Mr. Goodwin:

There are no wind power projects proposed or planned for Delaware Bay. Two projects have been approved by the Maryland Public Service Commission in federal waters. US Wind has approval to build 248 megawatts (MW) off of Ocean City. Skipjack (owned by Deepwater Wind) has approval to build 120 MW off of Rehoboth. I have attached maps of the two sites. Both sites have capacity for more wind power development.
