

2020 Annual Report

We have just completed a very successful year for the Empowerment Grant. In 2020. The Empowerment Grant awarded nearly \$1 million to six organizations in the State of Delaware, providing energy efficiency programs and services to low-income communities. These funds were made possible by the merger between Exelon Power and Delmarva Power in Delaware. The Empowerment Grant will continue to award funds through this grant over the next two years.




Energy Burden In Delaware

Energy costs can be crippling for low-income Delaware households.
 Delaware households with incomes below 50% of Federal Poverty pay 38% of their income for energy bills. For those who are 50% -100% of Federal Poverty

its 21% of their income.







Energy Burden In Delaware

Home energy affordability isn't merely confined to very poor—moderate income Delaware households 150%-200% of poverty the energy burden is 9% of their annual income.










Align Energy Efficiency with Healthy and Safe Homes


