Today I have my own boat where I go into the sea to find my peace, fishing and enjoying what God has provided us. Nothing centers me more than when I round the point of Cape Henlopen and watch the sunrise over an unobstructed view of the horizon. I am writing to express my opposition to the US Wind Project proposal. I understand the temporary economic value it will be to the state and the energy benefits it will bring to the residents for the near future. But as a professional who has worked in the Oil Gas and Energy sector for 10 years, I can say from experience what US Wind is proposing is not all sunshine and rainbows. First these companies are not in the business of making renewable energy, or affordable energy for Delaware they are in the business of making money. Often what comes with that is bending regulations to the brink of no return to get what they want accomplished. Which often leads to detrimental outcomes such as releases of toxic/hazardous chemicals/fumes/vapors into the environment affecting the people. Then the companies throw more money at the situation to make it go away and stay out of the headlines while getting away with not resolving or fixing the situation. These turbines will need to be regularly maintained, requiring an oil change just like our cars. Using an estimated 500 gallons of oil at least once a year.
