I am opposed to the North Fish USA fish processing and smoking plant located at 200 Centerpoint Blvd. The plant creates several environmental concerns. The smoking process will pollute the air, and diminish air quality. Scrubbers are insufficient. The brining process entails utilizing 240lbs of salt that will be sent to the sewer, 6 days a week; that may also be per batch processed. The smell of the fish waste, entrails, offal and other non edible/usable items will not be diminished by the scrubbers. The amount of fish processed is purported to be 9 tons per day, 6 days a week during business as usual, and more during the high season. The fact that removal is needed twice a day denotes how much waste is being created. This is not a business that should be located directly next to highly populated neighborhoods. Nor should the municipality have to bear the burden of the interference with the quiet enjoyment of their properties, the air quality from the odor and the smoke, and the burden on the water supply and sewer system. The adjacent retention pond and estuaries leading to the river will also be affected negatively.
