Dear Secretary Patterson,

I hope you are well. This is Isaac J. [REDACTED] from the [REDACTED]. As you know, our group focuses heavily on our very local concerns, but we are also the type of people who care deeply about the health of our state and planet overall.

We have been following the Project Washington/Starwood Project closely. Based on my understanding of the Coastal Zone, I am writing to reiterate the concerns that other advocates and concerned citizens have been raising: I believe the Data Center is incompatible with the Coastal Zone, has the potential to cause significant environmental harm, and therefore, it should not be permitted.

The most compelling CZA concern to me seems to be that the facility meets the criteria of a tank farm, with all the associated risks for the coastal environment. As you know, the Data Center will have 516 emergency generators, each with a 5,020-gallon diesel fuel tank. I am alarmed, and imagine DNREC is too, about the possibility of a leak or spill of the 2,590,320 gallons of diesel fuel in the Coastal Zone due to equipment malfunction or human error.

Thank you for considering my comments. I look forward to being in touch about this and Yorklyn issues.
