TRUCK CLEAN OUT PROCEDURE:

TRUCK CLEAN OUT PROCEDURE:

The vacuum truck is cleaned out in the following manner.

The back hatch/door is opened and the tank is raised and pressure washed to remove any debris left after truck has emptied at the proper disposal facility. The debris is left to dry and then properly disposed of.

1. Vehicle Cleaning Procedures:

- a.) Each vacuum truck is equipped with a leak-proof tank, which is maintained in a clean and sanitary condition.
- b.) All pumps, hoses equipment and vehicle tanks are closely monitored to prevent leakages.
- c.) Twice a month, an independent company, pressure washes and cleans each of the trucks to remove any and all debris.
- d.) Trucks are visually inspected daily for any type of debris which may need to be removed.

VEHICLE CLEANING & RECORD KEEPING PROCEDURES

1. Vehicle Record Keeping Procedures:
 - a.) DAILY – Pre-Trip & Post Trip
Check overall truck operations per *Driver's Vehicle Inspection Report*
Complete daily inspection reports.
 - b.) Trucks are equipped with GPS and are monitored by an independent company.
 - c.) Monthly fuel and milage summary reports are submitted to State of Delaware per Delaware IRP and IFTA Requirements.
 - d.) Each month A.S.A.P. Pumping submits a Waste Transport Pumping report to Delaware which includes: Date of Service; Address of Septic Pumping; Number of Gallons Hauled and the Technicians License Number
2. Vehicle Cleaning Procedures:
 - a.) Each vacuum truck is equipped with a leak-proof tank, which is maintained in a clean and sanitary condition.
 - b.) All pumps, hoses equipment and vehicle tanks are closely monitored to prevent Leakages.

SPILL CONTROL

A. Spill Control & Prevention

Lewis Enterprises, Inc. will enact the following procedures in the unlikely event of a spill:

1. **HALT SOURCE:**

Immediately cease using any leaking or damaged unit, which is causing the spill. Properly repair the unit prior to resuming use of the unit.

2. **CONTAIN SPILL:**

In the event large quantities of liquid biosolids have been spilled, use straw bales where available to either form a barrier or soak up the biosolids.

3. **CLEAN UP:**

A variety of equipment can be used to remove spilled biosolids. This equipment depends on how much and what type of biosolids have been spilled. Vacuum equipment, biosolids applicator, front-end loaders, shovels, and brooms will be used to remove all material possible. Biosolids cleaned up from the spill site will be taken to the local sanitary landfill.

4. **FINAL CLEAN UP:**

Flush roadways with water under pressure as necessary to clean any remaining amounts of biosolids. Allow drying and incorporating on road shoulders if required. Minute amounts of biosolids, which have beed dripped or tracked on to roadways, can be removed by pressure washing. In the event a spill occurs on private property, final clean up should be completed immediately to the satisfaction of the owner.

5. **CLEAN UP MANAGEMENT:**

The Lewis Enterprises driver shall immediately take charge of initiating clean-up activities. Lewis Enterprises labor shall be used and additional labor will be secured as necessary.

6. **REPORTING:**

In the event of a spill, the driver shall immediately notify DNREC where the biosolids have originated. The driver will then notify Lewis Enterprises, Inc. office. A spill report will be completed which will include all relevant information regarding the spill, including how the spill

Occurred and what clean-up action was taken. Any spill will be reported within 2 hours by telephone DNREC and followed within 5 days by a complete written report if necessary.

7. SPILL PREVENTION:

The project manager shall take the following steps in preventing spills from occurring:

- a. Insure that the truck drivers watch the loading operations and clean off any biosolids deposited on the outside of the truck or trailer before they leave the loading area. Insure that the wash water is controlled and is returned to the head of the treatment plant.
- b. Insure that the tank hatches, valves and dust caps are closed and in place prior to and during transport of any biosolids.
- c. Inspect tank hatches and valves on transport vehicles arriving at the receiving location for any leakage and repair or replace problem before the truck unit is loaded again.
- d. Insure liquid biosolids unloading operations at the receiving location are conducted to minimize hose drainage.

TRUCK CLEAN OUT PROCEDURE:

The vacuum truck is cleaned out in the following manner.

The back hatch/door is opened and the tank is raised and pressure washed to remove any debris left after truck has emptied at the proper disposal facility. The debris is left to dry and then properly disposed of.

Any person, firm or corporation, municipal subdivision, or institution (hereafter known as "Permittee") that intends to dispose of Septage or Hauled Waste at the Princess Anne Wastewater Treatment Plant ("Princess Anne WWTP") shall complete a Septage/Hauled Waste Disposal Permit Application and obtain a Septage/Hauled Waste Disposal Permit. Permittees disposing of Hauled Waste, other than Septage, shall also complete a separate supplemental Hauled Waste Permit Application, in addition to the Septage/Hauled Waste Disposal Permit Application, for each type of waste for which disposal is requested.

A permit fee of \$100.00 and a deposit of \$300.00 per Permittee shall be paid when the application is filed. An annual renewal fee of \$50.00 per Permittee for the Septage/Hauled Waste Disposal Permit shall be required by July 1st of each year. Supplemental Hauled Waste Disposal Permit Applications may be submitted at any time and shall be \$25.00 for each initial application. Upon approval, Hauled Waste Disposal Permits shall be good for one Fiscal Year and may be renewed annually for \$10.00 for each waste by July 1st of each year. All checks shall be made payable to the Somerset County Sanitary District, Inc.

A Septage Disposal Unit activation code will be issued by Somerset County Sanitary District, Inc. for each Permittee after the Septage/Hauled Waste Disposal Permit is issued. A septage Manifest for each load disposed of shall be filled out completely and legibly by Permittee and deposited in the designated area at the Princess Anne WWTP at the time of disposal.

Charges for the disposal of septage into the Princess Anne Wastewater Treatment Plant shall be in accordance with the rates set during the fiscal year budget and will begin July 1st of each year.

Invoices will be sent out monthly to each Permittee. Such invoices shall be due and payable upon receipt. Payments not made by the 25th of each month will violate the Permit and the Permittee's disposal privileges will be suspended until payment is made in full. Once full payment and a reactivation fee of \$25.00 is received, the Permittee will be reactivated by the end of the next business day. A late payment charge shall be added to all delinquent accounts over 30 days at a rate of 1% per annum. Accounts not paid in full by 45 days will be subject to collection action. Accounts which have been suspended and placed into collection status may be later reinstated, but only upon payment of all outstanding amounts owed, approval of the Superintendent, and entry into an Advanced Payment Agreement.

No Permittee shall violate the Septage/Waste Haulers Regulations (attached) which include but are not limited to the prohibition of disposal of any grease, hazardous, toxic, poisonous or radioactive solids, liquids or gases into the Princess Anne WWTP. Violation of the Septage/Waste Haulers Regulations will void all disposal Permits held by that Permittee.

In the event that a Septage/Hauled Waste Disposal Permit becomes void, the Permittee's right to dispose of septage or hauled waste at the Princess Anne WWTP shall be terminated immediately.

The Permittee may request a reinstatement of a revoked permit. The request must be in writing and submitted to the Superintendent. The request must contain Permittee's corrective actions to avoid future violations.

Reinstatement of a suspended or revoked permit shall be in the sole discretion of the Superintendent, to be determined on a case by case basis.


