The permittee must:

INTRODUCTION

This Spill Prevention Control and Countermeasure (SPCC) Plan has been prepared by *WRS Environmental Services, Inc.* to satisfy federal, state and local standard regulatory requirements. This SPCC plan shall be modified to reflect site specific conditions and outline the project scope of work (including equipment, materials, and activities) and presents a comprehensive plan to prevent, respond to, and report spills or releases to the environment. The SPCC plan shall be updated as project work progresses or site activities change. An updated copy of this SPCC plan will be maintained at the project site.

SITE INFORMATION

This SPCC plan was developed for instructional and reference purpose to assist employees prevent, responding to and reporting spills as required by DOT, federal, state and local regulatory agencies. WRS Environmental Services, Inc. is a full service environmental company specializing in emergency spill response, control and countermeasures for various clients within the Tri-State area. Primary purpose of this plan is to assist, guide and educate all involved parties with the necessary tools to prevent, respond and handle an environmental spill.

General Site Information

WRS Environmental Services, Inc. (WRSES) manages a fleet of tankers and vacuum trucks to accept third-party waste as well as spill clean up. Vehicles are designated to handle various waste streams depending on the type and size of the spill. Each vehicle is equipped with an emergency spill control kit, inflatable berm and spill response instructions with emergency contact numbers. A number of advanced response mechanisms are available for controlling spills and minimizing their impacts on human health and the environment. The key to effectively combating spills is careful selection and proper use of the equipment and materials best suited to the type of oil/chemical and the conditions at the spill site.

Sensitive Areas/Receptors

Controlling spills from entering sensitive areas such as; floor drains, shorelines, wetlands, and from flammable chemicals.

Potential Spill Sources

Spill sources are generally divided into three (3) categories: radioactive, biological and chemical.

Radioactive Spills:

General guide for radioactive spills

- Restricting movement of all personnel is essential. Movement of people around a radiation spill can spread radiation beyond spill area
- Consider persons in area contaminated until monitoring proves otherwise
- · Dispose of cleanup materials as radioactive waste
- · Report all spills to supervisor

Simple spills

<10 uCi activity and <1-liter volume

- Alert people in the area
- Don protective equipment
- Place absorbent pad over liquid spills, damp absorbent pad over solid spills
- Clean with normal lab cleaning agents, working from spill outer edge inward
- Monitor area and personnel
- Repeat cleanup until no contamination is detected
- Notify Hazardous Material Operation Supervisor (HOS).

Major spills

>10 uCi activity or

>1-liter volume

- Evacuate area
- Have potentially contaminated people stay in one area until they have been monitored and shown to be free of contamination
- Prevent entrance into area
- Call HOS before proceeding with cleanup, after hours call Emergency Response Number.

Biological Spills:

General guide for biological spills

- Spills outside a biological safety cabinet (BSC) generate aerosols, creating a greater hazard than spills inside a BSC
- Keep cleanup materials inside BSC (removing hands from inside cabinet disperses aerosols outside cabinet)
- Leave BSC running during cleanup and at least 10 minutes after completion
- Wash hands/face before and after cleanup
- Don fresh pair of disposable gloves before starting cleanup

WRS ENVIRONMENTAL SERVICES, INC.

- A 1 to 10 biocide solution is commonly used as a disinfectant; allow 20 minutes contact time, work cautiously and thoroughly, repeat three (3) times and HEPA vacuum with each cleaning.
- Dispose of cleanup materials as biohazard waste, autoclave before removal from area
- Report all spills to HOS.

Spills inside a BSC

- use clean cloth and disinfectant solution to wash interior surfaces
- for moderate to high risk spills, flood catch basins

Spill outside BSC

The spilled organism's class determines cleanup method and level of containment (class 1=BL1).

BL1 containment required

- Decontaminate with disinfectant
- Clean up with disposable towels and disinfectant

BL2 containment required

- Alert people in spill area
- Evacuate for 30 minutes
- Notify HOS
- Wear gloves, lab coat, goggles, and shoe covers (if necessary) to:
 - Isolate spill area
 - Apply absorbent to prevent spreading
 - Pour disinfectant around spill edges
 - · Cover with disinfectant-soaked paper towels
 - Work from edges inward
 - Clean area again with disinfectant

BL3 containment required

- Hold your breath and evacuate immediately
- Close all doors
- Notify supervisor and HOS immediately
- HOS will direct cleanup. Respiratory protection required

Chemical Spills:

General guide for chemical spills

- Determine identity
- Consult MSDS
- Avoid breathing vapors, get as much fresh air into area as you can safely
- Absorbents and neutralizing agents must be compatible with chemical spilled
- Prevent spilled chemicals from going down drains (public water supply)
- Dispose of cleanup materials as chemical hazardous waste, small volumes of dilute acids and bases may be neutralized (pH 6-8) and discharge into sanitary sewer
- Call HOS for hazardous waste pickup, or guidance on cleanup or air monitoring

