

## DEFINITIONS AS USED IN THIS ENDORSEMENT

**Accident** includes continuous or repeated exposure to conditions or which results in bodily injury, property damage, or environmental damage which the insured neither expected nor intended.

**Motor Vehicle** means a land vehicle, machine, truck, tractor, trailer, or semitrailer propelled or drawn by mechanical power and used on a highway for transporting property, or any combination thereof.

**Bodily Injury** means injury to the body, sickness, or disease to any person, including death resulting from any of these.

**Property Damage** means damage to or loss of use of tangible property.

**Environmental Restoration** means restitution for the loss, damage, or destruction of natural resources arising out of the accidental discharge, dispersal, release or escape into or upon the land, atmosphere, watercourse, or body of water, of any commodity transported by a motor carrier. This shall include the cost of removal and the cost of necessary measures taken to minimize or mitigate damage to human health, the natural environment, fish, shellfish, and wildlife.

**Public Liability** means liability for bodily injury, property damage, and environmental restoration.

The insurance policy to which this endorsement is attached provides automobile liability insurance and is amended to assure compliance by the insured, within the limits stated herein, as a motor carrier of property, with Sections 29 and 30 of the Motor Carrier Act of 1980 and the rules and regulations of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration (FMCSA).

In consideration of the premium stated in the policy to which this endorsement is attached, the insurer (the company) agrees to pay, within the limits of liability described herein, any final judgment recovered against the insured for public liability resulting from negligence in the operation, maintenance or use of motor vehicles subject to the financial responsibility requirements of Sections 29 and 30 of the Motor Carrier Act of 1980 regardless of whether or not each motor vehicle is specifically described in the policy and whether or not such negligence occurs on any route or in any territory authorized to be served by the insured or elsewhere. Such insurance as is afforded, for public liability, does not apply to injury to or death of the insured's employees while engaged in the course of their employment, or property transported by the insured, designated as cargo. It is understood and agreed that no condition, provision, stipulation, or limitation contained in the policy, this endorsement, or any other endorsement thereon,

or violation thereof, shall relieve the company from liability or from the payment of any final judgment, within the limits of liability herein described, irrespective of the financial condition, insolvency or bankruptcy of the insured. However, all terms, conditions, and limitations in the policy to which the endorsement is attached shall remain in full force and effect as binding between the insured and the company. The insured agrees to reimburse the company for any payment made by the company on account of any accident, claim, or suit involving a breach of the terms of the policy, and for any payment that the company would not have been obligated to make under the provisions of the policy except for the agreement contained in this endorsement.

It is further understood and agreed that, upon failure of the company to pay any final judgment recovered against the insured as provided herein, the judgment creditor may maintain an action in any court of competent jurisdiction against the company to compel such payment.

The limits of the company's liability for the amounts prescribed in this endorsement apply separately to each accident and any payment under the policy because of anyone accident shall not operate to reduce the liability of the company for the payment of final judgments resulting from any other accident.

## 1.0 INTRODUCTION

**\*\*IF SPILL HAS OCCURRED TURN TO THE CALL LIST AND RESPONSE PERSONNEL PAGE NOW\*\***

The procedures and guidance documents provided in this Oil Transportation Emergency Response Plan (Plan) are prepared in accordance with 49 CFR 130.1 through 130.33 and fulfill the requirements of 49 CFR 130.31.

The content of this Plan provides the following information:

1. Sets forth a manner to respond to discharges that may occur during transportation.
2. Identifies personnel and equipment available to respond to a discharge.
3. Identifies appropriate personnel, both in-house and private contractors to attend to releases that may occur. Agency telephone numbers are listed for the States that UES operates in and through.

The plan is divided into sections that correspond to Tabs as listed below:

- **Call List and Response Personnel:** Lists all appropriate contacts to attend to spills.
- **Hazardous Material Incident Report Form:** Form to be filled out by the vehicle operator or person on the scene of the release.
- **List of Hazardous Materials:** Identifies all materials transported by Universal.
- **National Emergency Response Communication Standard:** This document outlines specific procedures to be taken upon a release.
- **National Emergency Response Guides 128 and 171:** Quick reference of spill response.

## 2.0 CALL LIST AND RESPONSE PERSONEL

### **3.0 NATIONAL EMERGENCY RESPONSE COMMUNICATION STANDARDS**

Emergency response information must be included with shipments of hazardous materials that are subject to the shipping paper requirements. These regulations impact the preparation of hazardous materials shipping papers and information needed to accompany them. Primarily, it is the responsibility of the shipper to supply the information required. However, it is still incumbent upon the transporter of the material to make sure the information is present prior to shipment. In the event of a hazardous materials incident, it is imperative that the information required by the standard be made immediately available to emergency response personnel.

