MS. GRISETO: -- had explained that they're well-versed in dealing with lagoon issues and that they had the team that could actually -- you know, that could address it and move forward with it.

So once that fell through, we -- we reached out to ask what we could do with the limited resources that we had. We had ceased operations -- stopped in April of '23, so we were no longer, you know, generating revenue. We thought we had everything sold. The foreclosure took place.

We really weren't sure what to do at that point.

THE REPORTER: Good morning. I'm sorry to interrupt. This is Andrew Weader. I'm the court reporter, and I just received a link for this a moment or two ago.

THE HEARING OFFICER: Okay. Sir, that's fine. We had to go ahead and start.

Appreciate you joining in, but I've got the Zoom recording going. So we're good.

THE REPORTER: Okay.

THE HEARING OFFICER: We're good.

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MS. GRISETO: So, I mean, in my understanding, those -- those were the issues, that they were not taking the necessary steps to transfer ownership of the permit.

But I'm -- we're at a loss as to what we need to do and tried to reach out, you know, to DNREC for direction, because we're unclear as to how to move forward with it.

And when I first spoke with Joshua

Barth about it, he said that he was also unclear,

because he had not dealt with a situation where there

was a foreclosure of land that the lagoon sat on and

how that transfer actually was to take place.

And shortly after Joshua and I talked, someone else was -- he moved to a different division, I believe, and someone else took over our case. And like I said, they asked if we could do an amicable

letter. There was no way to do an amicable letter to transfer ownership.

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So we -- we've been at a loss as to what to do to -- to address this. I'm not sure what steps can be taken. Like I said, James Thompson's not in business. James Thompson's not generating revenue. We thought we had addressed this, and we thought everything was being sold.

Then it went into foreclosure. If we reached out, we tried to ask, "What -- what do we do with the lagoon since we don't own the land? We don't have access to it. How do we move it forward?" And, you know, our permit had expired in 2019.

And I think it had an administrative approval or something, they called it, as we were trying to renew it, you know, many, many years ago. So I just -- like I said, I'm -- for us, I -- I don't know how we would be able to address the permit issue.

I'm not sure how to transfer that ownership to the new landowner that took possession. It wasn't like it was a friendly sale and we were going to, you know, file whatever documents are necessary to -- to move this forward. It wasn't that situation.

So I don't know how we -- I don't know how we transfer the ownership of it.

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Joshua left.

THE HEARING OFFICER: Okay. Thank you for your testimony.

MR. GRISETO: I'm sorry.

THE HEARING OFFICER: Yes, Mr. Griseto?

MR. GRISETO: Okay. If I could just surmise on what she said, we have documentation from Joshua. We have the sale documentation that we no longer own the property. We have a letter from DNREC,

And then we also have the letter from Alphatex's attorney forbidding us access. Can we present that as evidence?

which Terry responded with the same things after

THE HEARING OFFICER: Absolutely. So I -- this right here, this administrative hearing is the formal platform to obtain testimony and give the respondent an opportunity to speak.

As I mentioned in my opening remarks, I'm going to leave the record open for five business days so that any documentation that the respondent wishes the secretary to consider, we can get it in.

We can get it part of this package and get it to him

1 for reconsideration.

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And in a few minutes, I'll give you the address and everything and the email so that that can be effectuated. Is there any other verbal testimony that you wish to offer at this time?

MR. GRISETO: The only other thing is -- is that Terry said and I'll reconfirm James Thompson and Company is no longer in business, no longer generating any revenue. It's basically ceased operation, so -- and we do not have access to the property.

THE HEARING OFFICER: Okay. Very good. Thank you for that testimony from both Mr. and Mrs. Griseto. As I mentioned at the beginning, counsel for the department is present. I am unsure whether they wish to offer anything at this time.

Ms. Scott, is there anything that you wish to offer on the record at this point?

MS. SCOTT: Hearing Officer Vest, this is Devera Scott, and I am here to listen to what the Grisetos have to say in their -- on their behalf. I don't have anything in particular to say.

But I would be interested in seeing those documents that they mentioned from Alphatex's

attorney, cease and desist or no trespass. I would like to see those documents whenever they're made available to you, Hearing Officer Vest.

THE HEARING OFFICER: Very good. Thank you, Ms. Scott.

As I mentioned at the beginning of this matter, this is not a standard public hearing like the ones that DNREC routinely puts on. It is an administrative hearing held upon request of the respondent in this specific matter.

Given the fact that there seems to be additional documentation that needs to be incorporated into the record, as I mentioned previously, we are not going to close the record at the conclusion of this hearing. I am going to keep it open for an additional five business days.

That way, this information can be gotten to me, incorporated into the matter before us, and reviewed for reconsideration.

That means that the deadline to get any and all additional documentation in will be next Wednesday, April 30th. I'm giving it five business days.

For receipt of that information, the

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1 respondent can email it to me at

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lisa.vest@delaware.gov, or you could certainly mail it or somehow, you know, to expedite it, UPS, FedEx, whatever. You could do a hard copy if you wished, or you can do it both ways. It's completely up to you.

It just needs to get in to me by close of business on Wednesday, April 30th. The physical address to get it to me would just be put it to my attention at DNREC and mark it, "Attention, Lisa Vest." The address is 89 Kings Highway, K-I-N-G-S, Dover, Delaware 19901.

Being that we have received the testimony from both the respondent and counsel for the department, this matter is going to now be concluded. I want to thank everybody for giving us the time on this busy weekday morning.

And again, as long as the information is provided to me no later than close of business on Wednesday, April 30th, it will be incorporated into the record. Once April 30th comes and goes, the record will close.

There will be no more additional information received to be incorporated in this matter. I will then review the entirety of the record
