Elevate Storage onto Shelving Units

Overview

- Elevating valuable possessions above the Base Flood Elevation line (BFE) will reduce the amount of water damage sustained during a flooding event.
- This strategy can be used within garages, in basements or on the ground floor depending on the location of the BFE and what types of flooding the property experiences.
- Removable elevation platforms can be made relatively easily, providing an option for residents that are renting or leasing the property.
- Storage elevation options:
 - Build your own shelving unit
 - Purchase metal or wooden shelving units
 - Hire a contractor to install permanent shelving
- The higher the stored items are located, the safer they will be from flooding.
- If using removable shelving units, the units may need to be bolted to the ground to minimize the risk of lateral forces moving or knocking over the shelving units during flood events.
- This strategy will not protect the actual building from flood damage.





Key Takeaways

During flood events, flood water entering the building can cause water damage to personal possessions in the basement, garage, or even on the ground floor.

Furniture and utility equipment may also float, which can cause more flood-related damage inside the structure.

In order to prevent water damage to valuable possessions, elevate stored possessions on platforms or shelves above the Base Flood Elevation line.

• Periodically check the shelving units or platforms for rot, cracks, or other damage.
