The slip is Unit No. 6 within the Fishers Cove Dock Condominium which consists of 6 existing boat slips accessed by three existing 6'x32 pier extending from a landside boardwark. The facility is on the westerly side of the Lewes Rehoboth Canal in an area occupied by numerous existing docks and piers. The facility has a current DNREC Subaqueous Lands Lease SL-176/05 (T-1).
