I'm a lifelong Delawarean. I used to live on Rt. 301 just north of Armstrong Corner, so I'm used to some traffic noise. When the 301 bypass went through, I had to move, so I bought a home that backs onto Rt. 13 just north of Spring Meadow. When I first purchased and moved in in late 2009, there was a blinking red light and little traffic. The noise was comparable to my experience of living on Rt. 301 since 1989.

I had to leave Delaware in 2012 and spent nine years living in Kansas.