#### **3.1 EMERGENCY RESPONSE INFORMATION (49 CFR 172.602)**

The Department of Transportation has identified seven specific areas of information, which must accompany shipping papers for hazardous materials. This information must be present for each hazardous material being transported and must be immediately available to emergency responders whenever there is a hazardous material present. The regulations require the following:

- The proper description of the hazardous material(s);
- The immediate hazards to health;
- Fire and explosion risks;
- Precautions to be taken immediately;
- Immediate methods for handling fires;
- Initial methods for handling spills or leaks in the absence of fire; and
- Preliminary first aid measures.

This information is similar to that which is provided in the North American Emergency Response Guidebook or on a manufacturer's Material Safety Data Sheet (MSDS).

The regulations permit several methods of supplying the required information; however, all methods are required to be:

- Printed in English; and
- Available for use away from the package containing the hazardous material.

This information can be printed:

- Directly on the shipping paper; or
- On another document such as an MSDS or emergency response guidance manual which cross-references the material to emergency response procedures.

During transportation, the regulations guiding the availability of shipping papers (49 CFR 177.817) also apply to the emergency response information. At facilities, the emergency response information must be maintained and immediately accessible whenever a hazardous material is present.

### **3.1.1 EMERGENCY RESPONSE TELEPHONE NUMBER (49 CFR 172.604)**

Shippers of hazardous materials are required to enter an emergency response telephone number on the shipping papers. This telephone number must appear on the shipping paper:

- Immediately following a hazardous material entry; or
- In a conspicuous place on the shipping paper, if the one number can be utilized for all hazardous materials listed on the paper. There must be some indication that this number is to be used for emergency response. For example: "EMERGENCY CONTACT."

## **3.2 EMERGENCY PROCEDURES**

In the event of an accident, breakdown, or other emergency the driver must follow established company procedures for protecting the scene, obtaining assistance, notifying the company, and gathering information necessary for making reports. The procedures in the following sections should be followed when hazardous materials are involved.

### **3.2.1 EMERGENCY PROCEDURES ON THE HIGHWAY**

In the event of an on-the-road spill or other emergency, the driver will follow these procedures:

- Remain with the unit and warn all pedestrians and motorists to stay away from the spill area. Pointing out to them the danger involved, and have someone call the police or fire department.
- Upon arrival of the police or fire department, the driver will inform them of what kind of material has been spilled and request the area to be blocked off to both pedestrians and vehicles to prevent property damage or any serious personal injury.

- The driver will request the first responder, fire or police personnel, to protect the area while the driver reports to a facility emergency contact (listed in section 2.0)
- Do not let people congregate in the vicinity of the accident or fire unless they are authorized to engage in combating the fire or helping to handle the accident.
- Keep fires, flame and lighted cigarettes, cigars, and pipes away from the scene.
- Set up warning signals on the highway to prevent further accident. Emergency signals shall be used as required to DOT Safety Regulations
- Prevent leaking liquids from draining onto the highway or into sewers and streams by damming up the liquid or by digging a drainage trench.
- Know your load. Refer to shipping papers for name and hazardous materials classification of each commodity in your unit. Give information to firemen or police in case of emergency involving your unit.
- Show shipping papers to emergency response personnel so they can determine the nature of the commodities and plan firefighting techniques accordingly.
- Leaking tanks may be transported only the minimum safe distance necessary to reach a place where safe transfer of the hazardous material to another tank can be made.

### **3.2.2 VEHICLE BREAKDOWN**

Emergency signals shall be used as required by DOT. Special effort should be made to remove the vehicle to a place where the hazards of the load being transported may be protected against exposure.



### **3.2.3 EMERGENCIES IN TERMINALS**

- In case of fire, give priority to moving vehicles containing hazardous materials away from terminal.
- Check for all inbound units for signs of leakage before starting to handle cargo.
- If leakage is noted at any time, stop operations and determine the source of leak and nature of material. Look for HM labels on packaging and note type (if present). Check shipping papers for proper shipping name and hazard class of material.
- Personnel must avoid direct contact with leaking hazardous materials.
- If strong fumes are present, or if personnel become ill, remove affected personnel from scene, close up unit (if possible) and move it as far from all terminal buildings as possible.
- Avoid leaving the unit where leakage will adversely affect other nearby persons or property.
- Notify fire, police, ambulance, health, pollution, control, or other authorities as appropriate.
- Contact shipper and/or CHEMTREC to determine what measures can be taken, or what assistance is available, to alleviate the problem.

### **3.2.4 EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE, ACCIDENTS AND INCIDENTS**

If hazardous materials on a vehicle are found to be leaking, damaged, on fire, or have any appearance of being in an unsafe condition, the driver should notify a responsible individual (dispatcher, key person, or terminal manager) at the nearest terminal as quickly as possible under the circumstances. He or she must not leave his or her vehicle to make such notification unless there is no danger to the general public or unless the vehicle is under guard by a responsible individual. It may be necessary to have another person make such notification while the driver stays with the vehicle.

