**ACCIDENT** includes continuous or repeated exposure to conditions or which results in bodily injury, property damage, or environmental damage which the insured neither expected nor intended.

**MOTOR VEHICLE** means a land vehicle, machine, truck, tractor, trailer, or semitrailer propelled or drawn by mechanical power and used on a highway for transporting property, or any combination thereof.

**BODILY INJURY** means injury to the body, sickness, or disease to any person, including death resulting from any of these.

**PROPERTY DAMAGE** means damage to or loss of use of tangible property.

**ENVIRONMENTAL RESTORATION** means restitution for the loss, damage, or destruction of natural resources arising out of the accidental discharge, dispersal, release or escape into or upon the land, atmosphere, watercourse, or body of water, of any commodity transported by a motor carrier. This shall include the cost of removal and the cost of necessary measures taken to minimize or mitigate damage to human health, the natural environment, fish, shellfish, and wildlife.

**PUBLIC LIABILITY** means liability for bodily injury, property damage, and environmental restoration.

The insurance policy to which this endorsement is attached provides automobile liability insurance and is amended to assure compliance by the insured, within the limits stated herein, as a motor carrier of property, with Sections 29 and 30 of the Motor Carrier Act of 1980 and the rules and regulations of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration (FMCSA).

In consideration of the premium stated in the policy to which this endorsement is attached, the insurer (the company) agrees to pay, within the limits of liability described herein, any final judgment recovered against the insured for public liability resulting from negligence in the operation, maintenance or use of motor vehicles subject to the financial responsibility requirements of Sections 29 and 30 of the Motor Carrier Act of 1980 regardless of whether or not each motor vehicle is specifically described in the policy and whether or not such negligence occurs on any route or in any territory authorized to be served by the insured or elsewhere. Such insurance as is afforded, for public liability, does not apply to injury to or death of the insured's employees while engaged in the course of their employment, or property transported by the insured, designated as cargo. It is understood and agreed that no condition, provision, stipulation, or limitation contained in the policy, this endorsement, or any other endorsement thereon,

or violation thereof, shall relieve the company from liability or from the payment of any final judgment, within the limits of liability herein described, irrespective of the financial condition, insolvency or bankruptcy of the insured. However, all terms, conditions, and limitations in the policy to which the endorsement is attached shall remain in full force and effect as binding between the insured and the company. The insured agrees to reimburse the company for any payment made by the company on account of any accident, claim, or suit involving a breach of the terms of the policy, and for any payment that the company would not have been obligated to make under the provisions of the policy except for the agreement contained in this endorsement.

It is further understood and agreed that, upon failure of the company to pay any final judgment recovered against the insured as provided herein, the judgment creditor may maintain an action in any court of competent jurisdiction against the company to compel such payment.

The limits of the company's liability for the amounts prescribed in this endorsement apply separately to each accident and any payment under the policy because of anyone accident shall not operate to reduce the liability of the company for the payment of final judgments resulting from any other accident.

## SPILL CONTROL PLAN FOR SOLID WASTE HAULERS

- (1) Spill control and safety equipment carried in each vehicle:
  - 1). Reflectors and/or flares
  - 2). Fire extinguisher
  - 3). First aid kit

- (5) The designated coordinator will contact the state and municipal authorities where the accident occurred. If the accident or spill has the potential to cause environmental damage, (either due to the nature of the waste, location of the accident, or additional factors such as leaking oil, gasoline, or hydraulic fluid) the person contacted will notify the state emergency response team, by calling one of the following numbers:

**Delaware: 911, (302) 739-9401 or 1-800-662-8802** (Other numbers may be listed as follows, however, the listed Delaware numbers **must** be included in the spill control plan.)

- (6) The designated coordinator will contract for clean-up services with another company. (This is optional, however, if another company is to be contracted, please append a list of cleanup companies by either region or state.)
- (7) This plan will be carried in all vehicles, along with the permit.

Specific Actions to be taken at spill scene are:

- A. Containment - The critical problem is to prevent the escape of any spilled liquid or solid into the ground or into a storm or sanitary sewer. A barrier must be erected immediately to prevent escape of spilled materials/waste liquids, using whatever material is at hand, even a dirt curb to prevent spreading of the spill. Containment of solids will be dependent on wind and weather conditions. Use all spill kit material as needed. Simultaneously, the source of the spill or leak must be located and controlled (drum plugged or taped) or placed in an overpack.

The possibility of evacuation should be considered in the event of a major spill that could cause serious injury to human life or where a continuing exposure could be harmful to health. Major concerns involve ignitable wastes that may catch fire and possibly explode or generate toxic fumes. If fire threatens or actually occurs, personnel should be evacuated a distance of at least a half mile as recommended by the Emergency Response Guidebook. If no fire threatens, and no container(s) have ruptured, a distance of 50 to 100 feet should suffice.

If shipping description is known (refer to manifest) find the name in your Emergency Response Guidebook in the blue pages and turn to the corresponding guide number (orange top page - last 1/3 of book). If the shipping description is known check the placard on the vehicle for a "UN" or "NA" number, look up the number in the Yellow Pages and refer to the corresponding guide number, or contact the generator of the waste for safety data.

- B. With containment effected and the spillage source controlled, clean-up is the next step. If the spill is contained on an impervious paved surface, material should be absorbed onto a compatible material (e.g. sand diatomaceous earth). Any of a number of commercial absorbent inert materials may be used, but make sure they are compatible with the waste and will not cause a reaction. If the spillage has reached earth, all contaminated dirt should be collected into drums or bags for disposal at an EPA approved site.

