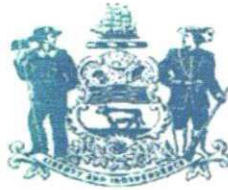



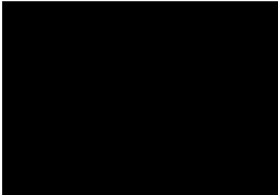

DEFINITIONS AS USED IN THIS ENDORSEMENT

Accident includes continuous or repeated exposure to conditions or which results in bodily injury, property damage, or environmental damage which the insured neither expected nor intended.

Motor Vehicle means a land vehicle, machine, truck, tractor, trailer, or semitrailer propelled or drawn by mechanical power and used on a highway for transporting property, or any combination thereof.

Bodily Injury means injury to the body, sickness, or disease to any person, including death resulting from any of these.

Property Damage means damage to or loss of use of tangible property.

Environmental Restoration means restitution for the loss, damage, or destruction of natural resources arising out of the accidental discharge, dispersal, release or escape into or upon the land, atmosphere, watercourse, or body of water, of any commodity transported by a motor carrier. This shall include the cost of removal and the cost of necessary measures taken to minimize or mitigate damage to human health, the natural environment, fish, shellfish, and wildlife.

Public Liability means liability for bodily injury, property damage, and environmental restoration.

The insurance policy to which this endorsement is attached provides automobile liability insurance and is amended to assure compliance by the insured, within the limits stated herein, as a motor carrier of property, with Sections 29 and 30 of the Motor Carrier Act of 1980 and the rules and regulations of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration (FMCSA).

In consideration of the premium stated in the policy to which this endorsement is attached, the insurer (the company) agrees to pay, within the limits of liability described herein, any final judgment recovered against the insured for public liability resulting from negligence in the operation, maintenance or use of motor vehicles subject to the financial responsibility requirements of Sections 29 and 30 of the Motor Carrier Act of 1980 regardless of whether or not each motor vehicle is specifically described in the policy and whether or not such negligence occurs on any route or in any territory authorized to be served by the insured or elsewhere. Such insurance as is afforded, for public liability, does not apply to injury to or death of the insured's employees while engaged in the course of their employment, or property transported by the insured, designated as cargo. It is understood and agreed that no condition, provision, stipulation, or limitation contained in the policy, this endorsement, or any other endorsement thereon,

or violation thereof, shall relieve the company from liability or from the payment of any final judgment, within the limits of liability herein described, irrespective of the financial condition, insolvency or bankruptcy of the insured. However, all terms, conditions, and limitations in the policy to which the endorsement is attached shall remain in full force and effect as binding between the insured and the company. The insured agrees to reimburse the company for any payment made by the company on account of any accident, claim, or suit involving a breach of the terms of the policy, and for any payment that the company would not have been obligated to make under the provisions of the policy except for the agreement contained in this endorsement.

It is further understood and agreed that, upon failure of the company to pay any final judgment recovered against the insured as provided herein, the judgment creditor may maintain an action in any court of competent jurisdiction against the company to compel such payment.

The limits of the company's liability for the amounts prescribed in this endorsement apply separately to each accident and any payment under the policy because of anyone accident shall not operate to reduce the liability of the company for the payment of final judgments resulting from any other accident.

TRANSPORTATION SPILL CONTROL PLAN

This Transportation Spill Control Plan includes reference to Drivers Training and information which drivers must study and understand.

INTRODUCTION

This Spill Plan is required by federal and state regulation. It is designed to complement existing laws, regulations, and rules pertaining to safety standards and pollution prevention rules.

This Spill Plan has been written by B & E Oil Svcs., Inc. and is designed to train drivers in handling incidents involving spills or leaks of both hazardous and non-hazardous materials. This Spill Plan is carried in each truck for use in an emergency.

All employees must operate equipment in a way that prevents any accident that could lead to a spill or leak. If a leak or spill should occur, they must be prepared to act and mitigate the extent of the emergency.

The employee must be knowledgeable as to what actions they must take in not only containing the leak but also proper notification procedures.

SPILL PREVENTION

- A. **Equipment:** It is each drivers responsibility to ensure that the vehicle they operate is properly equipped to handle any reasonably anticipated emergency.
1. **Pre-trip Inspection:** It is the responsibility of each driver to inspect the vehicle and report maintenance needs before operation.
 - a. Drivers vehicle inspection report will be completed daily.
 - (1) Pay special attention to all tank valves, hatches, hoses, gaskets for leaks, loose fittings, etc.
 - b. Do not operate a piece of defective equipment that could cause an accident or spill. Notify the office immediately of equipment deficiencies.
- B. **Loading of Materials:** It is the responsibility of each driver to observe all safety rules and wear all required personal protective equipment (PPE) during load and unloading operations.
1. Observe all safety rules.
 2. Use proper safety equipment, rubber gloves, safety glasses, hard hat, etc.
 3. After loading close all valves, lids and secure all hoses.
- C. **Transportation:**
1. Follow all federal, state and local laws regarding the safe operation of a motor vehicle. Each vehicle is equipped with an emergency response manual, a copy of the Federal Motor Carriers Safety Regulations and the DOT Emergency Response Guide Book. Each driver shall read and understand the contents of these references as part of drivers training.
 2. Do not drive any tank truck with lids unlatched.

