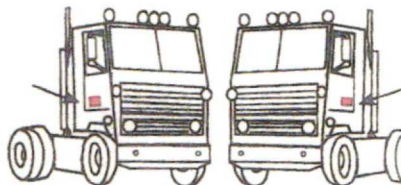
- New hires co-drive with our most seasoned drivers for the first several weeks as part of their training.
 - Mandatory, random drug screenings are administered by a third-party contractor at regular intervals.
 - Annual reviews of Driver's Motor Vehicle Records and FMCSA Clearinghouse are conducted. Written warnings are given for minor infractions. Two or more written warnings may result in termination. Serious infractions are grounds for immediate termination.
 - Any driver who is issued a traffic violation is required to complete a 2 to 8 hour Commercial Defensive Driving Course, depending on the nature of the violation.
 - Monthly safety training handouts are provided. Several times per year safety meetings and training sessions are conducted.
 - Our insurance company is provided updated driver records at least annually.
 - We are contracted with, and keep on retainer, a local DOT Compliance Company, MGSafer Services, LLC. To assist our company in driver training, education, and regulation compliance.

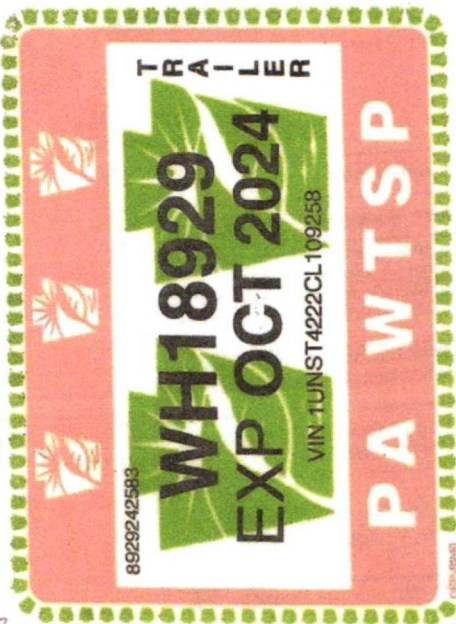

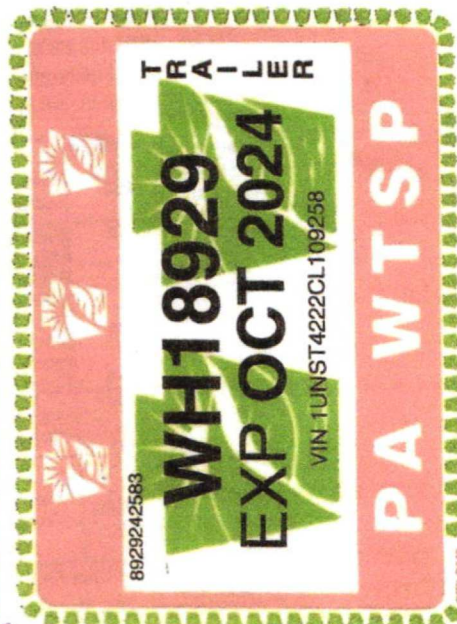

Spill Control Plan

1. Spill control and safety equipment carried in each vehicle:

 - c. Fire extinguisher

2. All loads will be enclosed, covered, or tarped to prevent accidental discharge of the waste during transport to the disposal facility.
3. The driver will perform the following pre-trip inspections:
 - a. Vehicle Inspection Report as required by the D.O.T. Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations
 - b. Inspect covered tarps for tears and verify all turn-buckles on watertight tailgates are tightened and secure.
4. If there is an accident or other emergency which causes a portion of the load to be spilled, the driver, if uninjured, will contain the spill, if possible, and contact one of the following designated company coordinators:
 - a. Bruce E. Blessing
