Secure Items in Yard

Overview

- During storm events, flood waters and high winds can pick up unsecured items in the yard and carry them away.
- Additionally, the items can become projectiles and can cause serious damage to the primary building or neighboring properties during flooding events.
- Secure all large loose items in the yard by anchoring them to the ground, deck, patio, etc. prior to any storm or flooding event.
- Large yard items include:

o Chairs

Small swimming pools

Tables

lables

Swing sets

FirepitsGrills


o Toys

o Trampolines

o Etc.

- Benches
- Move all small items inside prior to storm events.
- Small items include:
 - o Table umbrellas and chairs
 - Potted plants
 - o Toys
 - o Balls and sporting equipment
 - o Etc.
- This strategy will not prevent flooding on the property but will reduce flood damage associated costs.






Key Takeaways

During storm events, water may flood yards.

Flooding can damage items in the yard and/or carry unsecured items away from the property. Additionally, unsecured items in the yard could become projectiles during large flooding or wind events.

To help avoid flood damage costs, secure all loose items within the yard.

Rope	\$10-\$20	Repair damage to the siding of the primary structure	\$200-\$5,000
ESTIMATED TOTAL COST	\$25-\$50+	ESTIMATED TOTAL SAVINGS	\$200-\$5,000+

Expected Maintenance

- If items are not permanently secured to the ground, patio, or deck, temporarily secure the large items prior to any storm or flooding event.
- Check any fastenings annually for corrosion or damage.