If any spilled waste has reached the ground, the contaminated soil will be removed. The extent of contamination will be determined by sampling the spill area.

A qualified lab will analyze the sample. Sampling Techniques, chain-of custody requirements and analytical methods will follow approved procedures such as those outlined in SW-846. Any soil exhibiting contamination above the local background level will be removed to an appropriate permitted disposal site.

In addition to contaminated adsorbents, dirt or the like as noted above, damaged containers also present a disposal problem; special "recovery drums" will be used for containing damaged 55 gal. drums. Disposal will be at an approved site.

IV. Follow-up Procedures: Two steps remain once the immediate emergency aspects of a spill have been taken care of:

- A. Decontamination - A truck or trailer exposed to a spill or leak will be decontaminated at the site in order to prevent any further release to the extent that it can be transported (or move under its own power) to an authorized facility capable of further decontamination if necessary.
- B. Equipment will be decontaminated in the following manner: Each item used will be placed in an open head container and thoroughly rinsed with a compatible solvent or cleaning compound. The residue or wash water will then be drained into a tight head container, sealed, and disposed of in accordance with Federal and State Regulations at an authorized disposal site.
- C. Clothing - Contaminated clothing will be placed with the clean up residue and disposed of in accordance with Federal and State Regulations at an authorized disposal site. If clothing is reusable, then it will be decontaminated properly and the residue added to the other waste.
- D. Notification - The Department of Transportation, Director of Hazardous Materials Registration, Material and Transportation Bureau, Washington, DC 20590 will be notified, in writing, of the occurrence and nature of the incident and a copy will be submitted to the Alabama Department of Environmental Management, 1751 Cong W.L. Dickinson Drive, Montgomery, Alabama 36130.

## Employee Handbook & Rules

The following is a list of rules and regulations that are to be adhered to while employed at Blue Bridge Trucking, LLC. Any violations of these requirements may result in a dismissal or warning being issued against and employee at Blue Bridge Trucking by the management.

All federal DOT regulations instituted by the Federal Motor Safety Carrier Association will be observed by all employees required to have a commercial driver's license while in the employ of Blue Bridge Trucking, LLC.

This list of regulations permits Blue Bridge Trucking, LLC by signature of the employee on the signature page to request any and all information required for the employment and the retention of employee for the duration of employ with Blue Bridge Trucking, LLC and/or as a result of actions by the employee that require a pre-employment, random testing or post-employment background checks to obtain pertinent information regarding the employee.

Drinking of alcohol and/or being under the influence of any controlled substance while in the employment of Blue Bridge Trucking, LLC will not be tolerated. This shall be considered gross misconduct and the employee will be subjected to immediate dismissal. If the employee after being required to take a controlled alcohol and substance test is found to have a positive result the employee shall be offered the opportunity to enroll in an approved rehabilitation program for alcohol and substance abuse and upon being given clearance from the program and able to pass the required test to prove negative, shall be considered for re-employment at the discretion of Blue Bridge Trucking, LLC. All costs incurred for rehabilitation and retesting for a negative result shall be at the expense of the employee and not of Blue Bridge Trucking, LLC.

No alterations should be done to any equipment owned by Blue Bridge Trucking unless authorized by the management.

All paperwork should be turned in weekly by Saturday for the week ending. This includes bills of lading, manifests, receipts and all log books and vehicle safety inspection sheets. Paperwork can be submitted in the driver envelopes provided. Please note all fuel purchases and costs on the driver envelope in the event that something would happen to the original receipt.

Every employee is required to wear the proper hard hat, safety glasses, boots, safety vest, gloves and other safety equipment required in the performance of duties during his/her employment.

Should an employee be injured while conducting themselves in the employment of Blue Bridge Trucking, LLC they must immediately report that injury to management in order to alert Worker's compensation to the issue.

Should an employee be involved in a vehicular accident, regardless of fault, that accident must be called in and reported regardless of the time of day to management immediately. No driver shall leave the scene of any accident until released from the scene by Blue Bridge Trucking, LLC so as to ensure that all pertinent information is gathered from all parties involved along with pictures of the accident regardless of fault. The driver will be required to take any and all required tests for alcohol and substance use if management require the tests be done. Refusal of tests shall result in the driver's immediate dismissal of employment and will not be allowed to operate a commercial vehicle.

### Driver Responsibilities

1. Drivers should keep their trucks and trailers clean. Trucks and trailers should be washed on a regular basis. Truck wash can be done 2 times per month or any time the power wash is available at R&T shop on Schuylkill Ave.
2. Trailers should be swept clean of debris after unloading.
3. Drivers are responsible to either grease the tractor/trailer every 2 weeks or ensure that the maintenance is done.
4. Drivers are responsible to check and add all of the lubricants requiring addition to bring them to the proper level for safe operating levels. These lubricants should be carried in the tractor.
5. Fuel, lubricants and spare parts will be paid for with the company credit card. Any other purchases must be approved prior to using the card.
6. Drivers are required to see that the brakes on both tractor and trailer are properly adjusted. Any brake violations will be the responsibility of the driver to pay.
7. Drivers are to ensure that the loads are properly loaded and secure. Drivers should use gauges to determine best estimate for weight for the load. Do not knowingly transport an overweight load.

\*\*\*Drivers not observing the above rules will be disciplined by the following guidelines unless the Management deems that the violation of policy is severe and does not warrant review and decides to immediately terminate the employee. \*\*

First Offense: Verbal Warning notice  
Second Offense: Written Warning
