General Rules and Regulations Governing Land and Waters Administered by the Delaware Division of Fish & Wildlife Effective July 1, 2025 – June 30, 2026

Persons may use state wildlife areas only as directed by the following rules, which have been established by Wildlife Regulations 3900 of the Division of Fish and Wildlife, pursuant to Section 103, 7 Delaware Code. Please refer to the area specific **Hunting** maps for additional access and allowable use information.

GENERAL

- A Conservation Access Pass is required for any registered motor vehicle used to access designated Delaware State Wildlife Areas for any allowable activities, including hunting, birdwatching, hiking and photography.
- 2. Entry permitted between ½ hour before sunrise and ½ hour after sunset unless lawfully hunting, fishing, or boating.
- All lands administered by the Division are Carry-In / Carry-Out.
- **4.** The following activities are prohibited on State Wildlife Areas:
 - Damaging or defacing buildings, equipment, structures, signs, or land features.
 - Littering or dumping trash including yard waste.
 - Operating radio-controlled devices, including drones, or the launching of model rockets.
 - Metal-detecting or use of metal detectors.
 - Allowing dogs to run off leash. See **#16** for dog training information.
 - Camping or lighting open fires of any type.
 - Swimming.
 - Posting signs, banners, or notices of any type
 - Vending or soliciting of any type.
 - Placing caches or letterboxes.
 - Cutting, injuring, or removing trees, shrubs, wildflowers, ferns, mosses, other plants, or firewood.
 - Collecting and/or removing any wildlife species unless lawfully hunting, trapping, or fishing.
 - Operating unlicensed vehicles or any other motorized vehicle (including motorized bicycles) off established roadways or driving in excess of 20 MPH on wildlife area roads.
 - Parking in a manner that blocks access to a road, trail, or boat ramp. Violators will be towed at owner's expense.
 - Leaving a vehicle or trailer unattended over 24 hours.
 - Deployment and/or use of trail cameras.
- **5.** Horses and bicycles (including electric bicycles) may only be ridden on roads or trails that have been designated by the Division on current area maps.

HUNTING/TRAPPING

- Hunting permitted in accordance with state laws, regulations, and rules as specified on current wildlife area maps.
- 7. Placement of any temporary deer stand or blind that involves placing nails or screws into trees is prohibited. Stands and blinds are prohibited within all refuges and safety zones. See respective area maps for when and where temporary stands and blinds may be used.
- **8.** All hunters that install temporary deer stands or blinds on State Wildlife Areas are required to obtain a free registration number by visiting the Division's website at https://de.gov/fw or by calling

- the Wildlife Section at (302) 739-9912. <u>This</u> registration number must be legibly displayed on all stands and blinds.
- **9.** No more than six (6) hunters may participate in driving deer at any one time.
- **10.** Hunting is prohibited on all Division dikes and walking on dikes is prohibited during all waterfowl seasons
- **11.** Entering tidal and/or impounded waters managed by the Division is prohibited during the waterfowl season unless lawfully hunting or trapping.
- **12.** Persons who possess, consume, or are under the influence of drugs or alcoholic beverages are prohibited from hunting or possessing firearms.
- **13.** Firearms are allowed except for designated prohibited areas; the Division may authorize firearm possession in designated prohibited areas.
- **14.** The discharge of any firearm including paintball guns, air rifles, bows, and crossbows is prohibited unless lawfully hunting. Target shooting is prohibited at any time.
- **15.** Trapping is prohibited except by valid permit holders.

DOG TRAINING

- **16.** Dog training is prohibited except:
 - Within established dog training areas;
 - During the open hunting season for the game that the dog is being trained to hunting; and,
 - In accordance with rules established on current area maps.

FISHING/CRABBING

- 17. Licensed fishing in any Division-managed wildlife area pond is prohibited from September 1 through January 31 and during the spring turkey season except as permitted according to area-specific rules established on current area maps.
- **18.** Crabbing or fishing on or from any dike or water control structure or within any impoundment is prohibited at all times.








Persons may use state wildlife areas only as directed by the following rules, which have been established by Wildlife Regulations 3900 of the Division of Fish and Wildlife, pursuant to Section 103, 7 Delaware Code. GENERAL

- A Conservation Access Pass is required for any registered motor vehicle used to access designated Delaware State Wildlife Areas for any allowable activities, including hunting, birdwatching, hiking and photography.
- 2. Entry permitted between ½ hour before sunrise and ½ hour after sunset unless lawfully hunting, fishing, or boating.
- **3.** All lands administered by the Division are Carry-In / Carry-Out.
- **4.** The following activities are prohibited on State Wildlife Areas:
 - Damaging or defacing buildings, equipment, structures, signs, or land features.
 - Littering or dumping trash including yard waste.
 - Operating radio-controlled devices, including drones, or the launching of model rockets.
 - Metal-detecting or use of metal detectors.
 - Allowing dogs to run off leash. See **#16** for dog training information.

 - Swimming.
 - Posting signs, banners, or notices of any type

- 5. Horses and bicycles (including electric bicycles) may only be ridden on roads or trails that have been designated by the Division on current area maps.

HUNTING/TRAPPING

- **6.** Hunting permitted in accordance with state laws, regulations, and rules as specified on current wildlife area maps.
- 7. Placement of any temporary deer stand or blind that involves placing nails or screws into trees is prohibited. Stands and blinds are prohibited within all refuges and safety zones. See respective area maps for when and where temporary stands and blinds may be used.
- **8.** All hunters that install temporary deer stands or blinds on State Wildlife Areas are required to obtain a free registration number by visiting the Division's website at https://de.gov/fw or by calling

- the Wildlife Section at (302) 739-9912. <u>This</u> registration number must be legibly displayed on all stands and blinds.
- **9.** No more than six (6) hunters may participate in driving deer at any one time.
- **10.** Hunting is prohibited on all Division dikes and walking on dikes is prohibited during all waterfowl seasons.
- **11.** Entering tidal and/or impounded waters managed by the Division is prohibited during the waterfowl season unless lawfully hunting or trapping.
- **12.** Persons who possess, consume, or are under the influence of drugs or alcoholic beverages are prohibited from hunting or possessing firearms.
- **13.** Firearms are allowed except for designated prohibited areas; the Division may authorize firearm possession in designated prohibited areas.
- **14.** The discharge of any firearm including paintball guns, air rifles, bows, and crossbows is prohibited unless lawfully hunting. Target shooting is prohibited at any time.
- **15.** Trapping is prohibited except by valid permit holders.

DOG TRAINING

- **16.** Dog training is prohibited except:
 - Within established dog training areas;
 - During the open hunting season for the game that the dog is being trained to hunting; and,
 - In accordance with rules established on current area maps.

FISHING/CRABBING

- 17. Licensed fishing in any Division-managed wildlife area pond is prohibited from September 1 through January 31 and during the spring turkey season except as permitted according to area-specific rules established on current area maps.
- **18.** Crabbing or fishing on or from any dike or water control structure or within any impoundment is prohibited at all times.



DEER, FURBEARERS & SMALL GAME HUNTING C&D CANAL CONSERVATION AREA

Effective July 1, 2025 - June 30, 2026

Persons may use state wildlife areas only as directed by the following rules, which have been established by Wildlife Regulations 3900 of the Division of Fish and Wildlife, pursuant to Section 103, 7 Delaware Code. For more information go to https://de.gov/fw or call (302) 739-9912. Please refer to the **General Overview** map for additional access and allowable use information.

A Conservation Access Pass (CAP) is not required for the C&D Canal Conservation Area.

GENERAL

- 1. Violators of wildlife area regulations may be subject to fines and/or revocation of hunting privileges on state wildlife areas for up to one year.
- **2.** Persons who possess, consume, or are under the influence of drugs or alcoholic beverages are prohibited from hunting or possessing firearms on Division Lands.
- **3.** Failure to accurately complete and return harvest data cards may result in loss of hunting privileges.
- **4.** Firearms may not be discharged outside of established hunting seasons. Target shooting is prohibited at any time
- 5. All hunters installing temporary deer stands and/or blinds to remain on-site overnight are required to obtain a free registration number at https://de.gov/fw or by calling (302) 739-9912. The registration number must be legibly displayed on all stands and/or blinds.

DEER HUNTING

Sunday deer hunting permitted. See Sunday Deer Hunting maps for open areas and hunting implement restrictions.

