All Delaware DPH and CDC guidance will be followed (masks may be required based on guidance during May 2022).

Commitment

We ask that you commit to spending at least 3 days with the project to offset training, and to gain exposure to all aspects of the work we do. The season extends from May 1, 2022 to June 3, 2022.

Training will be provided virtually and new volunteers will be paired with a DNREC staff member or experienced volunteer.

We limit the number of new volunteers in proportion to experienced team members to ensure bird safety and provide effective training.