Simple spills--liquid

- Alert people in area
- Wear protective equipment
- Contain with appropriate absorbent
- Flammable--remove ignition sources (burners, motors, anything that could cause a spark), use plastic or nonmetallic cleanup equipment
- Absorb or neutralize with appropriate agent working from outside edges inward, sorbent do not remove toxic or flammable hazards, neutralization can produce heat causing boiling and splattering
 - Acid--sodium bicarbonate or acid spill kit
 - Base--sodium bisulfate, citric acid, or base spill kit
 - Formaldehyde--absorb or use polymerizer

Simple spills--dry

- If not water reactive, dampen to prevent airborne dust
- Control water reactive dust with sweeping compound

- · Carefully brush solids into a dust pan or container
- · Keep dust generation down to prevent creating inhalation hazard

Compressed gas leak--simple

- · Presents no inhalation hazard
- Restrict access
- Place in fume hood if possible, tighten fittings
- Locate leak with soapy water (at below freezing temperatures use 50% glycerin solution)
- If cylinder still leaks, contact supplier

Compressed gas leak--major

- · Large or uncontrollable leak or fire hazard
- Evacuate, ventilate affected area
- Call 911
- Contact supplier

Mercury

- Large or heated spills can be an inhalation hazard
- Isolate area to prevent tracking
- Wear gloves and shoe covers (if on floor)
- Consolidate and collect droplets using scraper, cardboard, wet paper towel, aspirator bulb, tape or special sponge from Biochemical Store
- · Place all waste in sealed container

Evacuate, call 911, and wait for responders

PROJECT SITE DESCRIPTION

This SPCC Plan applies to all jobsites and vehicles responding to spill clean up assignments.

STANDBY, ON-SITE MATERIAL AND EQUIPMENT

WRS Environmental Services, Inc. (WRSES) manages a fleet of tankers and vacuum trucks to accept third-party waste as well as spill clean up. Vehicles are designated to handle various waste streams depending on the type and size of the spill. Each vehicle is equipped with an emergency spill control kit, portable berm and spill response instructions with emergency contact number. A number of advanced response mechanisms are available for controlling spills and minimizing their impacts on human health and the environment. The key to effectively combating spills is careful selection and proper use of the equipment and materials best suited to the type of oil/chemical and the conditions at the spill site.

Spill Response Equipment Brought On-Site

Recommended Spill Control Material Inventory

Your jobsite work area and vehicle should have sufficient quantities of absorbents or other types of materials to control any spill that can be reasonably anticipated. Sawdust, lined 5-gallon pails and limited spill control materials shall be available in emergency spill response kits, including PPE. Additional materials may be order by contacting the HOS.

Personal Protective Equipment

- 2 pairs chemical splash goggles
- 2 pairs of gloves (recommend Silver Shield or 4H)
- 2 pairs of shoe covers
- · 2 plastic or Tyvek aprons and/or Tyvek suits

Absorption Materials

- 4 3M POWERSORB spill pillows (or equivalent)
- 1 3M POWERSORB spill sock
- 2 DOT pails (5 gallon) with polyethylene liners
 - o 1 filled with loose absorbent, such as sawdust or clay
 - 1 with minimum amount of loose absorbent in the bottom

Neutralizing Materials

- Acid Neutralizer
- Caustic Neutralizer
 - Commercial neutralizers, such as Neutrasorb (for acids) and Neutracit-2 (for bases) have built in color change to indicate complete neutralization
- Solvent Neutralizer
 - Commercial solvent neutralizers, such as Solusorb, act to reduce vapors and raise the flashpoint of the mixture

Mercury Spills

- Small mercury vacuum to pick up large drops (optional)
- Hg Absorb Sponges amalgamate mercury residue
- Hg Absorb Powder amalgamates mercury
- Hg Vapor Absorbent reduces concentration of vapor in hard to reach areas
- Mercury Indicator powder identifies presence of mercury

Clean-up Tools

- Polypropylene scoop or dust pan
- Broom or brush with polypropylene bristles
- 2 polypropylene bags
- Sealing tape
- PH test papers
- Waste stickers
- Floor sign DANGER Chemical Spill Keep Away

Pre-existing Site Conditions

Document all pre-existing site conditions prior to commencing any spill remediation control. Written and photogenic documentation shall be obtained to depicted actual condition.

SPILL PREVENTION AND CONTAINMENT

Mechanical containment or recovery is the primary line of defense against oil spills in the United States. Containment and recovery equipment includes a variety of booms, barriers, and skimmers, as well as natural and synthetic sorbent materials.

