My father, uncle and I still continue to fish Delaware River, Bay and Coastal waters to this day. What is happening off of our coast and up the bay is an absolute travesty to all of the waterman and conservation efforts made over the last century! You ARE DESTROYING THE ECOSYSTEM! I have witnessed firsthand the damages done from surveying for windmill and cable placement. I have seen firsthand the devastation to porpoises, whales, crabs, conch and other bottom feeders after the survey vessels came through. Traps full of dead conch that weren't dead when they crawled in.