- **1.** Deer hunting permitted anywhere except within refuges and safety zones.
- 2. This area <u>IS OPEN</u> for the special October antlerless firearms season except for the Summit Retriever Training Area.
- 3. Deer hunters may use temporary portable stands. No permanent deer stands, platforms, ladders, or blinds may be constructed. No screw-in steps, tree spikes, screws, or nails are allowed. All parts of a temporary portable deer stand must be removed at the end of each day's hunt unless registered with the Division.
- 4. The Division is not responsible for theft or damage to any temporary stand and placement of a temporary stand does not give the stand owner any exclusive hunting rights to that area.
- **5.** Deer drives are permitted between the hours of 9:00 AM and 3:00 PM. No more than 6 hunters may participate in deer drives.
- 6. Handguns/pistol caliber rifles are not permitted to be used during any season and this area is NOT open during the January handgun season. Only shotguns and muzzleloaders with rifled barrels may be used for deer hunting.

UPLAND HUNTING

A. Small Game

- 1. Small game hunters must display at least 400 square inches of blaze orange while hunting on State Wildlife Areas.
- 2. Small game hunting permitted anywhere except within refuges, safety zones, Scotts Run and the Summit Retriever Training Areas and dogs are not permitted to enter refuges for any reason.
- Rabbit hunting closed the week before and the week of December antlerless deer season and during the January shotgun deer season.

4. Rabbit dogs may be trained only on the following Sundays: September 7, 14, 21, 28.

B. Furbearers

- 1. No trapping except by valid contract holders. Trapping rights awarded through competitive bids. Call (302) 739-9912 for bidding information.
- 2. Raccoon hunting permitted from Sept 1 March 31 during legal raccoon hunting seasons.
- 3. Red fox and coyote may be harvested in season while hunting other game species per these map regulations and hunted during the month of February according to applicable state laws.
- 4. No fox chasing permitted during any deer firearm season or prior to 1:00 PM during turkey season.

DOG TRAINING

SUMMIT RETRIEVER TRAINING AREA

- 1. This is a dedicated retriever training area between Route 896 and Guthrie Run restricted to the training of sporting dogs in the act of retrieving.
- 2. In a cooperative stewardship agreement, the Delaware Bay Retriever Club assists in the management of this area. Except during permitted field trial and organized training events, the club does not maintain exclusive use of the area and the area is open to the public engaged in the act of retriever training.
- 3. The Summit Retriever Training Area is closed to hunting except during archery and most firearm deer seasons. This area <u>IS NOT</u> open for the special October Antlerless firearm season.
- **4.** No dog training permitted during any firearm deer seasons, except on Sundays.
- 5. It is unlawful to enter the Summit Retriever Training Area for any purpose other than to train dogs in the act of retrieving or to hunt deer during the firearm or archery deer seasons.

THE BOWL SPORTING DOG AREA

- 1. The Bowl Sporting Dog Area is located immediately west of the Summit Retriever Training Area, along the north side of the canal between Guthrie Run and the Maryland State Line. The training of all sporting dogs is permitted within this area.
- Legal hunting and falconry are permitted within this area.

MIKE CASTLE RECREATION TRAIL

- Hunters using the Mike Castle trail and parking areas to access the conservation area must have firearms unloaded (including bolt removed from crossbow and cap/primer removed from muzzleloader) while on the trail or within any of the trail parking areas.
- 2. No person shall hunt or discharge any firearm while on or within 100 yards of the recreation trail or within any posted safety zone.
- 3. All dogs must be leashed, and owners shall be responsible for cleanup of all dog feces while on the recreation trail or within any of the trail parking areas
- 4. For more information, please consult the Mike Castle Trail map.



- 2. Persons who possess, consume, or are under the influence of drugs or alcoholic beverages are prohibited from hunting or possessing firearms on Division Lands.
- **3.** Failure to accurately complete and return harvest data cards may result in loss of hunting privileges.
- **4.** Firearms may not be discharged outside of established hunting seasons. Target shooting is prohibited at any time.

WATERFOWL HUNTING

- 1. Waterfowl hunting permitted anywhere except within refuges, safety zones, Scotts Run and the Summit Retriever Training Area.
- **2.** Layout blinds are permitted to be used in upland fields provided no excavation of ground occurs.
- **3.** Vehicles prohibited in upland fields or anywhere off established roadways.
- **4.** This area will be open during the Snow Goose Conservation Order. See official seasons and regulations. No permit or sign-in required during the conservation order.

DOVE HUNTING

- **1.** Only nontoxic shot may be possessed while hunting doves during the early season.
- 2. Dove hunting permitted anywhere except within refuges, safety zones, Scotts Run and the Summit Retriever Training Area.
- **3.** No permit is required.

TURKEY HUNTING

- 1. Turkey hunting by permit only. Permits awarded through preseason lottery. See Delaware Hunting and Trapping Guide for application.
- **2.** Turkey hunting prohibited within the Summit Retriever Training Area.

Harvesting or attempting to harvest Northern Bobwhite Quail is prohibited.

DOG TRAINING

SUMMIT RETRIEVER TRAINING AREA

- This is a dedicated retriever training area between Route 896 and Guthrie Run restricted to the training of sporting dogs in the act of retrieving.
- 2. In a cooperative stewardship agreement, the Delaware Bay Retriever Club assists in the management of this area. Except during permitted field trial and organized training events, the club does not maintain exclusive use of the area and the area is open to the public engaged in the act of retriever training.
- 3. The Summit Retriever Training Area is closed to hunting except during archery and most firearm deer seasons. This area <u>IS NOT</u> open for the special October Antlerless firearm season. Waterfowl hunting is not permitted.

- **2.** Legal hunting and falconry are permitted within this area.

MIKE CASTLE RECREATION TRAIL

- 1. Hunters using the Mike Castle trail and parking areas to access the conservation area must have firearms unloaded (including bolt removed from crossbow and cap/primer removed from muzzleloader) while on the trail or within any of the trail parking areas.
- 2. No person shall hunt or discharge any firearm while on or within 100 yards of the recreation trail or within any posted safety zone.
- All dogs must be leashed, and owners shall be responsible for cleanup of all dog feces while on the recreation trail or within any of the trail parking areas.





- **1.** Deer hunting permitted anywhere except within refuges and safety zones.
- 2. This area <u>IS OPEN</u> for the special October antlerless firearms season except for the Summit Retriever Training Area.
- 3. Deer hunters may use temporary portable stands. No permanent deer stands, platforms, ladders, or blinds may be constructed. No screw-in steps, tree spikes, screws, or nails are allowed. All parts of a temporary portable deer stand must be removed at the end of each day's hunt unless registered with the Division.
- 4. The Division is not responsible for theft or damage to any temporary stand and placement of a temporary stand does not give the stand owner any exclusive hunting rights to that area.







- 2. Dove hunting permitted anywhere except within refuges, safety zones, Scotts Run and the Summit Retriever Training Area.
- **3.** No permit is required.

TURKEY HUNTING

- 1. Turkey hunting by permit only. Permits awarded through preseason lottery. See Delaware Hunting and Trapping Guide for application.
- **2.** Turkey hunting prohibited within the Summit Retriever Training Area.

Harvesting or attempting to harvest Northern Bobwhite Quail is prohibited.





- 6. Handguns/pistol caliber rifles are not permitted to be used during any season and this area is NOT open during the January handgun season. Only shotguns and muzzleloaders with rifled barrels may be used for deer hunting.

UPLAND HUNTING

A. Small Game

- 1. Small game hunters must display at least 400 square inches of blaze orange while hunting on State Wildlife Areas.

General Rules and Regulations Governing Land and Waters Administered by the Delaware Division of Fish & Wildlife Effective July 1, 2025 – June 30, 2026

Persons may use state wildlife areas only as directed by the following rules, which have been established by Wildlife Regulations 3900 of the Division of Fish and Wildlife, pursuant to Section 103, 7 Delaware Code. Please refer to the area specific **Hunting** maps for additional access and allowable use information.

