- ☐ Current fee schedule introduced in Senate Bill No. 249
 - □SPONSOR: Sen. Paradee & Rep. Heffernan
- Streamlined version of original proposal
 - ☐ Essential revisions only
 - Base and User fees remained the same
 - Rescinded Fee Credit Program
 - **□** Established Program Fee Category
- ☐ Passed the Senate June 23, 2020
- ☐ Passed the House June 25, 2020
- ☐ Signed by the Governor Aug 6, 2020

Background

- ☐ Fees must be reviewed periodically (3-years)
- 2024-2026 fees & legislation must be approved by the General Assembly NLT June 30th, 2023
 - ☐ Effective January 1,2024
- Committee established past revenue requirements based on DAQ's full time Employee (FTE) projections
- Committee sets cycle revenue target
 - □ Committee works with TV & SM sources to distribute fairly



TV Program Revenue Considerations

- Senate Bill 250, included pay increases for state employees which included 2% to 9% increases for all merit employees
- ☐ All non-salary categories CPI increase of 2.5%
- □ 30% of Actual Ombudsman Salary & OECs
 - □ Previous years the Small Ombudsman program at 100% of cost, was considered an additional support service, reduction to 30% was incorporated into overall program salary costs.

Natural Minor (Reg. 1102) Fee Increase Update





Natural Minor (Reg. 1102) Background

- Natural Minor (Reg. 1102) air permits are issued prior to construction of air pollution sources as required by 7 DE Admin. Code 1102. These permits explain to the owner/operator of the equipment how the equipment can be operated in compliance with state and federal regulations.
- These requirements include emission limitations, operational limits, monitoring, recordkeeping, and reporting.
- Prior to issuing a permit, the DAQ reviews applicable regulations and incorporates the requirements into a document to facilitate compliance. DAQ also performs air dispersion modeling to protect the surrounding communities.



Natural Minor (Reg. 1102) Purpose

- ☐ The Natural Minor (Reg. 1102) Permitting program is severely underfunded. Current program costs are approximately \$850,000 per year.
- □ Current Revenue is approximately \$130,000.
- □ As a result of stagnant fees, first established and unchanged since 1991, the program revenue from current fees is equivalent to approximately 15% of the estimated program costs.
- ☐ The program requires significant supplemental funds from federal grants and state general funds to cover the costs of the Natural Minor program.
- DAQ has recently proposed Natural Minor fee legislation in 2020, 2021, and 2022. Those efforts were unsuccessful. Past proposed bills all recommended increasing fees in a phased approach in an attempt at successful passage. However, given the lack of success and the consistent 85% revenue shortfall, the updated drafted proposal increases the fees to meet the program needs with one increase. The drafted proposal incorporates consolidation of existing fee categories, weighting the fees toward application (rather than annual fees) and establishment of complexity fees that reflect the amount of work needed to complete a permit.



Natural Minor (Reg. 1102) Purpose

- □A revised draft fee package has been submitted to the Office of the Secretary.
- ☐ The revised draft is similar in structure to what was in the legislation last year but the package has been updated to cover the total cost of the program.
- ☐ Fees for Registrations have been incorporated to the draft request.
- ■Some additional Complexity fees have been added including:
 - ■MNSR
 - □EOP/PSD
 - ■MACT/NESHAP/NSPS
 - □ Distributed Generators, 1144
 - ■Coastal Zone Applicability
 - ☐ Federally Enforceable
 - ☐ Proximity to residence or park
 - Request for Confidentiality
