III. Detailed Project Description (attach additional sheets if necessary):

On behalf of Eastern Shore Natural Gas (ESNG), RK&K is designing a 4-inch natural gas lateral line and meter/regulator station located in Kent county. The ~1,700-foot long lateral will originate at the intersection of Canterbury Road (SR 15) and S. Dupont Highway (US 13). The lateral will run south along the east side of Canterbury Road to Irish Hill Road where the lateral will run east along the north side of Irish Hill Road for ~530 feet where the lateral will turn south across Irish Hill Road to terminate at a new 5,000 sq foot meter station located at 284 Irish Hill Road. The lateral will be placed within the existing road ROW and the meter/regulator station will be in private easement. See attached plans for additional location information.