GENERAL

- A Conservation Access Pass is required for any registered motor vehicle used to access designated Delaware State Wildlife Areas for any allowable activities, including hunting, birdwatching, hiking and photography.
- 2. Entry permitted between ½ hour before sunrise and ½ hour after sunset unless lawfully hunting, fishing, or boating.
- **3.** All lands administered by the Division are Carry-In / Carry-Out.
- **4.** The following activities are prohibited on State Wildlife Areas:
 - Damaging or defacing buildings, equipment, structures, signs, or land features.
 - Littering or dumping trash including yard waste.
 - Operating radio-controlled devices, including drones, or the launching of model rockets.
 - Metal-detecting or use of metal detectors.
 - Allowing dogs to run off leash. See **#16** for dog training information.
 - Camping or lighting open fires of any type.
 - Swimming.
 - Posting signs, banners, or notices of any type
 - Vending or soliciting of any type.
 - Placing caches or letterboxes.
 - Cutting, injuring, or removing trees, shrubs, wildflowers, ferns, mosses, other plants, or firewood
 - Collecting and/or removing any wildlife species unless lawfully hunting, trapping, or fishing.
 - Operating unlicensed vehicles or any other motorized vehicle (including motorized bicycles) off established roadways or driving in excess of 20 MPH on wildlife area roads.
 - Parking in a manner that blocks access to a road, trail, or boat ramp. Violators will be towed at owner's expense.
 - Leaving a vehicle or trailer unattended over 24 hours.
 - Deployment and/or use of trail cameras.
- 5. Horses and bicycles (including electric bicycles) may only be ridden on roads or trails that have been designated by the Division on current area maps.

HUNTING/TRAPPING

- **6.** Hunting permitted in accordance with state laws, regulations, and rules as specified on current wildlife area maps.
- 7. Placement of any temporary deer stand or blind that involves placing nails or screws into trees is prohibited. Stands and blinds are prohibited within all refuges and safety zones. See respective area maps for when and where temporary stands and blinds may be used.
- **8.** All hunters that install temporary deer stands or blinds on State Wildlife Areas are required to obtain a free registration number by visiting the Division's website at https://de.gov/fw or by calling

- the Wildlife Section at (302) 739-9912. <u>This</u> registration number must be legibly displayed on all stands and blinds.
- **9.** No more than six (6) hunters may participate in driving deer at any one time.
- **10.** Hunting is prohibited on all Division dikes and walking on dikes is prohibited during all waterfowl seasons.
- **11.** Entering tidal and/or impounded waters managed by the Division is prohibited during the waterfowl season unless lawfully hunting or trapping.
- **12.** Persons who possess, consume, or are under the influence of drugs or alcoholic beverages are prohibited from hunting or possessing firearms.
- **13.** Firearms are allowed except for designated prohibited areas; the Division may authorize firearm possession in designated prohibited areas.
- **14.** The discharge of any firearm including paintball guns, air rifles, bows, and crossbows is prohibited unless lawfully hunting. Target shooting is prohibited at any time.
- **15.** Trapping is prohibited except by valid permit holders.

DOG TRAINING

- **16.** Dog training is prohibited except:
 - Within established dog training areas;
 - During the open hunting season for the game that the dog is being trained to hunting; and,
 - In accordance with rules established on current area maps.

FISHING/CRABBING

- 17. Licensed fishing in any Division-managed wildlife area pond is prohibited from September 1 through January 31 and during the spring turkey season except as permitted according to area-specific rules established on current area maps.
- **18.** Crabbing or fishing on or from any dike or water control structure or within any impoundment is prohibited at all times.

General Rules and Regulations Governing Land and Waters Administered by the Delaware Division of Fish & Wildlife Effective July 1, 2025 – June 30, 2026

Persons may use state wildlife areas only as directed by the following rules, which have been established by Wildlife Regulations 3900 of the Division of Fish and Wildlife, pursuant to Section 103, 7 Delaware Code. Please refer to the area specific **Hunting** maps for additional access and allowable use information.

GENERAL

- A Conservation Access Pass is required for any registered motor vehicle used to access designated Delaware State Wildlife Areas for any allowable activities, including hunting, birdwatching, hiking and photography.
- 2. Entry permitted between ½ hour before sunrise and ½ hour after sunset unless lawfully hunting, fishing, or boating.
- **3.** All lands administered by the Division are Carry-In / Carry-Out.
- **4.** The following activities are prohibited on State Wildlife Areas:
 - Damaging or defacing buildings, equipment, structures, signs, or land features.
 - Littering or dumping trash including yard waste.
 - Operating radio-controlled devices, including drones, or the launching of model rockets.
 - Metal-detecting or use of metal detectors.
 - Allowing dogs to run off leash. See **#16** for dog training information.
 - Camping or lighting open fires of any type.
 - Swimming.
 - Posting signs, banners, or notices of any type
 - Vending or soliciting of any type.
 - Placing caches or letterboxes.
 - Cutting, injuring, or removing trees, shrubs, wildflowers, ferns, mosses, other plants, or firewood
 - Collecting and/or removing any wildlife species unless lawfully hunting, trapping, or fishing.
 - Operating unlicensed vehicles or any other motorized vehicle (including motorized bicycles) off established roadways or driving in excess of 20 MPH on wildlife area roads.
 - Parking in a manner that blocks access to a road, trail, or boat ramp. Violators will be towed at owner's expense.
 - Leaving a vehicle or trailer unattended over 24 hours.
 - Deployment and/or use of trail cameras.
- 5. Horses and bicycles (including electric bicycles) may only be ridden on roads or trails that have been designated by the Division on current area maps.

HUNTING/TRAPPING

- **6.** Hunting permitted in accordance with state laws, regulations, and rules as specified on current wildlife area maps.
- 7. Placement of any temporary deer stand or blind that involves placing nails or screws into trees is prohibited. Stands and blinds are prohibited within all refuges and safety zones. See respective area maps for when and where temporary stands and blinds may be used.
- **8.** All hunters that install temporary deer stands or blinds on State Wildlife Areas are required to obtain a free registration number by visiting the Division's website at https://de.gov/fw or by calling

- the Wildlife Section at (302) 739-9912. <u>This</u> registration number must be legibly displayed on all stands and blinds.
- **9.** No more than six (6) hunters may participate in driving deer at any one time.
- **10.** Hunting is prohibited on all Division dikes and walking on dikes is prohibited during all waterfowl seasons.
- **11.** Entering tidal and/or impounded waters managed by the Division is prohibited during the waterfowl season unless lawfully hunting or trapping.
- **12.** Persons who possess, consume, or are under the influence of drugs or alcoholic beverages are prohibited from hunting or possessing firearms.
- **13.** Firearms are allowed except for designated prohibited areas; the Division may authorize firearm possession in designated prohibited areas.
- **14.** The discharge of any firearm including paintball guns, air rifles, bows, and crossbows is prohibited unless lawfully hunting. Target shooting is prohibited at any time.
- **15.** Trapping is prohibited except by valid permit holders.

DOG TRAINING

- **16.** Dog training is prohibited except:
 - Within established dog training areas;
 - During the open hunting season for the game that the dog is being trained to hunting; and,
 - In accordance with rules established on current area maps.

FISHING/CRABBING







- 17. Licensed fishing in any Division-managed wildlife area pond is prohibited from September 1 through January 31 and during the spring turkey season except as permitted according to area-specific rules established on current area maps.
- **18.** Crabbing or fishing on or from any dike or water control structure or within any impoundment is prohibited at all times.

General Rules and Regulations Governing Land and Waters Administered by the Delaware Division of Fish & Wildlife Effective July 1, 2025 – June 30, 2026

Persons may use state wildlife areas only as directed by the following rules, which have been established by Wildlife Regulations 3900 of the Division of Fish and Wildlife, pursuant to Section 103, 7 Delaware Code. Please refer to the area specific **Hunting** maps for additional access and allowable use information.

GENERAL

- A Conservation Access Pass is required for any registered motor vehicle used to access designated Delaware State Wildlife Areas for any allowable activities, including hunting, birdwatching, hiking and photography.
- 2. Entry permitted between ½ hour before sunrise and ½ hour after sunset unless lawfully hunting, fishing, or boating.
- **3.** All lands administered by the Division are Carry-In / Carry-Out.
- **4.** The following activities are prohibited on State Wildlife Areas:
 - Damaging or defacing buildings, equipment, structures, signs, or land features.
 - Littering or dumping trash including yard waste.
 - Operating radio-controlled devices, including drones, or the launching of model rockets.
 - Metal-detecting or use of metal detectors.
 - Allowing dogs to run off leash. See **#16** for dog training information.
 - Camping or lighting open fires of any type.
 - Swimming.
 - Posting signs, banners, or notices of any type
 - Vending or soliciting of any type.
 - Placing caches or letterboxes.
 - Cutting, injuring, or removing trees, shrubs, wildflowers, ferns, mosses, other plants, or firewood
 - Collecting and/or removing any wildlife species unless lawfully hunting, trapping, or fishing.
 - Operating unlicensed vehicles or any other motorized vehicle (including motorized bicycles) off established roadways or driving in excess of 20 MPH on wildlife area roads.
 - Parking in a manner that blocks access to a road, trail, or boat ramp. Violators will be towed at owner's expense.
 - Leaving a vehicle or trailer unattended over 24 hours.
 - Deployment and/or use of trail cameras.
- 5. Horses and bicycles (including electric bicycles) may only be ridden on roads or trails that have been designated by the Division on current area maps.

