number 2025-R-CCE-0007, the proposed amendments to
7 DE Admin. Code 2105 "Regulations Governing
Evaluation, Measurement, and Verification Procedures
and Standards."

The purpose of tonight's hearing is to build a record in regard to the hearing matter by providing a formal legal platform for the public to learn about the proposed revisions and to enable the public to offer their verbal comment. This hearing is being conducted virtually. No one is together in the same room. Everyone is participating independently at their own respective locations.

While we are not physically gathered tonight, Zoom does generate a list of those who are virtually present for this proceeding. So the department will have a record of those who have electronically joined this event.

There is a court reporter virtually present who will prepare a verbatim transcript of the hearing pursuant to the statutory requirement for DNREC to have the same prepared. And as always, that transcript will be posted on the hearing web page

dedicated to this matter as soon as it is received.

In addition, I would encourage those who are attending the hearing to also visit the hearing's web page dedicated to this matter for additional details concerning the proposed revisions to 7 DE Admin. Code 2105 "Regulations Governing Evaluation, Measurement, and Verification Procedures and Standards."

The hearing record presented tonight along with other related documents are posted on the department's hearing web page dedicated to this matter. The hearing web page can be found online under the administrative law section of DNREC's website that will be posted at the end of tonight's hearing.

At the conclusion of my introductory remarks, I will be turning the hearing record over to the department staff to provide a presentation for the record being generated in this matter.

Once the presentation concludes, those person who pre-registered in advance of the hearing will be acknowledged and provided an opportunity to offer comment on the proposed regulatory matter in alignment with DNREC's standard comment protocols that

1 | I will discuss in later detail soon.

Before we begin the presentation, please be advised of the following protocols that remain in place for all DNREC public hearings:

All comment received must be limited solely to the subject matter of tonight's hearing.
All comments pertinent to this subject matter of the virtual hearing will be incorporated into the record being generated in this matter.

In light of the Administrative

Procedures Act and to ensure that everyone who wishes
to offer comment for the secretary's consider is
accommodated, the department is required to, at a
minimum, provide a comment period of a minimum of
15 days after the hearing.

There's only one authentic record of the formal proceeding tonight, and it is the official court reporter's verbatim transcript. The statutory purpose of tonight's hearing is to build a record with regard to the department's proposed actions.

A record consisting of the transcript of the hearing tonight, all written comment, all exhibits, and eventually the hearing officer's report will be reviewed by Secretary Patterson.

The secretary will ultimately issue an order following that review process containing his decision on this matter and the reasons therefore.

Per DNREC's standard hearing protocols, there will be no Q and A or chat session permitted during the hearing.

It is important to note that no decision has already been made by the department, nor will any decision be made tonight with regard to the proposed regulatory matter.

As previously stated, DNREC wishes to ensure that everyone is enabled to offer their comments for inclusion into the record being generated in this matter as noticed in the legal ads and online. The public comment period will remain open through October 7, 2025.

While all comments are appreciated, each comment must be limited solely to the subject matter of tonight's hearing. Multiple comments saying the same thing do not outweigh one singular comment. Simply put, they are not votes, as a single well-supported comment may carry more weight than a thousand form letters.

I also want to note that only comments submitted directly to DNREC and entered by myself into the formal hearing record in this matter will be posted on the hearing web page and be considered by the department as a part of the decision process.

The department has not partnered with any outside organization or website to assist with the public submission of comments in this matter. So again, only submit comments to DNREC directly.

Lastly, the ultimate decision regarding this matter is DNREC Secretary Patterson. This formal proceeding tonight acts as a mechanism to enable the department to thoroughly vet the hearing matter to the public and to let the public know the various ways which comment may be submitted for Secretary Patterson's consideration if so desired.

I will now hand it over to Anna Keating with the Division of Climate, Coastal, and Energy to provide the department's presentation.

MS. KEATING: Thank you, Theresa.

For context, this regulation guides the evaluation, measurement, and verification process in Delaware. EM&V is the process by which energy professionals make sure efficiency programs are saving energy and money. It helps energy professionals assess how programs are working and decide what strategies to continue to pursue.

The purpose of the regulatory action is to amend the regulation in order to incorporate the Delaware Technical Reference Manual instead of the Mid-Atlantic Technical Reference Manual to include non-energy impacts as approved by the EEAC as benefits in the total resource cost test and to revise

definitions, unit of measure, and terminology for clarity and accuracy.

The Mid-Atlantic TRM was a regional effort co-funded by participating states, but many of the measures included were not actually applicable to Delaware's programs. As a result, it became more costly and administratively efficient to focus resources on creating a TRM that reflects the measures that are actually implemented in Delaware. The Delaware TRM allows for more frequent updates and better alignment with local program and evaluation needs.

In addition, the Mid-Atlantic TRM was last updated in 2020. And the Northeast Energy Efficiency Partnership, NEEP, is the organization that led the Mid-Atlantic TRM review and update process -- is no longer doing so.

Regarding the inclusion of the nonenergy impacts and the total resource cost test, this
change aligns with practices in other states, such as
Maryland, New York, and Vermont. These impacts
represent quantifiable benefits, such as health,
comfort, economic benefits, and including them in
cost-effectiveness screening provides a more holistic

view of a program's value.

2.0

Non-energy impacts also support

Delaware's broader policy goals, such as reducing

greenhouse gas emissions and advancing equity by

recognizing the full range of benefits that energy

efficiency programs can deliver.

Many of the edits provided specificity to the regulation or update the regulation to reflect current practices. An example of this is that the previous version of the regulation indicated that biannual reports should be presented in August and February. And since the EEAC since changed to a quarterly meeting schedule, the updated regulation now reflects this by specifying that the reports will be presented in October and April instead.

The statutory basis for this regulatory amendment is Title 26 of Delaware Code, Chapter 15.

DNREC is responsible for determining compliance with Delaware's Energy Efficiency Resource Standards requirements and the establishment of evaluation standards.

As for stakeholder engagement, the proposed regulation was drafted with significant review and input from the Energy Efficiency Advisory

Council's EM&V Committee over the course of numerous meetings on the revisions.

During the formal regulatory process, stakeholder engagement with the interested persons list has been continuously maintained through updates. And final review of the proposed regulation took place at the EM&V meeting on April 8th and the EEAC meeting on April 9th. Feedback gathered at these meetings indicated support for the proposed regulation.

Regarding the formal regulatory process to date, the Start Action Notice underwent division director's review, received the secretary's signature, and was distributed to the interested persons list.

A deputy attorney general from the Department of Justice conducted a legal review of the draft regulation. The deputy secretary reviewed and approved of the draft regulation. Legal notice advertising the public hearing was made available on the DNREC website, the public meeting calendar, and published in both The News Journal and Delaware State News.

The Proposed Regulation, the Register Notice, and the Regulatory Flexibility Analysis and Impact Statement were published in the Register of
