2024 Summer Interns



The first cohort of the DNREC Internship Program started in June 2024. Our goal was to hire 18 interns (two for each Division) and provide them with in-depth experiences in their field of interest. Interns were recruited for a twelve-week full time experience at \$17/hour. Positions varied from field study of horseshoe crabs. drainage public affairs. issues. and to administrative law, playing a role in finalizing a certification program for sediment and stormwater construction reviewers, and much more.

Through this initial recruitment, we have particularly built relationships with the University of Delaware as well as Delaware State University and continue to work to expand our participation in outreach to their students about potential opportunities in the department. As we move forward, we hope to expand into micro-internships and senior projects. These capstone new connections have also opened the door for additional prospects within the career centers of these schools. including job fairs, online recruitment and iob shadowing tools. opportunities for students.
