to 7 DE Admin Code 1352 "Aboveground Storage Tanks."

First and foremost this hearing is being conducted virtually. No one is together in the same room. Everyone is participating independently at their own respective locations. While we are not physically gathered tonight Zoom does generate a list of those who are virtually present for the proceeding, so the department will have a record of those who have electronically joined this event.

At the conclusion of the introductory remarks I will be turning the hearing over to

Department staff to provide their presentation for the record being generated in this matter. Whereas the

department would then open the verbal comment portion of the hearing following the department's presentation, the department did not receive registration for verbal comment tonight. It is important to note that the department offered the opportunity to register to give verbal comment as noticed in the legal ads and online. Those that would have wished to provide a verbal comment would have had to register by 12 p.m. today to which there were no registrants by that time.

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There is a court reporter virtually present who will prepare a verbatim transcript of this hearing pursuant to the statutory requirements for DNREC to have the same prepared, and as always that transcript will be posted on the hearing webpage dedicated to this matter as soon as it is received.

In addition I would encourage those who are attending the hearing tonight to also visit the hearing webpage dedicated to this matter for additional details concerning the proposed regulations. The hearing webpage can be found online

under the administrative law section of DNREC's website that will be listed at the conclusion of tonight's hearing.

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Before we begin the presentation please be advised that the following protocols remain in place for all DNREC public hearings. All comment received must be limited solely to the subject matter of tonight's hearing. All comments pertinent to the subject matter of the virtual hearing will be incorporated into the record being generated in this matter. In order to ensure that everyone who wishes to offer comment for the secretary's consideration is accommodated the record in this matter shall remain open for a minimum of 15 days following tonight's proceeding.

There is one authentic record of this formal proceeding tonight, and it is the official court reporter's verbatim transcript. The statutory purpose of tonight's hearing is to get a record with regard to the department's proposed actions, a record consisting of the transcript of the hearing tonight,

all comments, all exhibits, and eventually the hearing officer's report will be reviewed by Secretary Garvin. The secretary will ultimately issue an order following that review process containing his decision on this matter and the reasons therefor.

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Per DNREC standard hearing protocols there will be no Q and A or chat sessions permitted during the hearing. It is important to note that no decision has already been made by the department, nor will any decision be made tonight with regard to the proposed regulatory matter. As previously stated, DNREC wishes to ensure everyone is enabled to offer their comments for inclusion into the record being generated in this matter. In light of the Administrative Procedures Act the department is required to, at a minimum, provide a comment period of a minimum of 15 days after the hearing.

As noticed in the legal ads and online the department stated that the public comment period will be open through Thursday, September 14, 2023.

Lastly the ultimate decision regarding this matter is made by DNREC Secretary Garvin. The formal proceeding tonight acts as a mechanism to enable the department to thoroughly vet the regulatory matter to the public and to let the public know the various ways to which comment may be submitted for Secretary Garvin's consideration if so

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I will now hand it over to Eileen

Butler with the Division of Waste and Hazardous

Substances to provide the department's presentation.

Thank you, Theresa.

MS. BUTLER:

Welcome to the Division of Waste and Hazardous
Substances public hearing on the proposed changes to
the aboveground storage tank regulations. My name is
Eileen Butler, and I will be presenting the proposed
changes for you this evening.

The division has made a number of minor changes throughout the regulation to comply with Delaware's regulatory style manual, mostly having to do with numbering and clarifying statements. The department recognized that there was a need to clarify the standards for identification and remediation of hydrocarbon releases from aboveground storage tanks. With that effort we are incorporating by reference the Delaware Risk-Based Corrective Action Protocol, otherwise known as DERBCAP, as well as the Hydrogeologic Investigation Guidance and Vapor

Intrusion Guidance that are referenced in DERBCAP.

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More specifically there are a number of definitions that were not included in the regulation that are included in the statue, and we chose to include them in the regulation at this time for ease of reference. We also included an industry standard definition for best management practices, and the definition for tier zero as it relates to DERBCAP soil sampling for release identification during tank activities. As I indicated previously, changes to how numbers are represented have been amended to comply with the style manual, and we added criteria for those seeking exemption from AST tier zero sampling requirements as well.