HUNTING/TRAPPING

- 2. Persons who possess, consume, or are under the influence of drugs or alcoholic beverages are prohibited from hunting or possessing firearms on Division Lands.
- Failure to accurately complete and return harvest data cards may result in loss of hunting privileges.
- **4.** Firearms may not be discharged outside of established hunting seasons. Target shooting is prohibited at any time.
- 5. All hunters installing temporary deer stands and/or blinds to remain on-site overnight are required to obtain a free registration number at https://de.gov/fw or by calling (302) 739-9912. The registration number must be legibly displayed on all stands and/or blinds.

DEER HUNTING

This area is managed as a Quality Buck Area. Harvesting bucks with outside antler spreads less than 15 inches is prohibited at any time, except youth under age 17 and non-ambulatory disabled hunters.

Sunday deer hunting permitted. See Sunday Deer Hunting maps for open areas and hunting implement restrictions.

A. Archery

- **1.** Archery hunting permitted anywhere except within refuges and safety zones.
- 2. Archery hunters must register through the lottery and hunt from lottery stands during all firearm deer seasons.
- **3.** Archery hunting is closed during special youth / non-ambulatory disabled deer hunts.
- 4. Archery hunters may use temporary portable stands. No permanent deer stands, platforms, ladders, or blinds may be constructed. No screw-in steps, tree spikes, screws, or nails are allowed. B. /Firearm - Muzzleloader, Shotgun, Handgun

- A Wildlife Area Deer Stand / Waterfowl Blind Lottery Permit is required to hunt during all deer firearms seasons unless hunting on the Lighthouse Island Tract.
- **2.** Stands issued by lottery at the Woodland Beach Check Station. Drawings held 2 hours before

- sunrise. A second lottery will be held at 12:00 PM. No permits issued after 1:00 PM.
- 3. This area **IS NOT OPEN** for the special October antlerless firearms season. Archery hunting is allowed during this season in accordance with state and area laws.
- **4.** Refuge stands (R1-R7) are open during the youth hunt and on Mondays and Fridays of all firearm seasons beginning on the first Monday of November shotgun season.
- The Lighthouse Island Tract is open for all deer firearm seasons on a first come first served basis, no permit required.
- **6.** Handgun hunting during the January handgun season will be allowed on Tuesday, Thursday, and Saturday only.
- 7. Deer drives are prohibited.
- 8. Only one firearm permitted per deer stand.
- 9. Disabled deer hunting locations (R3, M24) are available for non-ambulatory hunters. R3 is closed on all refuge hunt days. - **2.** Squirrel hunting permitted; no permit required.
- 3. Rabbit hunting by lottery only on Monday, Wednesday, and Friday. Lottery held at 8:00 AM at the Woodland Beach Check Station. Hunters must vacate the area by 3:30 PM. Maximum of 4 hunters per party per zone.
- **4.** Rabbit hunting closed the week before and the week of December antlerless deer season and during the January shotgun deer season.
- **5.** Hunting prohibited within posted refuges and safety zones and dogs are not permitted to enter refuges for any reason.
- **5.** Rabbit dogs may be trained only on the following Sundays: September 7, 14, 21, 28 October 5, 26

B. Furbearers

- No trapping except by valid contract holders.
 Trapping rights awarded through competitive bids.
 Call (302) 739-9912 for bidding information.
- 6. Raccoon hunting permitted from Sept 1 March 31 during legal raccoon hunting seasons.
- Red fox and coyote may be harvested in season while hunting other game species per these map regulations and hunted during the month of February according to applicable state laws.
- 8. No fox chasing permitted during any deer firearm season or prior to 1:00 PM during turkey season.



- 5. Blinds within Taylors Gut impoundment and designated goose blinds are open on opening days, Tuesdays, Thursdays, Saturdays, and Sundays during all regular waterfowl seasons.
- 6. Blinds E, J, and K are designated for disabled hunters and are awarded via lottery held at 11:00 AM the day prior to the hunt. If not reserved disabled locations are available through the daily lottery.
- **7.** Waterfowl hunting is prohibited on the Lighthouse Island and Cabin Tracts.
- **8.** No more than 3 persons per pit, blind, or blind site.
- **9.** No waterfowl hunting from upland fields, except from designated goose blinds and blind sites.
- **10.** Airboats are prohibited.
- **11.** Park in appropriate parking lots (see map). Do not park at the ramp or on the side of the road. Do not drive into fields.

- **12.** Hunters using marsh and river blinds must have a boat and required safety equipment.
- **13.** This area will be open during the Snow Goose Conservation Order. See official seasons and regulations. No permit or sign-in required during the conservation order.

DOVE HUNTING

- **1.** Only nontoxic shot may be possessed while hunting doves during the early season.
- **2.** Dove hunting permitted anywhere except within refuges and safety zones, no permit required.

TURKEY HUNTING

1. Turkey hunting by permit only. Permits awarded through preseason lottery. See Delaware Hunting and Trapping Guide for application.



Persons may use state wildlife areas only as directed by the following rules, which have been established by Wildlife Regulations 3900 of the Division of Fish and Wildlife, pursuant to Section 103, 7 Delaware Code. Please refer to the area specific **Hunting** maps for additional access and allowable use information.

GENERAL

- A Conservation Access Pass is required for any registered motor vehicle used to access designated Delaware State Wildlife Areas for any allowable activities, including hunting, birdwatching, hiking and photography.
- 2. Entry permitted between ½ hour before sunrise and ½ hour after sunset unless lawfully hunting, fishing, or boating.
- **3.** All lands administered by the Division are Carry-In / Carry-Out.
- **4.** The following activities are prohibited on State Wildlife Areas:
 - Damaging or defacing buildings, equipment, structures, signs, or land features.
 - Littering or dumping trash including yard waste.
 - Operating radio-controlled devices, including drones, or the launching of model rockets.
 - Metal-detecting or use of metal detectors.
 - Allowing dogs to run off leash. See **#16** for dog training information.
 - Camping or lighting open fires of any type.
 - Swimming.
 - Posting signs, banners, or notices of any type
 - Vending or soliciting of any type.
 - Placing caches or letterboxes.
 - Cutting, injuring, or removing trees, shrubs, wildflowers, ferns, mosses, other plants, or firewood
 - Collecting and/or removing any wildlife species unless lawfully hunting, trapping, or fishing.
 - Operating unlicensed vehicles or any other motorized vehicle (including motorized bicycles) off established roadways or driving in excess of 20 MPH on wildlife area roads.
 - Parking in a manner that blocks access to a road, trail, or boat ramp. Violators will be towed at owner's expense.
 - Leaving a vehicle or trailer unattended over 24 hours.
 - Deployment and/or use of trail cameras.
- 5. Horses and bicycles (including electric bicycles) may only be ridden on roads or trails that have been designated by the Division on current area maps.

HUNTING/TRAPPING

- **6.** Hunting permitted in accordance with state laws, regulations, and rules as specified on current wildlife area maps.
- 7. Placement of any temporary deer stand or blind that involves placing nails or screws into trees is prohibited. Stands and blinds are prohibited within all refuges and safety zones. See respective area maps for when and where temporary stands and blinds may be used.
- **8.** All hunters that install temporary deer stands or blinds on State Wildlife Areas are required to obtain a free registration number by visiting the Division's website at https://de.gov/fw or by calling

- the Wildlife Section at (302) 739-9912. <u>This</u> registration number must be legibly displayed on all stands and blinds.
- **9.** No more than six (6) hunters may participate in driving deer at any one time.
- **10.** Hunting is prohibited on all Division dikes and walking on dikes is prohibited during all waterfowl seasons.
- **11.** Entering tidal and/or impounded waters managed by the Division is prohibited during the waterfowl season unless lawfully hunting or trapping.
- **12.** Persons who possess, consume, or are under the influence of drugs or alcoholic beverages are prohibited from hunting or possessing firearms.
- **13.** Firearms are allowed except for designated prohibited areas; the Division may authorize firearm possession in designated prohibited areas.
- **14.** The discharge of any firearm including paintball guns, air rifles, bows, and crossbows is prohibited unless lawfully hunting. Target shooting is prohibited at any time.
- **15.** Trapping is prohibited except by valid permit holders.

