

Weatherization Assistance Program

Overview

- The Delaware Department of Natural Resources and Environmental Control (DNREC), Division of Climate, Coastal, and Energy offers a free Weatherization Assistance Program, which helps establish comfortable, energy-saving homes.
- The Weatherization Assistance Program helps homeowners and renters cut energy bills by weatherproofing and improving the energy efficiency of their homes.
- Although this program is not specifically intended to assist with flooding prevention, some of the weatherization improvements can also help to reduce flood risk.
- Eligibility for the program is determined by household size and income.
- Professionals from the Weatherization Assistance Program first assess the home, then the program provides energy-saving measures free of charge.
- The Weatherization Assistance Program cuts energy bills by 30 to 50 percent.
- Energy-saving measures implemented by the Weatherization Assistance Program can include measures such as (but not limited to) the following:
 - Air sealing, caulking, glazing, weather-stripping and crack patching
 - Replacement of broken glass
 - Attic, wall and floor insulation
 - Attic, wall and floor ventilation
 - Sealing heating and cooling ducts
 - Insulation for hot water heaters
 - Insulation for hot and cold water pipes
 - Moving appliances and utility equipment from the basement to the ground floor



Key Takeaways

During extreme cold, extreme heat, and flood events, the health, safety, and finances of Delawareans may be at risk. Having a weatherized home will help to reduce these risks.

- Perform a heating system maintenance check at least once per year. The Weatherization Assistance Program can cover one heating system maintenance check.
- Perform any recommended annual and/or seasonal maintenance on the structure.
