

- · Experience operating heavy equipment and strong mechanical background is required.

- New hires co-drive with our most seasoned drivers for the first several weeks as part of their training.
- Mandatory, random drug screenings are administered by a third-party contractor at regular intervals.

- Monthly safety training handouts are provided. Several times per year safety meetings and training sessions are conducted.
- Our Insurance company is provided updated driver records at least annually.
- We are contracted with, and keep on retainer, a local DOT Compliance Company, MGSafer Services, LLC. To assist our company in driver training, education, and regulation compliance.
- RainWise Environmental Solutions provides annual Stormwater Pollution Prevention, Spill
 Response and Solid Waste Transporter Training. Classroom and job briefings are provided. A
 copy of the powerpoint presentation is attached for the Solid Waste Transporter portion of the
 Training. All drivers are trained on the requirements of the permit, proper handling and
 transportation of materials, and the spill control plan.
- Additionally, the Facility trains all drivers on the conditions of the permit, proper handling and
 transportation of the materials, and the spill control plan as part of their orientation period
 during the first several weeks of employment. Blessing Greenhouses and Compost also provides