If a vehicle transporting hazardous materials is involved in an accident, the driver should ascertain if the hazardous materials have been damaged or if it appears that such materials may become involved for any other reason such as fire in the wreckage. After he or she has taken the necessary steps to protect the scene and the public, he or she should contact his or her emergency contact as outlined in rule No. 1 above. If hazardous materials at the terminal are found to be leaking or damaged, immediate notification should be made to the terminal manager, key person, or other company official on duty at the terminal.

### **3.2.5 IMMEDIATE NOTICE OF CERTAIN HAZARDOUS MATERIALS INCIDENTS (49 CFR 171.15)**

Whenever there is spillage, discharge, or leakage of hazardous materials, including hazardous wastes and hazardous substances in a vehicle or terminal, or there is direct involvement of hazardous materials arising out of a motor vehicle accident, special reports must be made in accordance with the procedures in this section.

A call to the DOT National Response Center (800) 424-8802 must be made as promptly as possible if an incident involves hazardous materials during transportation, loading, unloading, or storage and results in one or more of the following:

- Death of any person(s).
- Injury requiring hospitalization of any person(s).
- Estimated damage to carrier or other property exceeding \$50,000.
- An evacuation of the general public occurs lasting one or more hours.
- One or more major transportation arteries or facilities are closed or shut down for one hour or more.
- Fire, breakage, spillage, or suspected radioactive contamination involving a shipment of radioactive materials.
- Fire, breakage, spillage or suspected contamination involving a shipment of infectious substances (etiologic agents).

*Note: Incidents involving infectious substances (etiologic agents) may be reported by phone to the Center for Disease Control, (800)232-0124, instead of the Department of Transportation number.*

- If, in the judgment of the carrier, there exists a situation which should be reported even though it does not meet one of the specific criteria listed above.

### **3.2.6 EMERGENCY EQUIPMENT LIST**

- 100 oil dry pads (1/2 bag) 19" x 17"
- 100 Universal absorbent pads (Box Trucks)
- 1 bag (50 lbs.) oil absorbent
- 1 disposal bag
- 5 heavy duty contractor garbage bags
- Fire Extinguisher
- Emergency Reflective Triangles

### **3.2.8 DETAILED HAZARDOUS MATERIALS INCIDENT REPORTS (49 CFR 171.16)**

A written report must be made within 30 days of discovery of an incident arising out of the transportation, loading, unloading or storage of hazardous materials as follows:

- As a follow-up to any incident reported by phone (immediate Notice of Hazmat Incident) required by § 171.15.
- As the result of an unintentional release of hazardous materials from any packaging, including a tank.
- As the result of a release of any amount of hazardous waste.

Written incident reports are not required for the following hazardous material shipping names, unless an immediate phone notice is required (§171.15): 1) consumer commodity; 2) battery, electric storage, wet filled with acid or alkali; 3) paint and paint related material in containers of five gallons or less. The report in duplicate shall be submitted on the designated form DOT F-5800.1 to the following address:

Washington, D.C. 20590-0001

In filing a Hazardous Materials Incident Report, the carrier should endeavor to provide all of the information required to complete the report and to provide as much information as possible about the incident. These reports are analyzed by DOT to discover unsafe or inefficient packaging of hazardous materials, and to make such changes in the hazardous material regulations as experience indicates are necessary for safety.

For reports of hazardous waste discharges a copy of the hazardous waste manifest must be attached to the written report.

The filing of the reports mentioned above does not relieve a carrier from the responsibility to report spillage of hazardous materials, or spillage of other materials that may create a pollution problem to local, state, and federal agencies concerned with environmental controls as required in the area where such spillage occurs.

### **3.3 HAZARDOUS SUBSTANCE DISCHARGE NOTIFICATION (40 CFR 302.6)**

Any release of hazardous substances to navigable waters of the U.S. must be reported to the U.S. Coast Guard National Response Center at (800) 424-8802 or (in DC) (202) 267-2675. Reporting is required only for spills of hazardous substances that equal or exceed the designated reportable quantity; however, it is recommended that all spills be reported.

The driver or a company official must make the report as soon as that individual has knowledge of the discharge.

Releases of reportable quantities of an extremely hazardous substance that is listed in Title 40, Section 355.40, must immediately be reported to the local emergency planning committee or to the state emergency planning commission. As a last resort, dial 911 or call the operator.

#### 4.0 FOLLOW-UP PROCDEURES

The following procedures will be completed once the immediate emergency aspects of a spill have been taken care of:

- Trucks and Equipment exposed to a spill or leak will be decontaminated at the site in order to prevent any further release. The truck or equipment will be moved to an authorized facility capable of further decontamination. The equipment that has been contaminated will be thoroughly rinsed with a cleaning compound. The residue will be drained into a sealed container. This material will then be disposed of in accordance with Federal and State Regulations at an authorized disposal facility.
- Notification: Written notification will be sent to the US Department of Transportation, Director of Hazardous Materials Registration, Materials and Transportation Bureau, Washington, DC 20590.

## **4.1 TRAINING PROGRAM**