DOG TRAINING

- **16.** Dog training is prohibited except:
 - Within established dog training areas;
 - During the open hunting season for the game that the dog is being trained to hunting; and,
 - In accordance with rules established on current area maps.

FISHING/CRABBING

- 17. Licensed fishing in any Division-managed wildlife area pond is prohibited from September 1 through January 31 and during the spring turkey season except as permitted according to area-specific rules established on current area maps.
- **18.** Crabbing or fishing on or from any dike or water control structure or within any impoundment is prohibited at all times.





All parts of a temporary portable deer stand must be removed at the end of each day's hunt unless registered with the Division.
- **4.** The Division is not responsible for theft or damage to any temporary stand and placement of a temporary stand does not give the stand owner any exclusive hunting rights to that area.
- **5.** Deer drives are permitted between the hours of 9:00 AM and 3:00 PM. No more than 6 hunters may participate in deer drives.
- **6.** Handgun hunting permitted during the January handgun season.

UPLAND HUNTING

FISHING

General Rules and Regulations Governing Land and Waters Administered by the Delaware Division of Fish & Wildlife Effective July 1, 2025 – June 30, 2026

Persons may use state wildlife areas only as directed by the following rules, which have been established by Wildlife Regulations 3900 of the Division of Fish and Wildlife, pursuant to Section 103, 7 Delaware Code. Please refer to the area specific **Hunting** maps for additional access and allowable use information.

GENERAL

- A Conservation Access Pass is required for any registered motor vehicle used to access designated Delaware State Wildlife Areas for any allowable activities, including hunting, birdwatching, hiking and photography.
- 2. Entry permitted between ½ hour before sunrise and ½ hour after sunset unless lawfully hunting, fishing, or boating.
- **3.** All lands administered by the Division are Carry-In / Carry-Out.
- **4.** The following activities are prohibited on State Wildlife Areas:
 - Damaging or defacing buildings, equipment, structures, signs, or land features.
 - Littering or dumping trash including yard waste.
 - Operating radio-controlled devices, including drones, or the launching of model rockets.
 - Metal-detecting or use of metal detectors.
 - Allowing dogs to run off leash. See **#16** for dog training information.
 - Camping or lighting open fires of any type.
 - Swimming.
 - Posting signs, banners, or notices of any type
 - Vending or soliciting of any type.
 - Placing caches or letterboxes.
 - Cutting, injuring, or removing trees, shrubs, wildflowers, ferns, mosses, other plants, or firewood
 - Collecting and/or removing any wildlife species unless lawfully hunting, trapping, or fishing.
 - Operating unlicensed vehicles or any other motorized vehicle (including motorized bicycles) off established roadways or driving in excess of 20 MPH on wildlife area roads.
 - Parking in a manner that blocks access to a road, trail, or boat ramp. Violators will be towed at owner's expense.
 - Leaving a vehicle or trailer unattended over 24 hours.
 - Deployment and/or use of trail cameras.
- 5. Horses and bicycles (including electric bicycles) may only be ridden on roads or trails that have been designated by the Division on current area maps.

HUNTING/TRAPPING

- **6.** Hunting permitted in accordance with state laws, regulations, and rules as specified on current wildlife area maps.
- 7. Placement of any temporary deer stand or blind that involves placing nails or screws into trees is prohibited. Stands and blinds are prohibited within all refuges and safety zones. See respective area maps for when and where temporary stands and blinds may be used.
- **8.** All hunters that install temporary deer stands or blinds on State Wildlife Areas are required to obtain a free registration number by visiting the Division's website at https://de.gov/fw or by calling

- the Wildlife Section at (302) 739-9912. <u>This</u> registration number must be legibly displayed on all stands and blinds.
- **9.** No more than six (6) hunters may participate in driving deer at any one time.
- **10.** Hunting is prohibited on all Division dikes and walking on dikes is prohibited during all waterfowl seasons.
- **11.** Entering tidal and/or impounded waters managed by the Division is prohibited during the waterfowl season unless lawfully hunting or trapping.
- **12.** Persons who possess, consume, or are under the influence of drugs or alcoholic beverages are prohibited from hunting or possessing firearms.
- **13.** Firearms are allowed except for designated prohibited areas; the Division may authorize firearm possession in designated prohibited areas.
- **14.** The discharge of any firearm including paintball guns, air rifles, bows, and crossbows is prohibited unless lawfully hunting. Target shooting is prohibited at any time.
- **15.** Trapping is prohibited except by valid permit holders.

DOG TRAINING

- **16.** Dog training is prohibited except:
 - Within established dog training areas;
 - During the open hunting season for the game that the dog is being trained to hunting; and,
 - In accordance with rules established on current area maps.

FISHING/CRABBING

- 17. Licensed fishing in any Division-managed wildlife area pond is prohibited from September 1 through January 31 and during the spring turkey season except as permitted according to area-specific rules established on current area maps.
- **18.** Crabbing or fishing on or from any dike or water control structure or within any impoundment is prohibited at all times.

General Rules and Regulations Governing Land and Waters Administered by the Delaware Division of Fish & Wildlife Effective July 1, 2025 – June 30, 2026

Persons may use state wildlife areas only as directed by the following rules, which have been established by Wildlife Regulations 3900 of the Division of Fish and Wildlife, pursuant to Section 103, 7 Delaware Code. Please refer to the area specific **Hunting** maps for additional access and allowable use information.

GENERAL

- A Conservation Access Pass is required for any registered motor vehicle used to access designated Delaware State Wildlife Areas for any allowable activities, including hunting, birdwatching, hiking and photography.
- 2. Entry permitted between ½ hour before sunrise and ½ hour after sunset unless lawfully hunting, fishing, or boating.
- **3.** All lands administered by the Division are Carry-In / Carry-Out.
- **4.** The following activities are prohibited on State Wildlife Areas:
 - Damaging or defacing buildings, equipment, structures, signs, or land features.
 - Littering or dumping trash including yard waste.
 - Operating radio-controlled devices, including drones, or the launching of model rockets.
 - Metal-detecting or use of metal detectors.
 - Allowing dogs to run off leash. See **#16** for dog training information.
 - Camping or lighting open fires of any type.
 - Swimming.
 - Posting signs, banners, or notices of any type
 - Vending or soliciting of any type.
 - Placing caches or letterboxes.
 - Cutting, injuring, or removing trees, shrubs, wildflowers, ferns, mosses, other plants, or firewood
 - Collecting and/or removing any wildlife species unless lawfully hunting, trapping, or fishing.
 - Operating unlicensed vehicles or any other motorized vehicle (including motorized bicycles) off established roadways or driving in excess of 20 MPH on wildlife area roads.
 - Parking in a manner that blocks access to a road, trail, or boat ramp. Violators will be towed at owner's expense.
 - Leaving a vehicle or trailer unattended over 24 hours.
 - Deployment and/or use of trail cameras.
- 5. Horses and bicycles (including electric bicycles) may only be ridden on roads or trails that have been designated by the Division on current area maps.

HUNTING/TRAPPING

- **6.** Hunting permitted in accordance with state laws, regulations, and rules as specified on current wildlife area maps.
- 7. Placement of any temporary deer stand or blind that involves placing nails or screws into trees is prohibited. Stands and blinds are prohibited within all refuges and safety zones. See respective area maps for when and where temporary stands and blinds may be used.
- **8.** All hunters that install temporary deer stands or blinds on State Wildlife Areas are required to obtain a free registration number by visiting the Division's website at https://de.gov/fw or by calling

- the Wildlife Section at (302) 739-9912. <u>This</u> registration number must be legibly displayed on all stands and blinds.
- **9.** No more than six (6) hunters may participate in driving deer at any one time.
- **10.** Hunting is prohibited on all Division dikes and walking on dikes is prohibited during all waterfowl seasons.
- **11.** Entering tidal and/or impounded waters managed by the Division is prohibited during the waterfowl season unless lawfully hunting or trapping.
- **12.** Persons who possess, consume, or are under the influence of drugs or alcoholic beverages are prohibited from hunting or possessing firearms.
- **13.** Firearms are allowed except for designated prohibited areas; the Division may authorize firearm possession in designated prohibited areas.
- **14.** The discharge of any firearm including paintball guns, air rifles, bows, and crossbows is prohibited unless lawfully hunting. Target shooting is prohibited at any time.
- **15.** Trapping is prohibited except by valid permit holders.

DOG TRAINING

- **16.** Dog training is prohibited except:
 - Within established dog training areas;
 - During the open hunting season for the game that the dog is being trained to hunting; and,
 - In accordance with rules established on current area maps.