 - b. Marion Chandler
 - c. Mitchell Breeding
5. The designated coordinator will contact the state and municipal authorities where the accident occurred. 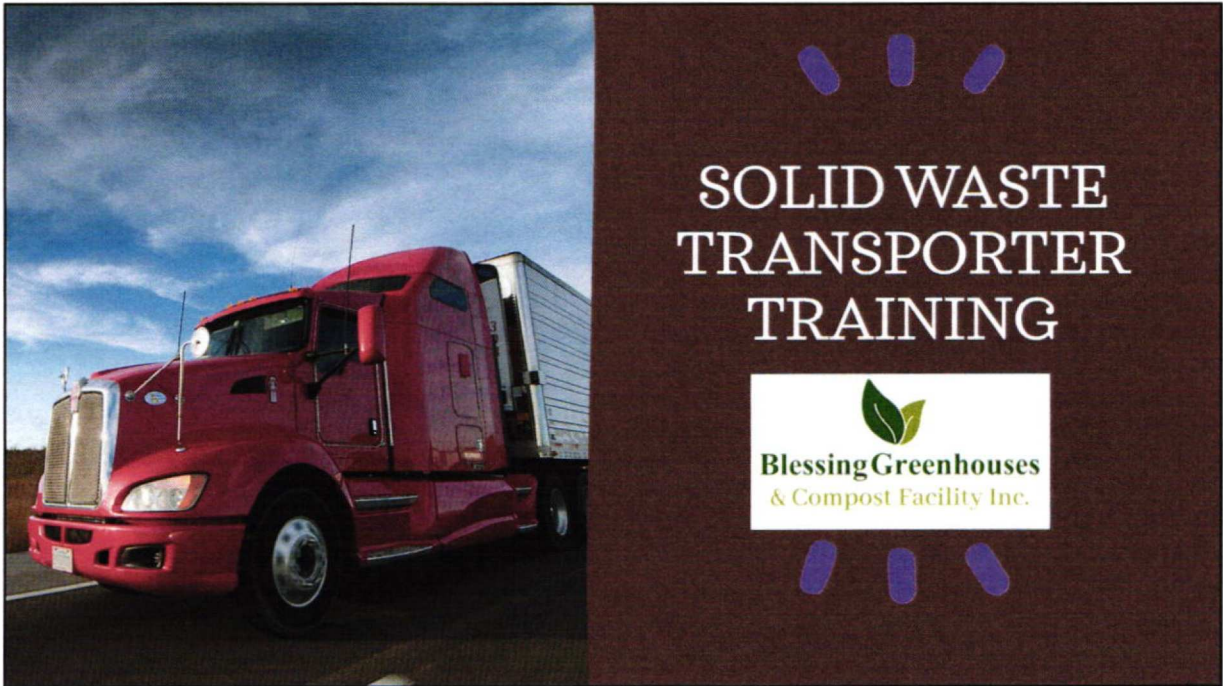

 - Annual reviews of Driver's Motor Vehicle Records and FMCSA Clearinghouse are conducted. Written warnings are given for minor infractions. Two or more written warnings may result in termination. Serious infractions are grounds for immediate termination.
 - Any driver who is issued a traffic violation is required to complete a 2 to 8 hour Commercial Defensive Driving Course, depending on the nature of the violation.
 - Monthly safety training handouts are provided. Several times per year safety meetings and training sessions are conducted.
 - Our Insurance company is provided updated driver records at least annually.
 - We are contracted with, and keep on retainer, a local DOT Compliance Company, MGSafer Services, LLC. To assist our company in driver training, education, and regulation compliance.
 - **RainWise Environmental Solutions provides annual Stormwater Pollution Prevention, Spill Response and Solid Waste Transporter Training. Classroom and job briefings are provided. A copy of the powerpoint presentation is attached for the Solid Waste Transporter portion of the Training. All drivers are trained on the requirements of the permit, proper handling and transportation of materials, and the spill control plan.**
 - **Additionally, the Facility trains all drivers on the conditions of the permit, proper handling and transportation of the materials, and the spill control plan as part of their orientation period during the first several weeks of employment. Blessing Greenhouses and Compost also provides monthly safety handouts and a minimum of annual review training on these issues. The facility also has copies of the permits and spill control plan in binders in each truck and posted in the scalehouse.**