We incorporated language to individual sections throughout part B detailing site assessment requirements and relocated other requirements into DERBCAP. Those requirements, however, have not changed, they were just moved. We changed the definition of an AST to stipulate that each compartment in a compartmentalized tank is considered

a single AST.

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After publication in the Delaware register I reviewed what was submitted by the division to the registrar's office and what was actually published in the register, and I noticed a number of minor errors such as underlining words that should not be underlined or vice versa, missing a comma where one was inserted, striking a word that should not have been struck out.

All are formatting errors, no errors were substantive, and all were identified in what is called an errata table. This example of the errata table identifies what was originally published in the register and what needs to be amended in the version published in the register. The table is seven pages long and has been submitted as an exhibit which is available for your review.

Now I'd like to discuss the three standards that we are incorporating into regulation. Incorporation by reference is a method by which a document is made part of the regulation simply by

referring to it. While the text of an incorporated document does not appear in the regulation, the provisions of the incorporated document are as fully enforceable as any other regulation. Just like, for example, the other reference standards outlined in section 3 of part A in the AST regulations.

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The Delaware Risk-Based Corrective
Action Protocol, DERBCAP, is based on the national
ASME standard for risk-based corrective action and is
being incorporated by reference into the AST
regulations. Some regulatory requirements associated
with corrective action are outlined in this document
and are directly tied to sampling and reporting
requirements. DERBCAP provides a tiered approach to
evaluate risk to human health and ecological
receptors.

To remain consistent with other

Delaware programs an excess cancer risk of 10 to the minus 5 is assumed in all calculations, and with regards to the toolkit when calculating risk-based screening levels you need to be using the most updated

version of the toolkit, 2.53 DE Delaware specific version which is available at the link provided on this screen.

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The overall scope of the revisions, including the format of the document, is similar to the January 2000 version. We updated some definitions and references and revised the risk-based screening levels to current standards. As mentioned previously we incorporated tier zero sampling requirements for ASTs in this document. Appendices 2 through 7 in the protocol detail the input to the toolkit model resulting in the updated action levels and RBSLs in the guide. Tier zero action levels and tier 1 risk-based screening levels are provided in tables 2 and 4 in the guide respectively.

The fate and transport model used to calculate updated action levels and screening levels has been updated to the current version, version 2.53 DE, of the risk-based corrective action toolkit for DERBCAP. There have been several changes to the risk calculations; parameters have been adjusted to

calculate updated risk-based screening level numbers that reflect current toxicity values.

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This slide shows those parameters that have been updated. Risk is now age adjusted; body weight of adult increased to 80 kilograms; exposure duration is 26 years rather than 30 years; water ingestion rate for a child decreased while water ingestion rate for an adult increased; noncarcinogenic risk is now based on child risk; and the cleanup levels are defaulting to MCLs set by drinking water standards supported by toxicology and scientific knowledge.

We wanted to show you in this table that there was a modification of the distance categories. We pinpoint risk-based screening levels based on distance to point of exposure as seen in the circle on the top of your screen. The Hydrogeologic Investigation Guidance document is referenced in DERBCAP, and as such is also considered a standard by incorporation into the regulations.

Definitions and standard references

were updated, but the overall scope of the revisions including the format of the document is similar to the 2012 version. And lastly, similar to the HIG the Vapor Intrusion Guidance has also been included in this effort because it is referenced in DERBCAP. The Vapor Intrusion Guidance now includes the petroleum vapor intrusion pathway, and we revised risk assessments and updated definitions and standard references.

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The next three slides will highlight the exhibits that the division is respectfully submitting to the hearing officer as evidence that the division complied with the 24-step regulatory development process to amend the aboveground storage tank regulations. All exhibits are available for public review and are as follows.

Exhibit 1 are the proposed aboveground storage tanks regulations that were published in August 1, 2023, register of regulations.

Exhibit 2 is the summary of changes to those proposed AST regulations.

Exhibit 3 is the signed start action notice #2023-03.