FISHING/CRABBING

- 17. Licensed fishing in any Division-managed wildlife area pond is prohibited from September 1 through January 31 and during the spring turkey season except as permitted according to area-specific rules established on current area maps.
- **18.** Crabbing or fishing on or from any dike or water control structure or within any impoundment is prohibited at all times.
















Waterfowl Blind Site

Persons may use state wildlife areas only as directed by the following rules, which have been established by Wildlife Regulations 3900 of the Division of Fish and Wildlife, pursuant to Section 103, 7 Delaware Code. Please refer to the area specific **Hunting** maps for additional access and allowable use information.

GENERAL

- A Conservation Access Pass is required for any registered motor vehicle used to access designated Delaware State Wildlife Areas for any allowable activities, including hunting, birdwatching, hiking and photography.
- 2. Entry permitted between ½ hour before sunrise and ½ hour after sunset unless lawfully hunting, fishing, or boating.
- **3.** All lands administered by the Division are Carry-In / Carry-Out.
- **4.** The following activities are prohibited on State Wildlife Areas:
 - Damaging or defacing buildings, equipment, structures, signs, or land features.
 - Littering or dumping trash including yard waste.
 - Operating radio-controlled devices, including drones, or the launching of model rockets.
 - Metal-detecting or use of metal detectors.
 - Allowing dogs to run off leash. See **#16** for dog training information.
 - Camping or lighting open fires of any type.
 - Swimming.
 - Posting signs, banners, or notices of any type
 - Vending or soliciting of any type.
 - Placing caches or letterboxes.
 - Cutting, injuring, or removing trees, shrubs, wildflowers, ferns, mosses, other plants, or firewood
 - Collecting and/or removing any wildlife species unless lawfully hunting, trapping, or fishing.
 - Operating unlicensed vehicles or any other motorized vehicle (including motorized bicycles) off established roadways or driving in excess of 20 MPH on wildlife area roads.
 - Parking in a manner that blocks access to a road, trail, or boat ramp. Violators will be towed at owner's expense.
 - Leaving a vehicle or trailer unattended over 24 hours.
 - Deployment and/or use of trail cameras.
- 5. Horses and bicycles (including electric bicycles) may only be ridden on roads or trails that have been designated by the Division on current area maps.

HUNTING/TRAPPING

- **6.** Hunting permitted in accordance with state laws, regulations, and rules as specified on current wildlife area maps.
- 7. Placement of any temporary deer stand or blind that involves placing nails or screws into trees is prohibited. Stands and blinds are prohibited within all refuges and safety zones. See respective area maps for when and where temporary stands and blinds may be used.
- **8.** All hunters that install temporary deer stands or blinds on State Wildlife Areas are required to obtain a free registration number by visiting the Division's website at https://de.gov/fw or by calling

- the Wildlife Section at (302) 739-9912. <u>This</u> registration number must be legibly displayed on all stands and blinds.
- **9.** No more than six (6) hunters may participate in driving deer at any one time.
- **10.** Hunting is prohibited on all Division dikes and walking on dikes is prohibited during all waterfowl seasons.
- **11.** Entering tidal and/or impounded waters managed by the Division is prohibited during the waterfowl season unless lawfully hunting or trapping.
- **12.** Persons who possess, consume, or are under the influence of drugs or alcoholic beverages are prohibited from hunting or possessing firearms.
- **13.** Firearms are allowed except for designated prohibited areas; the Division may authorize firearm possession in designated prohibited areas.
- **14.** The discharge of any firearm including paintball guns, air rifles, bows, and crossbows is prohibited unless lawfully hunting. Target shooting is prohibited at any time.
- **15.** Trapping is prohibited except by valid permit holders.

DOG TRAINING

- **16.** Dog training is prohibited except:
 - Within established dog training areas;
 - During the open hunting season for the game that the dog is being trained to hunting; and,
 - In accordance with rules established on current area maps.

FISHING/CRABBING

- 17. Licensed fishing in any Division-managed wildlife area pond is prohibited from September 1 through January 31 and during the spring turkey season except as permitted according to area-specific rules established on current area maps.
- **18.** Crabbing or fishing on or from any dike or water control structure or within any impoundment is prohibited at all times.

General Rules and Regulations Governing Land and Waters Administered by the Delaware Division of Fish & Wildlife Effective July 1, 2025 – June 30, 2026

Persons may use state wildlife areas only as directed by the following rules, which have been established by Wildlife Regulations 3900 of the Division of Fish and Wildlife, pursuant to Section 103, 7 Delaware Code. Please refer to the area specific **Hunting** maps for additional access and allowable use information.

GENERAL

- A Conservation Access Pass is required for any registered motor vehicle used to access designated Delaware State Wildlife Areas for any allowable activities, including hunting, birdwatching, hiking and photography.
- 2. Entry permitted between ½ hour before sunrise and ½ hour after sunset unless lawfully hunting, fishing, or boating.
- **3.** All lands administered by the Division are Carry-In / Carry-Out.
- **4.** The following activities are prohibited on State Wildlife Areas:
 - Damaging or defacing buildings, equipment, structures, signs, or land features.
 - Littering or dumping trash including yard waste.
 - Operating radio-controlled devices, including drones, or the launching of model rockets.
 - Metal-detecting or use of metal detectors.
 - Allowing dogs to run off leash. See **#16** for dog training information.
 - Camping or lighting open fires of any type.
 - Swimming.
 - Posting signs, banners, or notices of any type
 - Vending or soliciting of any type.
 - Placing caches or letterboxes.
 - Cutting, injuring, or removing trees, shrubs, wildflowers, ferns, mosses, other plants, or firewood
 - Collecting and/or removing any wildlife species unless lawfully hunting, trapping, or fishing.
 - Operating unlicensed vehicles or any other motorized vehicle (including motorized bicycles) off established roadways or driving in excess of 20 MPH on wildlife area roads.
 - Parking in a manner that blocks access to a road, trail, or boat ramp. Violators will be towed at owner's expense.
 - Leaving a vehicle or trailer unattended over 24 hours.
 - Deployment and/or use of trail cameras.
- 5. Horses and bicycles (including electric bicycles) may only be ridden on roads or trails that have been designated by the Division on current area maps.

HUNTING/TRAPPING

- **6.** Hunting permitted in accordance with state laws, regulations, and rules as specified on current wildlife area maps.
- 7. Placement of any temporary deer stand or blind that involves placing nails or screws into trees is prohibited. Stands and blinds are prohibited within all refuges and safety zones. See respective area maps for when and where temporary stands and blinds may be used.
- **8.** All hunters that install temporary deer stands or blinds on State Wildlife Areas are required to obtain a free registration number by visiting the Division's website at https://de.gov/fw or by calling

- the Wildlife Section at (302) 739-9912. <u>This</u> registration number must be legibly displayed on all stands and blinds.
- **9.** No more than six (6) hunters may participate in driving deer at any one time.
- **10.** Hunting is prohibited on all Division dikes and walking on dikes is prohibited during all waterfowl seasons.
- **11.** Entering tidal and/or impounded waters managed by the Division is prohibited during the waterfowl season unless lawfully hunting or trapping.
- **12.** Persons who possess, consume, or are under the influence of drugs or alcoholic beverages are prohibited from hunting or possessing firearms.
- **13.** Firearms are allowed except for designated prohibited areas; the Division may authorize firearm possession in designated prohibited areas.
- **14.** The discharge of any firearm including paintball guns, air rifles, bows, and crossbows is prohibited unless lawfully hunting. Target shooting is prohibited at any time.
- **15.** Trapping is prohibited except by valid permit holders.

DOG TRAINING

- **16.** Dog training is prohibited except:
 - Within established dog training areas;
 - During the open hunting season for the game that the dog is being trained to hunting; and,
 - In accordance with rules established on current area maps.

FISHING/CRABBING

- 17. Licensed fishing in any Division-managed wildlife area pond is prohibited from September 1 through January 31 and during the spring turkey season except as permitted according to area-specific rules established on current area maps.
- **18.** Crabbing or fishing on or from any dike or water control structure or within any impoundment is prohibited at all times.



ROBERT L. GRAHAM - NANTICOKE WILDLIFE AREA REGULATIONS PERTAINING TO THE MULTIPLE USE TRAIL

This map shows the location of the Multiple Use Trails and roads open to horse riding on the Area. Horse-riding is permitted on all roads open to vehicular traffic on State Wildlife Areas. Designated trails are laid out to avoid: 1) habitats critical to the perpetuation of several known species of rare and endangered plants (e.g., box huckleberry, wild lupine) and animals (e.g., frosted elfin, Hessel's hairstreak, mud salamander, Delmarva Fox Squirrels), 2) dove hunting fields, 3) deer stands, and 4) wildlife food and cover plots.