SPILL SCENARIOS

- A. The wastes carried by B & E Oil Svcs., Inc. are petroleum based products from the Automotive and Tank Removal Industry. Used oil, oil/water mixtures, waste fuels and spent anti-freeze, etc.
1. These materials are transported in tank truck, and have the potential of being involved in an accident where either small amounts, or the entire container may be released. Some examples are:
 - a. 1-10 gals. during hose connections.
 - b. 1-25 gals. due to hose failure during loading.
 - c. 1-200 gals. due to tanker compartment overfill.
 - d. 1-3,800 gals. due to failure of tank or valves.
 2. Each driver shall be prepared to respond to a spill of magnitude identified above.
- B. In general, releases from collection truck will fall into three categories.
1. Small incidents involving 20 gallons or less.
 - a. These incidents will usually be able to be handled by the driver with the spill containment materials carried on each truck. (Oil dri, absorbent pads and absorbent socks.)
 2. The maximum probable release would occur during loading or unloading operations from a hose or pump breach or tank overfill. The volume of product release of this type of spill would be less than 200 gallons.
 - a. To prevent a spill of this kind, check all hoses and connections during the pre-trip inspection and BEFORE PUMPING. Stay alert during pumping for mechanical problems, and check the level of product in truck often during pumping.
 3. The worst case discharge would occur with tank integrity compromise. The volume of product discharge would be 3,800 gallons if fully loaded.
 - a. Each driver is to check the tank daily. Look for weeping product from any stress cracks. If stress cracks are detected, the truck is to be put OUT OF SERVICE until it is repaired.

SPILL CONTAINMENT AND EMERGENCY RESPONSE

- A. The size and location of a spill and the threat of any further discharge will determine the equipment and response needed to quickly and correctly respond to, contain and recover the pollutants. For example, a spill in excess of twenty-five gallons is an emergency and you need help. A smaller spill in the vicinity of a drain or surface water body could also constitute an emergency.
- B. B & E Svcs., Inc. has contracted with the clean-up firm of Eldredge Inc. (610) 436-4749 to quickly respond to any spill. They can be on scene with hours of receiving our telephone report of the spill. Do not hesitate of call the clean-up contractor if warranted!
- C. B & E Drivers Reference Checklist For Emergency Response
1. Remain calm and focus on the situation.
 2. If on road, pull off immediately.
 3. Apply parking brakes and turn off motor.
 4. Determine if you are injured or if others are injured.
 5. Locate source of spill if any and initiate immediate containment.

SPILL RESPONSE PROCEDURES

A. Reduce human exposure:

1. Secure the site:
 - a. If you are involved in an auto accident, take steps to insure no other vehicles or pedestrians accidentally become involved.
 - b. If just a spill, try to contain it by any available means:
 - (1) Build an earthen dam
 - (2) Divert the spill from waterways of storm drain, etc.
2. Arrange for emergency medical assistance as necessary.
3. Inform law enforcement officers, fire department, or other personnel responding to the spill of the product name and hazards of the product you are familiar with. Keep all unauthorized personnel at a safe distance from the spill until a Company Representative can be consulted. Contact Eldredge Inc. if additional assistance is needed. (610) 436-4749.
4. Notifications for minor spills and response procedures will include:
 - a. Call main office ~~610-593-5010~~ if during regular business hours (7AM - 5PM).
 - b. Call Emergency contact if after hours or weekends. B & E 24 hour (610) 842-9500.
 - c. Call 911 for Fire, Police or medical assistance.
 - d. If necessary, pump product back into truck even if tank has ruptured.
 - e. Stay with your vehicle until help arrives. Determine spill notification parties.

B. Reduce property damages and environmental pollution: attempt to personally contain the spill if it is possible to do it safely. Most spills can be contained with a shovel.

1. Act as an on-scene coordinator until relieved of this duty by:
 - a. Another authorized employee
 - b. EPA, Police or Fire Department representative.
 - c. On-scene clean up contractor or designated by B&E Oil Svcs., Inc.

With containment effected and the spill controlled, clean up is the next step. If the spill is contained on an impervious paved surface, the materials should be absorbed into a compatible material (e.g. sand, oil dry). If the spillage has reached earthen grade, all contaminated dirt should be collected into drums or bags for disposal at an EPA approved site. The extent of contamination will be determined by EPA and sampling the spill area.

SPILL NOTIFICATION PROCEDURE (MAJOR SPILLS & EMERGENCIES)

The driver will assess the magnitude of the spill and, when an emergency is warranted, representatives of B & E Svcs., Inc. or the driver directly, if possible, shall notify agencies identified on the Emergency Incident Call Sheet.
