## Comments:

As a homeowner in Bethany Beach, I enthusiastically support the efforts of US Wind, Inc. to develop wind turbines off the Delaware coast. The reasons usually offered from those who oppose their construction – destruction of our ocean views, negative impact on property values, negative effect on tourism – miss the mark, it seems to me. Yes, the proposed towers are tall, but they will be placed so many miles offshore that they will likely be a tiny speck on the horizon, if they are visible at all. Effect on my property values? I believe the rampant residential and business development in Sussex County in recent years, and the subsequent growing traffic, are significantly greater threats to my property values than the specks on the horizon posed by wind turbines. And as for a negative impact on tourism, people who come to the beach are unlikely to stay away because of the existence of barely visible wind turbines many miles offshore. So why do I support the construction of wind turbines here? Quite simply, the scientific evidence is overwhelming that our climate is changing -- indeed, has changed -- and renewable energy sources offer one of the few ways to try to turn back that tide (pun intended).