Spill Prevention and Containment Methods

Mechanical containment is used to capture and store the spilled material unit it can be disposed of properly. Chemical and biological methods can be used in conjunction with mechanical means for containing and cleaning up oil spills. Dispersants and gelling agents are most useful in helping to keep oil from reaching shorelines and other sensitive areas. Biological agents have the potential to assist recovery in sensitive areas as shorelines, marshes, wetlands, sewers, and floor drains.

SPILL RESPONSE

Response in the first ten to fifteen minutes is critical to minimize the impacts to human health and the environment and to minimize property damage and cleanup costs.

Spill Response and Clean-up Procedures

In the event of a chemical spill, the individual(s) who caused the spill is responsible for prompt and proper clean up. It is also their responsibility to have spill control and personal protective equipment appropriate for the chemicals being handled readily available. See Developing a Spill Response Plan for more information.

The following are general guidelines to be followed for a chemical spill. More detailed procedures may be available in your Departmental Chemical Hygiene Plan or Spill Response Plan.

- 1. Immediately alert area occupants and supervisor, and evacuate the area, if necessary.
- 2. If there is a fire or medical attention is needed, contact 911.
- Attend to any people who may be contaminated. Contaminated clothing must be removed immediately and the skin flushed with water for no less than fifteen minutes. Clothing must be laundered before reuse. See <u>First</u> <u>Aid for Chemical Exposures</u> for more information.
- 4. If a volatile, flammable material is spilled, immediately warn everyone, control sources of ignition and ventilate the area.
- 5. Don personal protective equipment, as appropriate to the hazards. Refer to the Material Safety Data Sheet or other references for information.
- 6. Consider the need for <u>respiratory protection</u>. The use of a respirator or self-contained breathing apparatus requires specialized training and medical surveillance. Never enter a contaminated atmosphere without protection or use a respirator without training. If respiratory protection is needed and no trained personnel are available, call HOS at 631-924-8111 If respiratory protection is used, be sure there is another person outside the spill area in communication, in case of an emergency. If no one is available, contact emergency services @ 911.
- 7. Using the chart below, determine the extent and type of spill. If the spill is large, if there has been a release to the environment or if there is no one

knowledgeable about spill clean-up available, contact HOS at 631-924-8111 or 911.

Category	Size	Response	Treatment Materials
Small	up to 300cc	Chemical treatment or absorption	Neutralization or absorption spill kit
Medium	300 cc - 5 liters	absorption	Absorption spill kit
Large	more than 5 liters	Call HOS	Outside help

- 8. Protect floor drains or other means for environmental release. Spill socks and absorbents may be placed around drains, as needed.
- 9. Contain and clean up the spill according to the table above. Loose spill control materials should be distributed over the entire spill area, working from the outside, circling to the inside. This reduces the chance of splash or spread of the spilled chemical. Bulk absorbents and many spill pillows do not work with hydrofluoric acid. POWERSORB (by 3M) products and their equivalent will handle hydrofluoric acid. Specialized hydrofluoric acid kits also are available. Many neutralizers for acids or bases have a color change indicator to show when neutralization is complete.
- 10. When spilled materials have been absorbed, use brush and scoop to place materials in an appropriate container. Polyethylene bags may be used for small spills. Five-gallon pails or 20-gallon drums with polyethylene liners may be appropriate for larger quantities.
- 11. Complete a hazardous waste sticker, identifying the material as Spill Debris involving XYZ Chemical, and affix onto the container. Spill control materials will probably need to be disposed of as hazardous waste. Contact HOS at 631-924-8111 for advice on storage and packaging for disposal.
- 12. Decontaminate the surface where the spill occurred using a mild detergent and water, when appropriate.
- 13. Report all spills to your HOS or the Principal Investigator.

Developing a Spill Response Plan

An effective spill response procedure should consider all of the items listed below. The complexity and detail of the plan will, of course depend upon the physical characteristics and volume of materials being handled, their potential toxicity, and the potential for releases to the environment.

- Review Material Safety Data Sheets (MSDSs) or other references for recommended spill cleanup methods and materials, and the need for personal protective equipment (e.g., respirator, gloves, protective clothing, etc.)
- Acquire sufficient quantities and types of appropriate spill control materials
 to contain any spills that can be reasonably anticipated. The need for
 equipment to disperse, collect and contain spill control materials (e.g.,
 brushes, scoops, sealable containers, etc.) should also be reviewed. See
 Recommended Spill Control Materials Inventory for more details.
- Acquire recommended personal protective equipment and training in its proper use. For example, if an air purifying respirator or self-contained breathing apparatus are needed, personnel must be enrolled in the Respiratory Protection Program and attend annual training and fit testing.
- Place spill control materials and protective equipment in a readily accessible location within or immediately adjacent to the work area or vehicle.
- 5. Develop a spill response plan that includes:
 - Names and telephone numbers of individuals to be contacted in the event of a spill.
 - Evacuation plans for the room or building, as appropriate.
 - Instructions for containing the spilled material, including potential releases to the environment (e.g., protect floor drains).
 - Inventory of spill control materials and personal protective equipment.
 - Means for proper disposal of cleanup materials (in most cases, as hazardous waste) including contaminated tools and clothing.
 - Decontamination of the area following the cleanup.
- 6. Discuss the spill response plans with all employees in the area. EHS offers training for employees who work directly with chemicals (see Chemical Spills and Waste Procedures) and who are expected to respond outside their work area to assist with spill cleanup (see Chemical Emergency Response (HAZWOPER) First Responder Operations Level Training).