It is hoped that these regulations will protect the natural resources and provide you with an enjoyable ride. The **Multi-Use Trail** allows <u>hikers, bicyclists</u>, and <u>horse-riders</u> to travel <u>together</u> along designated roads and trails, generally routed around the perimeter of the property and provides a loop between Phillips Landing and Old Sharptown Roads. Trail users should use caution when on the Main Road as it is also open to vehicular traffic.

- A. Use of the Multiple Use Trail is subject to the following restrictions:
 - The trail is closed to all non-hunting activities Monday-Saturday from September 1 February 28 and April 2 May 7. The trail is open for hiking, bicycling, and horseback riding on Sundays only during these time periods and open seven days a week during the remainder of the year.
 - 2. This area is closed to Sunday firearm deer hunting but is open for Sunday archery and crossbow deer hunting. While not a requirement, trail users are strongly encouraged to wear blaze orange on Sundays during open deer hunting seasons.

- 3. Riders will confine their travels to the immediate trail and roads open to vehicular traffic, without entering fields, woods, or road edges.
- 4. Bicyclists will yield the right of way to horse-riders; horse-riders and bicyclists will yield the right of way to pedestrians using the trail.
- 5. Riders will be responsible for keeping the trail clear of trash and fallen limbs, and debris.
- Horse trailers and vehicles will be parked in such a manner as to not obstruct other vehicular traffic along other roads and maintenance access points.

 - Leaving a vehicle or trailer unattended over 24 hours.
 - Deployment and/or use of trail cameras.
- 5. Horses and bicycles (including electric bicycles) may only be ridden on roads or trails that have been designated by the Division on current area maps.

HUNTING/TRAPPING

- **6.** Hunting permitted in accordance with state laws, regulations, and rules as specified on current wildlife area maps.
- 7. Placement of any temporary deer stand or blind that involves placing nails or screws into trees is prohibited. Stands and blinds are prohibited within all refuges and safety zones. See respective area maps for when and where temporary stands and blinds may be used.
- 8. All hunters that install temporary deer stands or blinds on State Wildlife Areas are required to obtain a free registration number by visiting the Division's website at https://de.gov/fw or by calling

- **9.** No more than six (6) hunters may participate in driving deer at any one time.
- **10.** Hunting is prohibited on all Division dikes and walking on dikes is prohibited during all waterfowl seasons.
- **11.** Entering tidal and/or impounded waters managed by the Division is prohibited during the waterfowl season unless lawfully hunting or trapping.
- **12.** Persons who possess, consume, or are under the influence of drugs or alcoholic beverages are prohibited from hunting or possessing firearms.
- **13.** Firearms are allowed except for designated prohibited areas; the Division may authorize firearm possession in designated prohibited areas.
- **14.** The discharge of any firearm including paintball guns, air rifles, bows, and crossbows is prohibited unless lawfully hunting. Target shooting is prohibited at any time.
- **15.** Trapping is prohibited except by valid permit holders.

DOG TRAINING

- **16.** Dog training is prohibited except:
 - Within established dog training areas;
 - During the open hunting season for the game that the dog is being trained to hunting; and,
 - In accordance with rules established on current area maps.

FISHING/CRABBING

- 17. Licensed fishing in any Division-managed wildlife area pond is prohibited from September 1 through January 31 and during the spring turkey season except as permitted according to area-specific rules established on current area maps.
- **18.** Crabbing or fishing on or from any dike or water control structure or within any impoundment is prohibited at all times.





UPLAND HUNTING

General Rules and Regulations Governing Land and Waters Administered by the Delaware Division of Fish & Wildlife Effective July 1, 2025 – June 30, 2026

Persons may use state wildlife areas only as directed by the following rules, which have been established by Wildlife Regulations 3900 of the Division of Fish and Wildlife, pursuant to Section 103, 7 Delaware Code. Please refer to the area specific **Hunting** maps for additional access and allowable use information.

GENERAL

- A Conservation Access Pass is required for any registered motor vehicle used to access designated Delaware State Wildlife Areas for any allowable activities, including hunting, birdwatching, hiking and photography.
- 2. Entry permitted between ½ hour before sunrise and ½ hour after sunset unless lawfully hunting, fishing, or boating.

 - Collecting and/or removing any wildlife species unless lawfully hunting, trapping, or fishing.
 - Operating unlicensed vehicles or any other motorized vehicle (including motorized bicycles) off established roadways or driving in excess of 20 MPH on wildlife area roads.
 - Parking in a manner that blocks access to a road, trail, or boat ramp. Violators will be towed at owner's expense.
 - Leaving a vehicle or trailer unattended over 24 hours.
 - Deployment and/or use of trail cameras.
- **5.** Horses and bicycles (including electric bicycles) may only be ridden on roads or trails that have been designated by the Division on current area maps.

HUNTING/TRAPPING

- Hunting permitted in accordance with state laws, regulations, and rules as specified on current wildlife area maps.

Welcome to one of the busiest Wildlife Areas in Delaware. Here on the **Assawoman Wildlife Area** the <u>needs of the animals and plants come first</u>, human outdoor recreation comes second.

Wildlife areas are managed for the needs of native plants and animals. Most management efforts relate to habitat protection and enhancement. Several rare plants grow in the wet woods. The ponds are managed for waterbirds, such as waterfowl, wading birds, and shorebirds. Ospreys and bald eagles live along the Little Assawoman Bay. These diverse groups of animals and their habitats have one thing in common – the need of critical habitat protection. That's called putting the "wild" back into "Wildlife Area".

An interpretive tour was developed to help explain management techniques on **Assawoman Wildlife Area.** Brochures are available at the starting point near the main entrance sign.

Please respect our efforts and abide by the rules. Enjoy your visit.

<u>Special Note:</u> The road may be closed <u>without notice</u> on days with precipitation in excess of one inch (1"). When the road is dry enough to prevent pothole formation, the road is opened as soon as possible. <u>During a temporary road closure you are free to</u> hike the roads. Thanks for your patience.

REGULATIONS (Please see Assawoman <u>General Overview</u> and <u>Hunting</u> maps for additional rules and regulations)

- 1. State regulations **prohibit the use of non-registered vehicles** on any wildlife area. All other vehicles must use only designated roads, not exceed 20 M.P.H., and not make excessive noise.
- 2. No person may trespass into areas closed by the Division.
- Area is closed from on-half hour after sunset to one-half our before sunrise unless legally hunting or fishing. You must leave promptly at sunset, and not wait until last light.
- 4. Firearms are allowed except for designated prohibited areas; the Division may authorize firearm possession in designated prohibited areas. Target shooting is prohibited. Call Ommelanden Shooting Range for year-round target shooting information at 302-323-5333.
- 5. **No dumping or littering**. State Wildlife Areas are **Designated Carry In-Carry out Trash Disposal Areas**. Please take your refuse home with you.
- 6. Horses may be used only on established roads open to vehicular traffic.
- 7. **No camping or swimming** without special authorization.
- 8. **Dogs must be properly licensed** and **must be leashed at all times** unless lawfully hunting. Please remove your dog's feces from the ground and dispose of it properly.
- 9. Pavilion use is first come, first served. No reservations are accepted.
- 10. All fish caught from Memorial Pond must be released to that pond immediately.



General Rules and Regulations Governing Land and Waters Administered by the Delaware Division of Fish & Wildlife Effective July 1, 2025 – June 30, 2026

Persons may use state wildlife areas only as directed by the following rules, which have been established by Wildlife Regulations 3900 of the Division of Fish and Wildlife, pursuant to Section 103, 7 Delaware Code. Please refer to the area specific **Hunting** maps for additional access and allowable use information.