WRS Environmental Services, Inc., personnel responsible for maintaining the SPCC plan is Patrick McLoughlin. He shall contact DOT project representatives and the federal, state and local regulatory agencies regarding spill response activities. He will work with the DOT project manager to ensure the proper information and data is collected and communicated to the appropriate agencies.

WRSES shall ensure that all personnel involved with preventing, responding and reporting spills are HAZWOPER trained.

Employees must contact the Generator whose name, address, phone number, and ID number can be found at the top of the hazardous waste manifest.

Notification is required for any amount of hazardous waste.

The National Response Center and Director of the Office of Hazardous Materials Regulation's, Materials Transportation Bureau, Department of Transportation, Washington D.C., must be notified of the following events:

- 1. A person is killed or requires hospitalization due to injuries;
- Carrier or property damage exceeds \$50,000;
- 3. Accident and/or spill involves radioactive materials or etiological agents;
- 4. Notification caused by continued danger to life.

PROGRAM MANAGEMENT

Site security measures, site inspection procedures, and personnel training related to spill prevention, containment, response, management, and clean up are outlined below.

Security

WRSES personnel are given identification badge that are to be worn as part of the uniform requirement. Identification badges shall have an updated photograph of the employee.

Site Inspections

WRSES Environmental Health and Safety (EH&S) Division conducts random site and vehicle inspection to ensure compliance with SPCC plan. Quarterly reviews are conducted to update employees with new changes and regulatory updates.

Personnel training

WRSES site supervisor is responsible for overseeing site HAZWOPER training of all personnel and shall review procedures with crew semi-annually or whenever a new crewmember is added. Supervisor shall submit all documentation of employee training to the Hazardous Material Operations Supervisor (HOS) to be added to their files.

DEFINITIONS AS USED IN THIS ENDORSEMENT

Accident includes continuous or repeated exposure to conditions or which results in bodily injury, property damage, or environmental damage which the insured neither expected nor intended.

Motor Vehicle means a land vehicle, machine, truck, tractor, trailer, or semitrailer propelled or drawn by mechanical power and used on a highway for transporting property, or any combination thereof.

Bodily Injury means injury to the body, sickness, or disease to any person, including death resulting from any of these.

Property Damage means damage to or loss of use of tangible property.

The insurance policy to which this endorsement is attached provides automobile liability insurance and is amended to assure compliance by the insured, within the limits stated herein, as a motor carrier of property, with Sections 29 and 30 of the Motor Carrier Act of 1980 and the rules and regulations of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration (FMCSA).

In consideration of the premium stated in the policy to which this endorsement is attached, the insurer (the company) agrees to pay, within the limits of liability described herein, any final judgment recovered against the insured for public liability resulting from negligence in the operation, maintenance or use of motor vehicles subject to financial responsibility requirements of Sections 29 and 30 of the Motor Carrier Act of 1980 regardless of whether or not each motor vehicle is specifically described in the policy and whether or not such negligence occurs on any route or in any territory authorized to be served by the insured or elsewhere. Such insurance as is afforded, for public liability, does not apply to injury to or death of the insured's employees while engaged in the course of their employment, or property transported by the insured, designated as cargo. It is understood and agreed that no condition, provision, stipulation, or limitation contained in the policy, this endorsement, or any other endorsement thereon, or violation thereof, shall relieve the

Environmental Restoration means restitution for the loss, damage, or destruction of natural resources arising out of the accidental discharge, dispersal, release or escape into or upon the land, atmosphere, watercourse, or body of water, of any commodity transported by a motor carrier. This shall include the cost of removal and the cost of necessary measures taken to minimize or mitigate damage to human health, the natural environment, fish, shellfish, and wildlife.

Public Liability means liability for bodily injury, property damage, and environmental restoration.

company from liability or from the payment of any final judgment, within the limits of liability herein described, irrespective of the financial condition, insolvency or bankruptcy of the insured. However, all terms, conditions and limitations in the policy to which the endorsement is attached shall remain in full force and effect as binding between the insured and the company.