GENERAL

- A Conservation Access Pass is required for any registered motor vehicle used to access designated Delaware State Wildlife Areas for any allowable activities, including hunting, birdwatching, hiking and photography.
- 2. Entry permitted between ½ hour before sunrise and ½ hour after sunset unless lawfully hunting, fishing, or boating.
- **3.** All lands administered by the Division are Carry-In / Carry-Out.
- **4.** The following activities are prohibited on State Wildlife Areas:
 - Damaging or defacing buildings, equipment, structures, signs, or land features.
 - Littering or dumping trash including yard waste.
 - Operating radio-controlled devices, including drones, or the launching of model rockets.
 - Metal-detecting or use of metal detectors.
 - Allowing dogs to run off leash. See **#16** for dog training information.
 - Camping or lighting open fires of any type.
 - Swimming.
 - Posting signs, banners, or notices of any type
 - Vending or soliciting of any type.
 - Placing caches or letterboxes.
 - Cutting, injuring, or removing trees, shrubs, wildflowers, ferns, mosses, other plants, or firewood
 - Collecting and/or removing any wildlife species unless lawfully hunting, trapping, or fishing.
 - Operating unlicensed vehicles or any other motorized vehicle (including motorized bicycles) off established roadways or driving in excess of 20 MPH on wildlife area roads.
 - Parking in a manner that blocks access to a road, trail, or boat ramp. Violators will be towed at owner's expense.
 - Leaving a vehicle or trailer unattended over 24 hours.
 - Deployment and/or use of trail cameras.
- 5. Horses and bicycles (including electric bicycles) may only be ridden on roads or trails that have been designated by the Division on current area maps.

HUNTING/TRAPPING

- **6.** Hunting permitted in accordance with state laws, regulations, and rules as specified on current wildlife area maps.
- 7. Placement of any temporary deer stand or blind that involves placing nails or screws into trees is prohibited. Stands and blinds are prohibited within all refuges and safety zones. See respective area maps for when and where temporary stands and blinds may be used.
- 8. All hunters that install temporary deer stands or blinds on State Wildlife Areas are required to obtain a free registration number by visiting the Division's website at https://de.gov/fw or by calling

- the Wildlife Section at (302) 739-9912. <u>This</u> registration number must be legibly displayed on all stands and blinds.
- **9.** No more than six (6) hunters may participate in driving deer at any one time.
- **10.** Hunting is prohibited on all Division dikes and walking on dikes is prohibited during all waterfowl seasons.
- **11.** Entering tidal and/or impounded waters managed by the Division is prohibited during the waterfowl season unless lawfully hunting or trapping.
- **12.** Persons who possess, consume, or are under the influence of drugs or alcoholic beverages are prohibited from hunting or possessing firearms.
- **13.** Firearms are allowed except for designated prohibited areas; the Division may authorize firearm possession in designated prohibited areas.
- **14.** The discharge of any firearm including paintball guns, air rifles, bows, and crossbows is prohibited unless lawfully hunting. Target shooting is prohibited at any time.
- **15.** Trapping is prohibited except by valid permit holders.

DOG TRAINING

- **16.** Dog training is prohibited except:
 - Within established dog training areas;
 - During the open hunting season for the game that the dog is being trained to hunting; and,
 - In accordance with rules established on current area maps.

FISHING/CRABBING

- 17. Licensed fishing in any Division-managed wildlife area pond is prohibited from September 1 through January 31 and during the spring turkey season except as permitted according to area-specific rules established on current area maps.
- **18.** Crabbing or fishing on or from any dike or water control structure or within any impoundment is prohibited at all times.





- 7. Placement of any temporary deer stand or blind that involves placing nails or screws into trees is prohibited. Stands and blinds are prohibited within all refuges and safety zones. See respective area maps for when and where temporary stands and blinds may be used.
- 8. All hunters that install temporary deer stands or blinds on State Wildlife Areas are required to obtain a free registration number by visiting the Division's website at https://de.gov/fw or by calling

- the Wildlife Section at (302) 739-9912. <u>This</u> registration number must be legibly displayed on all stands and blinds.
- **9.** No more than six (6) hunters may participate in driving deer at any one time.
- **10.** Hunting is prohibited on all Division dikes and walking on dikes is prohibited during all waterfowl seasons.
- **11.** Entering tidal and/or impounded waters managed by the Division is prohibited during the waterfowl season unless lawfully hunting or trapping.
- **12.** Persons who possess, consume, or are under the influence of drugs or alcoholic beverages are prohibited from hunting or possessing firearms.
- **13.** Firearms are allowed except for designated prohibited areas; the Division may authorize firearm possession in designated prohibited areas.
- **14.** The discharge of any firearm including paintball guns, air rifles, bows, and crossbows is prohibited unless lawfully hunting. Target shooting is prohibited at any time.
- **15.** Trapping is prohibited except by valid permit holders.

DOG TRAINING

- **16.** Dog training is prohibited except:
 - Within established dog training areas;
 - During the open hunting season for the game that the dog is being trained to hunting; and,
 - In accordance with rules established on current area maps.

FISHING/CRABBING

- 17. Licensed fishing in any Division-managed wildlife area pond is prohibited from September 1 through January 31 and during the spring turkey season except as permitted according to area-specific rules established on current area maps.
- **18.** Crabbing or fishing on or from any dike or water control structure or within any impoundment is prohibited at all times.





















DEER, FURBEARER, SMALL GAME, WATERFOWL, & GAMEBIRD HUNTING INDUSTRIAL FOREST LANDS

Barr & Laurel Complexes Effective July 1, 2025 – June 30, 2026

Persons may use state wildlife areas only as directed by the following rules, which have been established by Wildlife Regulations 3900 of the Division of Fish and Wildlife, pursuant to Section 103, 7 Delaware Code. A Conservation Access Pass (CAP) is required for any registered motor vehicle used to access designated public lands owned or managed by the Division of Fish & Wildlife. For more information go to https://de.gov/fw or call (302) 739-9912. Please refer to the **General Overview** map for additional access and allowable use information.

GENERAL

- Violators of wildlife area regulations may be subject to fines and/or revocation of hunting privileges on state wildlife areas for up to one year.
- 2. Persons who possess, consume, or are under the influence of drugs or alcoholic beverages are prohibited from hunting or possessing firearms on Division Lands.
- **3.** Failure to accurately complete and return harvest data cards may result in loss of hunting privileges.
- **4.** Firearms may not be discharged outside of established hunting seasons. Target shooting is prohibited at any time.
- 5. All hunters installing temporary deer stands and/or blinds to remain on-site overnight are required to obtain a free registration number at https://de.gov/fw or by calling (302) 739-9912. The registration number must be legibly displayed on all stands and/or blinds.

DEER HUNTING

Sunday deer hunting permitted. See Sunday Deer Hunting maps for open areas and hunting implement restrictions.

- **1.** Deer hunting permitted anywhere except within refuges and safety zones.
- **2.** This area **IS OPEN** for the special October antlerless firearms season.
- 3. Deer hunters may use temporary portable stands. No permanent deer stands, platforms, ladders, or blinds may be constructed. No screw-in steps, tree spikes, screws, or nails are allowed. All parts of a temporary portable deer stand must be removed at the end of each day's hunt unless registered with the Division.
- **4.** The Division is not responsible for theft or damage to any temporary stand and placement of a temporary stand does not give the stand owner any exclusive hunting rights to that area.
- **5.** Deer drives are permitted between the hours of 9:00 AM and 3:00 PM. No more than 6 hunters may participate in deer drives.
- **6.** Handguns are permitted during the November and January shotgun seasons and during the January handgun season.

UPLAND HUNTING

 Small game hunters must display at least 400 square inches of blaze orange while hunting on State Wildlife Areas.

- 2. Small game hunting permitted anywhere except within refuges and safety zones, and dogs are not permitted to enter refuges for any reason.
- 3. Rabbit hunting closed the week before and the week of December antlerless deer season and during the January shotgun deer season.
- **4.** Rabbit dogs may be trained only on the following Sundays: September 7, 14, 21, 28.

B. Furbearers

- 1. Public trapping is permitted with a valid permit issued by the Division. Limited permits available. For more information, visit https://dnrec.delaware.gov/fish-wildlife/hunting/furbearers/ or call (302) 739-9912.
- 2. Raccoon hunting permitted from Sept 1 March 31 during legal raccoon hunting seasons.
- Red fox and coyote may be harvested in season while hunting other game species per these map regulations and may be hunted during the month of February according to applicable state laws.
- **4.** No fox chasing permitted during any deer firearm season or prior to 1:00 PM during turkey season.

WATERFOWL HUNTING

1. Waterfowl hunting permitted anywhere except within refuges and safety zones.

DOVE HUNTING

- 1. Only nontoxic shot may be possessed while hunting doves during the early season.
- 2. Dove hunting permitted anywhere except within refuges and safety zones.

TURKEY HUNTING

1. Turkey hunting by permit only. Permits awarded through preseason lottery. See Delaware Hunting and Trapping Guide for application.

Harvesting or attempting to harvest Northern Bobwhite Quail is prohibited.
